China Sea—Approaches to Hongkong—Extinguishing of Cape d'Aguilar Light.

The Colonial Secretary to the Government of Hongkong has given notice that on and after March 1, 1896, the light on Cape d'Aguilar (south-east extremity of Hongkong island) will be extinguished.

Hindustan, West Coast—Gulf of Cambay—Fixed White Light at Gogha (Gogo).

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 506 of 1895) that a light is exhibited from an iron structure recently erected at Gogha Bandar.

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Gogha light is fixed white, elevated 25 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles, between the bearings N.-W. through west and south and S.S.E.

The light is dioptric of the sixth order.

Approximate position on Chart 1,035: lat. 21° 41' 2 5" N., long. 72° 16' 40" E.

Eastern Archipelago—Lombok Strait—Reported Rocks off the West Coast of Lombok.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 514 of 1895) of the reported existence of the under-mentioned rocks off the west coast of Lombok:—

1. A coral reef about 2 cables long in a W. by N. and E. by S. direction, and having over it a depth of 4½ fathoms, lies with Rombeh point bearing north and Pandanan point S. 69° W.

Approximate position: lat. 8° 39' 45" S., long. 116° 15' E.

2. A coral reef with 6 fathoms over it lies with the west point of entrance to Labuan Tering bay, bearing S. 30° E., and cape Pandanan S. 62° W.

Approximate position: lat. 8° 39' 15" S., long. 115° 59' 30" E.

3. A coral reef, about 2 cables in extent, with 1½ fathom over it, lies with the eastern extreme of Lajar island bearing S. 12° W., and the north extreme of Trawangan (North island) S. 86° W.

Approximate position: lat. 8° 19' 30" S., long. 116° 5' 30" E.

4. A reef with 6 fathoms over it, and about 2 cables in extent, lies 2½ cables W. by N. from the above-mentioned reef No. 3.

Variation, 1¼° easterly in 1895.
