The by-laws published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 5,901 of January 23, 1903, are hereby amended as follows —

- (1) in Chapter XVII (as amended by the by-law published in *Gazette* No 7,968 of February 17, 1933), by the substitution, in paragraph (4) (a) of the by-law under the heading "I — Conditions of Issue of Licence", for the word "having", of the words "having a capacity of not less than two cubic feet and";
- (2) in Chapter XVIIA (as amended by the by-law published in *Gazette* No 8,463 of July 7, 1939), by the substitution, for by-law 9, of the following new by-law —
 "9 Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall maintain on the premises thereof a dustbin having a well-fitting lid and a capacity of not less than two cubic feet. Provided, however, that, in the case of every licence authorising the use of any premises for keeping an eating-house and a tea and coffee boutique, the holder of such licence shall maintain on those premises a dustbin having a well-fitting lid and a capacity of not less than three cubic feet", and
- (3) in Chapter XXI A (as amended by the by-law published in *Gazette* No 8,348 of February 4, 1938), by the substitution, in paragraph (3) (i) of by-law 2, for the words "sanitary dust bin and", of the words "dustbin having a well-fitting lid and a capacity of not less than three cubic feet, and with".

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 13 of the Currency Ordinance, No. 21 of 1941, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies by this Proclamation declare—

- (1) that the coins issued under the Ordinance shall be of the denominations, metals, standard weights, and fineness, specified in the Schedule hereto,
- (2) that the remedy or variation from the standard weight and from the standard fineness which shall be allowed in the making of coins issued under the Ordinance shall not exceed the respective amounts specified in the aforesaid Schedule, and
- (3) that such coins shall have for the obverse impression His Majesty's effigy with the inscription "George VI King and Emperor of India" and for the reverse impression the representation of a talipot palm (except in the case of the five-cent piece), and an inscription consisting of the word "Ceylon" and the date of the year of issue and words in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil indicating their respective values in cents or hundredths of a rupee

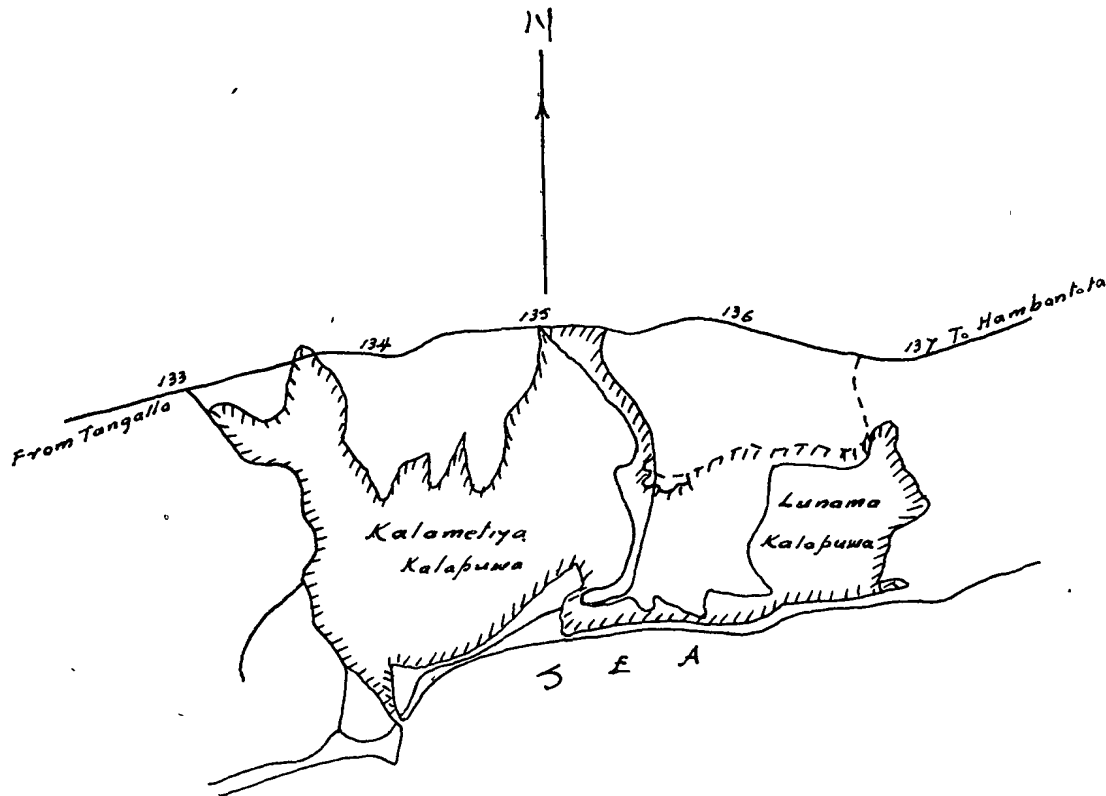

South by the southern peripheries of Lunama and Kalametiya Kalapuwas


West by the western periphery of Kalametiya Kalapuwa

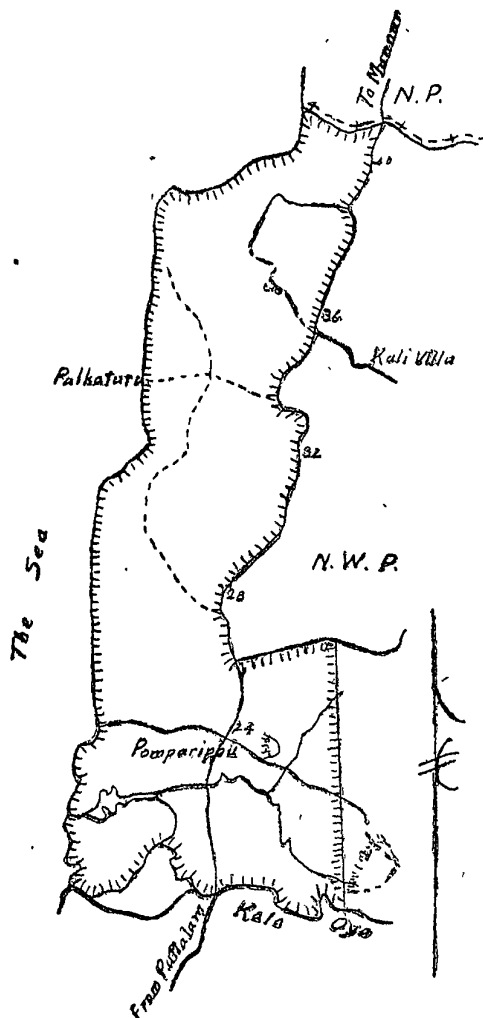

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940

Regulation

The Defence (Securities) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,596 of March 28, 1940, as last amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,799 of October 10, 1941, are hereby further amended as follows —

- (1) in regulation 1 (3), by the substitution, for the words "paragraph (1) of", of the words "the definition of "security" in";
- (2) in regulation 2A—
- (a) in paragraph (1), by the substitution, for the words "the Controller is satisfied", of the words "the Controller, or a person authorised by the Controller, is satisfied";
- (b) in paragraph (2)—
 - (i) by the substitution, for the words "scheduled territory", at the end of sub-paragraph (a), of the words "scheduled territory, or";
 - (ii) by the omission of all the words from "or", occurring at the end of sub-paragraph (b), to the end of the paragraph;
- (c) in paragraph (4)—
 - (i) by the substitution, for the words "those securities", of the word "securities";
 - (ii) by the substitution, for the words "on behalf of the Governor", of the words "on behalf of the Governor, or enter in any such register or book, in respect of any security, whether in connection with the issue or transfer of the security or otherwise, an address in any scheduled territory, except by way of substitution for another such address in the same currency area, or for the purpose of any transfer for which permission has been granted under this regulation

For the purposes of this paragraph, two places shall be deemed to be in the same currency area if and only if there is a currency which, at both places, is legal tender for any amount";
- (d) in paragraph (5), by the substitution, for all the words from the expression "security" to the end of that paragraph, of the following —

"the expression "security" —

 - (i) for the purposes of this regulation, does not include a Treasury bill or any bill issued by a local authority in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man;
 - (ii) for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this regulation, does not include any such policy or contract as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (d) of the definition of "security" in regulation 10 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations;
 - (iii) for the purposes of paragraph (2) of this regulation, includes a coupon representing dividends or interest.

For the purposes of this regulation, an interest in a security does not include an interest in expectancy on the determination of a life, or any interest merely as a trustee';

- (3) in regulation 2B, by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (1), of the following new paragraph —

"(1A) No person shall, except with permission granted by the Controller, so alter any bond, share warrant or other document of title relating to securities that the title to securities or any interest in securities becomes transferable by the delivery of the bond, share warrant or other document as so altered."

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

IT is hereby notified that information has been received by telegraph from the Secretary of State for the Colonies:—

- (a) that the ships specified in Schedule A hereunder have been included in the Statutory List of ships owned by persons or firms who are enemies or deemed to be enemies for the purpose of the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939, and
 (b) that the ship specified in Schedule B hereunder has been included in the list of ships which shippers and charterers would in their own interests find it advisable to avoid in connection with any business transaction whatsoever.

RECRUITMENT OF PROBATIONARY DIVISIONAL
REVENUE OFFICERS

APPLICATIONS are invited from applicants possessing the necessary qualifications, as set out in this notice, for appointment as Probationers in the scheme of Divisional Revenue Officers

Method of Application

2 (a) Application on forms to be obtained from the Office of the Director of Education must be forwarded by registered post addressed to the Director of Education, Branch E, Gallo Face Secretariat, P O Box No 500, Colombo, and must reach that office on or before January 10, 1942. No application received after that date will be considered. It is important that all necessary enclosures—*vide* (d) and (e) below—should be attached to and forwarded with the completed form of application.

(b) Stamps to the value of Rs. 15 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them.

(c) Two referees must be named in the form, who from their personal knowledge of the candidate can testify to his character and capacity.

(d) Originals of recent testimonials, not more than three in number, together with copies thereof, must be attached to the application form. The originals will be returned and the copies retained.

(e) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth together with a copy thereof must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

Number of Vacancies and Conditions of Appointment

3 Five Probationers will be selected for the Maritime area, eight for the Kandyan area, and five for the Tamil speaking area. Each Probationer will be attached to a Kacheheri and will rank as a Junior Staff Officer. He will undergo a period of training in Kacheheri as well as in district work in the course of which he will be expected to qualify himself for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer on the occurrence of a vacancy in a Chief Headman's Post. He will not be appointed a Divisional Revenue Officer until the Government Agent has certified that he has fully qualified himself in all respects including the passing of an exacting test in the language chiefly spoken in the district and a less severe test in the other vernacular language.

Pay and Conditions of Service

4 A probationer while in training will be paid at the rate of Rs. 1,800 per annum. The normal period of training will be 18 months, but this period may be extended if necessary. During the training period the Probationer will be expected to pass examinations in the vernacular languages, in law, accounts and in any other subject included in his training programme in which it is thought necessary to test his knowledge. When a Probationer has passed all his examinations, except that in the second language, and has been given a certificate by the Government Agent to the effect that he is fully capable in all respects of acting as a Divisional Revenue Officer he will receive payment at the rate of Rs. 2,100 per annum unless he is placed in charge of a division in a probationary capacity. From the date of such appointment he will be placed on the scale Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 6,000 by annual increments of Rs. 200 but will not receive any increment until he has passed the second language examination. Confirmation will not take place until a Divisional Revenue Officer has been in charge of a division for a period of not less than 2 years, is fully qualified and has been certified fit for confirmation by the Government Agent.

A Divisional Revenue Officer will on confirmation be allowed to proceed along the scale Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 6,000 by annual increments of Rs. 200 subject to the passing of efficiency bars at Rs. 4,200 and Rs. 5,200. His post will be pensionable and he will be liable to transfer only within the administrative area for which he has been selected. Probationers are subject to the Public Service, Financial, Leave and other regulations applicable to public officers.

If a Probationer fails to pass his examinations (except that in the second language) within 2 years of appointment, or if he passes his other examinations but fails to pass the second language examination within 4 years of appointment, the question whether he should be continued in service will be considered.

Qualifications of Candidates

5 Every candidate must possess the following minimum qualifications—

- (1) * He must be a Ceylonese
- (2) He must have been born not later than December 1, 1919, and not earlier than December 1, 1916
- (3) He must have passed at least the Senior School Certificate Examination English, or Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation
- (4) He must be of good moral character and of sound constitution physically fit for service in any part of the Island
- (5) Successful candidates will be required to pass a Medical examination the fee for which must be paid by the candidate

Method of Selection

6 For the purpose of recruitment of Probationers the Island will be regarded as comprising three administrative areas, *viz*, Low-country, Kandyan, and Tamil speaking, in each case the successful candidate will be selected for service in one of these three

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) A British subject born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon, or
- (b) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a), or
- (c) A British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers in view of special circumstances to be a Ceylonese.

areas and an officer will subsequently be transferable only within the area for which he was originally selected. The selection will be made by a Selection Board having regard to two considerations, *viz*—

- (1) the results of a competitive examination, and
- (2) the requirements of the particular area in which the selected candidate is intended to serve.

Examination

7 A competitive examination will be held for the selection of candidates wishing to join the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service. The examination will be in two parts, *viz*, (a) Written and (b) Personal Interview.

(a) The written examination will be held at Batticaloa, Colombo, Galle, Jaffna, and Kandy, commencing on March 27, 1942. Candidates should state in their application forms at which centre they wish to be examined. Any candidate who fails to indicate where he wishes to be examined will be entered for the centre closest to his place of address. Candidates will however be required to attend at Colombo or any other centre if circumstances so require.

(b) The personal interview, which will be restricted to candidates attaining a certain standard in the written examination, will be held only in Colombo on a date which will be communicated to candidates after the written examination. Candidates will be required to produce at the interview the original certificates granted in respect of any examinations they have passed.

The interview will be similar to that at present conducted at the Civil Service Entrance Examination.

The examinations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil will be designed to test the candidate's understanding and command of the language. In the English paper a passage will be set for a summary or précis.

Questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and interest of candidates (a) in the more important topics of the day, and (b) in literature, world geography, and other subjects.

Deductions up to 20 per cent. of the marks awardable will be made on account of handwriting which is difficult to read.

Refunds of Value of Stamps

9 (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1/2 the value of stamps affixed to his application, provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

10 *Canvassing*.—Any form of canvassing on behalf of a candidate or any attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will render that candidate liable to disqualification.

Resolution

This Council resolves under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance that with effect from the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*, import duty upon the goods specified in Column I of the Schedule to this resolution, shall be levied and paid at the corresponding rates severally specified in Column III of that Schedule.

Provided that preferential import duty at the corresponding rates if any, prescribed in Column II of the Schedule shall be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, Burma, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under Mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and Protected States, or the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate.

Provided further that this resolution shall cease to have effect at the expiration of three years from the date of its coming into operation unless it is previously amended or revoked or unless its operation is extended beyond that period by a resolution of the State Council, and that from the date of the expiration of this resolution the duties on the goods specified in Column I of the Schedule, shall, if they have not been subsequently amended or revoked by resolution of this Council, be levied and paid at the rates respectively leviable and payable on such goods on July 22, 1941.

REGULATION made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 9 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance (Chapter 327)

Regulation.

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, published in *Gazette* No. 8,338 of December 17, 1937, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 2, by the insertion, immediately after the definition of "infected area", of the following new definition:—

"Ordinance" means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance;'

(2) by the addition, immediately after regulation 26, of the following new regulation:—

"26A. The Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands may, by notification published in the *Gazette*, declare that the provisions of regulations 23 and 26 shall not apply to cattle imported into Ceylon from such ports in Asia or Africa as may be specified in the notification. On the publication of any such notification, the provisions of regulations 23 and 26 shall not apply to cattle imported into Ceylon from any port specified in that notification, unless such cattle have been landed under section 8 (3) of the Ordinance or the proviso to regulation 21." and

(3) in regulation 33 (as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,512 of September 22, 1939), by the substitution, for paragraphs (1) and (2), of the following new paragraphs:—

"(1) Every sheep or goat imported from any port or place in Asia or Africa for the purpose of slaughter and landed at the Port of Colombo shall, within twelve hours of being landed, be removed to the Municipal Quarantine Station for detention in accordance with regulation 40

Provided, however, that, on the direction of the Municipal Commissioner of Colombo or of any person authorised by him, any sheep or goat imported from any port or place in Asia or Africa for the purpose of slaughter and landed at the Port of Colombo may be removed direct to the Municipal Slaughter-house in Colombo, or from the Municipal Quarantine Station to that slaughter-house before the expiry of the period of detention required by regulation 40, if that sheep or goat has not been landed under section 8 (3) of the Ordinance or the proviso to regulation 21

(2) Every sheep or goat imported from any port or place in Asia or Africa for the purpose of slaughter and landed at the Port of Colombo shall, after detention in the Municipal Quarantine Station as required by paragraph (1), be removed to, and forthwith slaughtered in, the Municipal Slaughter-house in Colombo

Provided, however, that, on the direction of the Municipal Commissioner of Colombo or of any person authorised by him, any sheep or goat imported from any port or place in Asia or Africa for the purpose of slaughter and landed at the Port of Colombo may be removed from the Municipal Quarantine Station, after the expiry of the period of detention required by regulation 40, to any place other than the Municipal Slaughter-house in Colombo, if that sheep or goat is to be slaughtered outside the Municipal limits of Colombo for the use of His Majesty's Forces."

4. The following papers were laid on the table —Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies inspected during August, 1941, and report of the Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary for the same period.

5. Petitions.—Mr. L. B. Mawilmada presented a petition signed by the residents along Galagedera and Katugastota road for repairing the footpath adjoining premises No. 60, Galagedera road

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille asked —Q—(1) Since when were the necessary materials and equipment ready for the Child Welfare Clinic at Welata? A.—From September 6, 1941. Q—(2) In which building was it proposed to commence work in this area? Q—(3) What is the cause of the delay in negotiating with the owner of the building to undertake absolutely necessary repairs? A.—(2) and (3)—Having failed to secure a suitable building in that area, inquiries are being made from one Miss Fernando whether she is prepared to make necessary alterations and extensive repairs to render her building suitable for the purpose. Q—(4) Is there any truth in the allegation that this delay is due to the disinclination on the part of a certain officer to undertake additional work at an inconveniently distant place? A.—The answer is in the negative.

7. Notice of Motions —Nil.

8A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa moved —“This Council resolves that provision be made and a special by-law be framed to enable the Council to vote money for organizing and running a Carnival during the Perahera Season on Bogambara Grounds”. Paul Raj moved —(2) “That in view of the great hardship caused to the poor by the demolition of small tenements and houses on closing orders of the Council under the Housing Ordinance, this Council resolves that the construction of more model tenements and cottages exclusively for the use of the poor, from moneys raised by loan and public donations, be undertaken forthwith”. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille seconded. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne and the Mayor spoke in support of the motion. It was agreed to refer the motion to the Finance Committee

Pursuant to notice, Mr. V. D. Paul Raj moved —(3) “That three electric light standards be erected along the Mulgampola path”. It was agreed that the matter be taken up with the Budget.

8C. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved —“This Council is of opinion that shelters and seats should be provided at all or the more important bus halting places, within the City”. Gate Muhandram N. Canaganayagam seconded. Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra spoke in support of the motion. It was agreed to refer the motion to the Works and Finance Committee.

9. Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishment held on August 16, 1941

(1) To consider application from Mr. M. The Auditor-General points out that in Colombo the practice is to recover charges according to a fixed scale for the services of firemen and to give firemen concerned batta and to make no charge in respect of the services of the Chief Officer who attends in a supervisory capacity and is not paid for his services.—Recommend that the Audit be informed that the Council sees no reason to alter the existing practice.

Percival Lionel Harbour of Messrs Walker Sons & Co, Ltd, Colombo, seeks leave to amend the specification of application numbered and dated as above for "An improved apparatus for regulating the discharge of leaf from tea rolling machines" alleging as the reasons — Since filing the specification I have found it desirable to modify the method of operating the invention so as to prevent incorrect sequence of actions by the attendant and as the amendment does not make the invention substantially larger or substantially different leave is sought to amend the specification

The proposed amendments are as follows —

Amended specification to be read in continuation of para 1 on page 2 of specification as — It has been found desirable, in practice, to provide some means to prevent incorrect sequence of operation by the attendant of the machine to which the specified invention is applied

By way of explanation, it is possible for the attendant to rotate the wheel (J) without first unlocking the door (B) by means of the handle (O) and this will have the effect of compressing the safety spring (R) by virtue of the screw (H) travelling through trunnion block (G) towards the operator and if, without realising the mistake, the operator should release the door lock (K) (without first returning the handwheel (J) to its original position) the door (B) will drop with some violence and cause the screw spindle (H) to strike the brackets carrying this spindle and be liable to cause damage to these parts.

To overcome this possibility an interlocking device is incorporated in the invention and this amendment is shown in red ink on the drawing sheet No 1, Fig 1 and 2, as forming part of the specification, Fig 3 being added for clearness, and reference is made as follows —

The locking handle (O) is extended by the part (T) and is coupled to a sliding bar (U) by means of the pin (W) working in the slotted portion of the sliding bar (U).

The sliding bar (U) is held in position by an extension to the bracket (V) which carries the screw spindle (H) and the bar (U) is free to move in a lateral direction through this bracket (V)

Fitted to the screw spindle (H) is a slotted nut (Y) into which one end of the sliding bar (U) will engage when the locking handle (O) is in the closed position

On the locking fork (K) a spring (X) is fitted which exerts a pressure on the fork (K) to ensure that this is normally in the closed position

The pins (Z) in the sliding bar (U) determine the amount of lateral travel of the sliding bar.

It will be seen that before the screw spindle (H) can be rotated it is necessary to move the locking handle (O) from the shut to the open position thus unlocking the discharge door (B) and leaving this free to open

By the same action the sliding bar (U) is withdrawn from the nut (Y) thus permitting the spindle (H) to be rotated causing the door (B) to open in the normal manner.

Should the operator release the locking handle (O), this will return to the closed position under the action of the spring (X) (which has been compressed by the opening of the fork (K)) at the same time the sliding bar (U) is made to engage one of the slots in the nut (Y) thus preventing further rotation of the spindle (H) until such time as the bar (U) is withdrawn from the nut (Y) by operation of the locking handle (O)

"An apparatus for separating gold dust or pure gold ore, gems or any other heavy substance from their respective ores"

Abstract.—This invention deals with an apparatus designed for the purpose of separating gold dust or pure gold ore and gems or any other heavy substance from their respective ores. The process of separating gold dust and gems from their respective ores is effected by mechanically rocking a basin which is of about hemispherical shape made of steel or any other suitable metal, into which the ore is introduced with a continual and plentiful supply of water in such a manner that the heavier gold dust or pure gold ore or gems sink down to the bottom of the basin, while the rest of the ore flows out of the basin mixed with water from the lowered part of the brim. The basin is so fixed in position that when stationary, the plane of its brim is at a determined angle to the plane of the horizon *i.e.* the brim is not horizontal but slanting and the bottom of the basin is always at a determined depth below the lowest point of the brim. When working, the brim of the basin does not rotate but heaves up and down similar to the motion of a wave while the bottom of the basin does not revolve round its axis but bodily moves itself round a circular path the plane of which is horizontal. The bottom of the basin is supplied with a two-fold device for withdrawing the heavier material collected at the bottom whenever desired without hindering the movement of the basin. These devices are worked by worm and wheel arrangement fitted at the bottom of the apparatus. The driving wheel of this arrangement is placed outside the stationary cylindrical frame. In the opinion of the inventor such a device can be used for similar purposes where the separation of a heavier component of a mixture is desired.

There are 11 Claims and four sheets of drawings explaining the construction of the apparatus.
