And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of

the aforesaid Regulations And whereas by paragraph (1) of regulation 1 of the said Regula-tions it is provided that any person who trades with the enemy within the meaning of those Regulations shall be guilty of an offence

offence: And whereas by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that a person shall not be deemed to have traded with the enemy by reason only that he has done anything under authority given generally or specially by the Governor And whereas prior to the date on which the Company became an enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations, the Company through its Agent General carried on shipping, export and import business in Colombo, and did other business arising out of or m connection with such shipping, export and import business with persons resident in Ceylon.

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Agent General and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, do hereby authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company through its Agent General in Ceylon its Agent General in Ceylon.  (e) the taking out of Ceylon, by any visitor or person passing through Ceylon, of any commodity specified in items 1 to 8 (inclusive) of the Schedule to the principal Regulations, 1939, irrespective of the value thereof, if, but only if, such commodity was brought by him to Ceylon as part of his personal baggage and produced by him before, and passed by, a Customs officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Principal Collector of Customs.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

Regulations for the Mandur Festival BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the Customary pilgrimage to Mandur in the Porativu pattin of the Batticelog District in the Porativu pattu of the Batticaloa District

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS. 1 (1) These regulations shall be in force during the period commencing on the sixteenth day of August, 1941, and ending on the fifth day of September, 1941. (2) In these regulations—" camp area" means the area within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto, "Government Agent" means the Government Agent of the Eastern Province 2 No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by special or general order or by notice exhibited on the spot 3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent

at a place provided for that purpose by, of what the Government Agent 4 No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent. 5 (1) No person shall keep any cattle—(a) in the camp area, or (b) in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala, or at a place approved for such use by the Government Agent. the Government Agent.

(2) Every person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed daily from the camp area to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by hs cattle

6 Every person who exposes food for sale within the camp area shall keep such food—

(a) wrapped in, or covered with, clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food from contammation by flies or dust; or
(b) in closed glass cases, or
(c) in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

7 No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area, or aid or abet any such

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area, and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the milgrims shall denert

9. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area
10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.
11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house, or gala, or expose for sale rice cakes within the camp area, unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. Such licence shall be issued free of charge.

No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Govern ment Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building, so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area the camp area.

13 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area, or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area 14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent; and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.


