EMERGENCY PARTIAL BLACKOUT.

IN terms of the power vested m the Minister for Local Administration by section 12 (1) of the Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, as amended by Order published in the Gazette of December 23, 1941, it is hereby notified that the Minister has, under section 7 of the said Order, imposed from 6 PM on December 25, 1941, until further notice, a partial blackout in all the additional scheduled areas as given

1 The whole of the area comprised within the administrative limits of each of the following Urban Councils:

Chilaw

Puttalam.

2. The whole of the area comprised within the administrative limits of each of the following Sanitary Board Towns:

Udappuwa.

Marawila

3 The whole of the area, one mile wide, along the coast of Ceylon from the mouth of the Maha-oya to the northern point of the pennisula lying to the west of Puttalam lake and Dutch bay, exclusive of any area or part of any area specified or defined in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this schedule.

2 The provisions of Part III of the Lighting Restriction Order (namely, sections I3 to 17 inclusively) relating to Outdoor and Indoor Lights and Lights on Volucios shall come into operation from that day and continue until the Minister issues directions that the partial blackout shall cease to be in force in the scheduled areas.
