GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

RICE.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

- (i) rescind my Order dated December 14, 1941, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,830 of December 15, 1941, in so far as it relates to the maximum c.i.f. prices fixed in respect of rice of the description named and specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum c.i.f. price per bag above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold,
- (iii) direct that no trader shall sell any rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality,
- (iv) direct that every trader who makes a c.i.f. sale of rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (1) the quantity, description and grade of rice sold,
 - (2) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
 - (3) the date of sale;
 - (4) a statement that the sale was a c.i.f. sale,
- (v) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any rice lying at the Customs or in the Colombo harbour, of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, before such rice is cleared through the Customs and delivery thereof granted by the Collector of Customs or person authorised by him, shall be deemed to be a c.i.f. sale;
 - (b) a bag of rice other than Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 77 measures or 154 pounds;
 - (c) a bag of Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 115 measures or 230 lb.;
- (vi) direct that this Order shall not apply to any sale of rice in fulfilment of a contract made prior to the date of this Order; and
- (vii) direct that in the case of any conflict between the directions of this Order and the directions of my Price Order relating to rice dated December 12, 1941, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,827 of the same date, the directions of this order shall prevail.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price above which any article of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade;
- (4) direct that where any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is sold the sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the First Schedule;
- (5) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
“measure” shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (6) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out—
(a) the description and grade of article sold;
(b) the quantity or weight of the article sold;
(c) the date of the sale, and
(d) the price paid for the article sold.

RICE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 5, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Montagu Gybbon-Monypenny, Deputy Controller of Prices, Puttalam-Chilaw Districts, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per bag and per measure above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail for, respectively, the three areas specified in the First Schedule hereto ;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises (1) a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for rice of that description and grade, and (2) samples of rice of that description and grade in white transparent phials bearing labels in which there shall be set out the description and grade of the rice contained therein ;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality ;
- (4) prescribe that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice sold ;
 - (b) the quantity of rice sold ,
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold ;
 - (d) the date of sale ;
- (5) direct that every trader who has no stock of rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto available for sale shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that stocks of rice of such description and grade are not available for sale for the time being ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of any rice other than broken raw rice shall contain not less than 77 measures and 154 pounds ;
 - (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 115 measures and 239 pounds ;
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, equivalent to one thirty second part of a bushel ;
 - (d) "bushel" shall be deemed to be the equivalent of thirty-two measures ;
 - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded within any area mentioned in the First Schedule hereto for a quantity of rice which is less than a bag but not less than one bushel shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag prescribed by this Order, in respect of that area, for rice of that description and grade ;
 - (f) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold in a quantity of one bushel or more shall include the container in which such rice is sold.

 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel
- (7) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold.
 - (c) the date of the sale,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail as the case may be.

Order.

BY virtue of powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order —

- (1) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale price per cwt. or candy as the case may be, above which the undermentioned articles of any description and grade shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price per cwt. or candy as the case may be above which the said articles of that description and grade shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (2) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by the order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price per pound above which the said article of any description and grade shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per pound above which the said articles of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) direct that every trader who exposed for sale the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for the said articles of that description and grade;

- (4) direct that no trader shall sell the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with the said articles of an inferior description and grade or quality ;
- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells any of the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold ,
 - (b) the quality of articles sold ;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of articles sold ;
 - (d) the date of the sale, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was a wholesale or retail as the case may be ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of the said articles for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of the said articles for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be sale by retail ,
 - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of the said articles which is less than 1 cwt. shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per cwt. prescribed by this Order in respect of that area for the articles of that description and grade ;
- (7) direct that provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of the articles mentioned in the First Schedule hereto.

CURRY STUFFS AND PULSES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order —

- (1) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale price per candy or cwt , as the case may be, above which the undermentioned articles of any description and grade shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price per candy or cwt , as the case may be, above which articles of that description and grade shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule ;
- (2) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price per lb. or measure, as the case may be, above which the said articles of any description and grade shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per lb. or measure, as the case may be, above which articles of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (3) direct that every trader who exposed for sale the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for the articles of that description and grade ,
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with the said articles of an inferior description and grade or quality ,
- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells any of the said articles of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of the article sold ,
 - (b) the quality of article sold ;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of article sold ,
 - (d) the date of the sale ; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was a wholesale or retail, as the case may be ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of the said articles for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ,
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of the said articles for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be sale by retail ;
 - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of the said articles which is less than 1 cand or cwt , as the case may be, shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per candy or cwt. prescribed by this Order in respect for that area, for the articles of that description and grade ,

(7) direct that provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of the articles mentioned in the First Schedule hereto.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Morgan Davies, Deputy Controller of Prices, Ratnapura District, do by this Order :—

- (1) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price above which any article of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade;
- (4) direct that where any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is sold by retail the sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the First Schedule;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order :—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - and
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (6) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out :—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold,
 - (c) the date of the sale,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail as the case may be.
