THE PETROL (CONTROL OF SUPPLIES) ORDINANCE, No 52 OF 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Petrol (Control of Supplies) Ordinance, No. 52 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this order fix the first day of November, 1941, as the date on and after which no person other than a vendor shall purchase or obtain any petrol—

- (a) unless he is an approved consumer and is the holder of a permit issued by the Controller under this Ordinance; or
- (b) unless an order authorising the sale or supply of a specified quantity of petrol to him by a supplier has been issued by the Controller.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

EXPLOSIVES.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices, above which the article mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by retail within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo,
- (ii) direct that every trader who sells the article mentioned in the Schedule to the Order at any premises shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at the premises, a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article,
- (iii) direct that every trader who sells the article described in the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that article a receipt on which shall be set out —
  - (a) description of that article,
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of the article sold,
  - (c) the quantity of the article sold,
  - (d) the date of sale.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

PAPER.

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

- (i) rescind my Order dated September 25, 1941, published in Gazette No 8,796 of September 26, 1941, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of paper of the description and grade named and specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per pound above which paper of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo,
- (iii) direct that for the purposes of this Order any sale of any quantity of paper for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- (iv) direct that every trader, who at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, sells paper of any description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit, in a conspicuous position at those premises, the maximum price fixed by this Order for paper of that description and grade,
- (v) direct that every trader who sells paper of any description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of the paper a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity and description and grade of paper sold;
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of paper sold,
  - (c) the date of the sale.
