THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

*Regulation.*

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after regulation 32F of the following new regulation:—

“Measures for safety of vessels in port.”  
32F. (1) The competent authority may give directions to the owner or master of any vessel which is for the time being at a port in Ceylon requiring him—  
(a) to take such steps as may be specified in the directions for the purpose of securing that, while the vessel remains at the port, fires occurring in the vessel as the result of hostile attack will be immediately detected and combated.

- (b) to secure that, while the vessel remains at the port, either at all times or during such periods as may be so specified—
- (i) in a case where the vessel is equipped with a gun or other instrument or device capable of being used to defend the vessel against hostile attack, that the gun, instrument or device will be manned, and
  - (ii) in a case where the vessel is a ship propelled by mechanical power, that she is capable of being moved under her own power immediately when ordered to do so;
- (c) for the purpose of taking such steps or securing such matters as aforesaid, to secure that such number of persons, or such number of persons of such class or description, as may be so specified, shall be on board the vessel, either at all times while she remains at the port or during such periods while she so remains as may be so specified;
- (d) to do or not to do such other things as may appear to the competent authority to be necessary or expedient to do or not to do for the purpose of securing the safety of the vessel or preventing her endangering other vessels or property at the port in the event of hostile attack.
- (2) Any servant of His Majesty may, in relation to any vessel, take such steps and use such force as may appear to him to be reasonably necessary for securing compliance with any directions under this Regulation relating to a vessel, or, where an offence against this Regulation has occurred in the case of a vessel, for enabling proceedings in respect of the offence to be effectually taken.
- (3) The cost of taking any steps under the last foregoing paragraph in relation to a vessel for securing compliance with directions under this Regulation shall be a debt due from the owner of the vessel to the Crown; and, upon production before any Magistrate's court of a certificate under the hand of the competent authority that any sum specified in the certificate is due to the Crown from the owner of a vessel by way of such costs, that sum shall be recovered by the court in like manner as though it were a fine imposed by the court on the owner of the vessel notwithstanding that such sum may be in excess of the maximum amount of a fine which the court may impose in the exercise of its ordinary jurisdiction;
- Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall affect or prejudice the right of the Crown to recover any such costs by civil action or otherwise.
- (4) In this Regulation the expression "owner", in relation to a vessel, includes the person having the management of the vessel."

RICE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum c.i.f. price per bag above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold;
- (ii) direct that no trader shall sell any rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (iii) direct that every trader who makes a c.i.f. sale of rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which there shall be set out—
  - (1) the quantity, description and grade of rice sold;
  - (2) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (3) the date of sale;
  - (4) a statement that the sale was a c.i.f. sale;
- (iv) direct that for the purposes of this order—
  - (a) any sale of any rice lying at the Customs or in the Colombo Harbour, of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, before such rice is cleared through the Customs and delivery thereof granted by the Collector of Customs or person authorised by him, shall be deemed to be a c.i.f. sale;
  - (b) a bag of rice other than Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 77 measures or 154 pounds;
  - (c) a bag of Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 115 measures or 230 lb.;
- (v) this order does not apply to any sale of rice in fulfilment of a contract made prior to the date of this order, and
- (vi) direct that in the case of any conflict between the directions of this order and the directions of my price order relating to rice dated December 12, 1941, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,827 of the same date, the directions of this order shall prevail.

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum retail price per bushel, and the maximum retail price per measure, above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall not be sold in the area within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna of the Jaffna District (including the Jaffna Urban Council area);
- (ii) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna of the Jaffna District exposes for sale rice of any description mentioned in the schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice of that description;

- (vi.) direct that every trader who sells sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of the sale,
  - the quantity of sugar sold;
  - the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold,
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and
  - the description and grade of sugar sold.

*Order.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3) ) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, John Radley Walters, Deputy Controller of Prices, Badulla District, do, by this Order —

- fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of any description and grade shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule,
- direct that every trader who exposes for sale sugar of description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for sugar of that description and grade,
- direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- prescribe that every trader who sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out —
  - the description and grade of sugar sold;
  - the quantity of sugar sold,
  - the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold,
  - the date of the sale; and
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail as the case may be;
- direct that for the purpose of this Order:—
  - any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (5) direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale,
  - (b) the quantity sold,
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold,
  - (d) the nature of the transaction that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, and
  - (e) the description and grade of the article sold.

## Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Charles Joseph Dane Lanktree, Deputy Controller of Prices, Trincomalee District do, by this Order —

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the First Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum retail price per bag, the maximum retail price per bushel, and the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule, shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be in the area within the administrative limits of the Urban Council of Trincomalee.
- (ii) direct that the maximum retail price per bag which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be the maximum retail price per bag above which rice of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule.

- (vii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
- (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
  - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag prescribed by this Order in respect of that area for rice of that description and grade,
  - (d) a bag of any rice other than Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 95 "cut" measures and 190 pounds by weight,
  - (e) a bag of Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 120 "cut" measures and 240 pounds by weight,
  - (f) a measure shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel,
- (viii) direct that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which there shall be set out—
- (a) the description and grade of rice sold,
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold,
  - (c) the date of the sale, and
  - (d) the nature of the sale, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail
