A PROCLAMATION.

A. CALDECOTT.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare the two areas delimited in the Schedule hereto to be, jointly, a town for the purposes of that Ordinance, and define the administrative limits of that town to be the limits set out in that Schedule.

Schedule

(a) The area situated in Tangalla, and bounded as follows —

North: From a point at the centre of the Weeraketiya-Tangalla road where the southern boundary of Walganeliya village (F. V. P. 316) crosses it, alternately north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the said southern boundary of Walganeliya (F. V. P. 316) till it meets the northern boundary of Tangalla-Hambantota road, thence south-eastwards across the said road to its southern boundary.

East: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the southern boundary of the Tangalla-Hambantota road as far as the eastern boundary of the Gansabhawa road leading from opposite the Honakaduwa temple to the sea, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said Gansabhawa road to the northern boundary of the road from Tangalla to gardens thence south-eastwards in a straight line across the said road to the high water mark of the sea, thence south-westwards, southwards, and south-eastwards along the high water mark of the sea to a point $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains due east of the south-eastern corner of lot 8514 (burial ground for the Buddhists) in P. P. 1,085.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the high water mark of the sea as far as the eastern limit of Kadurupokuna village (F. V. P. 311).

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern boundary of the said Kadurupokuna village (F. V. P. 311) as far as the north-eastern corner of lot 360 (path) in F. V. P. 311, thence westwards along the northern boundary of lot 360 (path) and the southern and western boundaries of lot 44b (Gansabhawa road) in F. V. P. 311 to the landmark at the south-western corner of lot 44 in F. V. P. 311, thence northwards along the eastern boundaries of lots 45 and 44a in F. V. P. 311 to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said lot 44a, thence north-eastwards along the southern boundaries of lots 43 and 49 to the landmark at the south-eastern corner of the said lot 49 in F. V. P. 311, thence northwards, eastwards, and north-westwards along the eastern boundaries of Kadurupokuna and Polommaruwa villages (F. V. Ps. 311 and 313) and thence northwards along the southern boundary of Walganeliya village (F. V. P. 316) to the starting point of the northern limit.

(b) The area situated in Beliatta, and bounded as follows:—

North: From a point on the northern boundary of the path at the south-western corner of lot 153 in final village plan No. 291 eastwards along the northern boundary of the said path till it meets the western boundary of Walasmulla-Dickwella road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets a point about one chain north of the north-eastern corner of lot 157, thence across the said road and south-eastwards across lot 158 to a point on the eastern boundary of the said lot 158 about $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains north of the south-eastern corner of the said lot 158, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 158 to a distance of about one chain, thence eastwards across lot 159 to the landmark at the north-western corner of lot 161e, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 161e as far as the landmark at the south-western corner of lot 161, thence south-eastwards across lot 161c in a straight line to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 161c3, thence along the eastern boundary of the said lot 161c3 till it meets the northern boundary of lot 161c, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 161c in final village plan No. 291 till it meets the village limit between Kahawatta (final village plan No. 291) and Puwakdandawa (final village plan No. 308), thence north-eastwards along the said village limit to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 4n (road) in final village plan No. 308, thence south-westwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 4n (road) to the landmark at the north-western corner of lot 4o in supplement No. 5 to final village plan No. 308, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 4o and northwards and eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of lot 225 in supplement No. 12 to final village plan No. 308 to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said lot 225 in supplement No. 12 to final village plan No. 308.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern boundaries of lots 225, 226, and 227 in supplement No. 12 to final village plan No. 308, to the landmark at the south-eastern corner of the said lot 227, thence in a line across lot 4 in final village plan No. 308 to the landmark at the north-western corner of lot 21a, thence along the

western boundary of the said lot 21a to the landmark at its south-western corner, thence in a line across lot 20 to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 20b (tank bund) in supplement No. 8 to final village plan No. 308, thence along the eastern boundaries of lots 20b, 46b, 39a, 46a, and 37c (tank bund) in supplement No. 8 to final village plan No. 308, to the landmark at the south-eastern corner of the said lot 37c, thence south-westwards along the eastern boundary of the foot path till it meets the road from Hakmana to Tangalla, thence across the said road and lot 37 in final village plan No. 308 to the north-western corner of lot 95 in final village plan No. 308.

South: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the edge of the paddy field running through lot 104 in final village plan No. 308 till it meets the south-eastern corner of lot 103, thence along the southern boundaries of lots 103 and 100 till it meets the southern boundary of the lane, thence westwards along the southern boundary of the said lane till it meets the road from Dickwella to Walasmulla, thence across the said road and northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the southern boundary of lot 100, thence north-westwards along the southern boundary of the said lot 100 till it meets the southern boundary of the foot path (lot 219 in final village plan No. 308), thence westwards along the southern boundary of the foot path till it meets the eastern boundary of lot 107 in final village plan No. 298, thence north-westwards and south-westwards along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said lot 107 and along the northern boundary of lot 84e to its western extremity.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western boundaries of lots 90b and 90 and southern and western boundaries of lot 11 in final village plan No. 298 and eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 11 till it meets the south-western corner of lot 12, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said lot 12 to its north-western corner, thence northwards in a straight line across lot 13 to the northern boundary of the said lot 13, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 13 to a point in lot 6 about $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains due east of the north-eastern corner of the said lot 13, thence a line drawn north-eastwards through lots 6 and 7 to a point on the northern boundary of lot 7 about $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains east of the north-western corner of the said lot 7, thence north-westwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 7 and along the southern and western boundaries of the foot path running through lot 6 till it meets the south-eastern corner of lot 35 (tank), thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 35 and southern boundary of lot 36 in final village plan No. 298 till it meets the north-western corner of lot 179 in final village plan No. 291, thence along the northern boundary of the said lot 179 and western boundaries of lots 178 and 177 in final village plan No. 291 till it meets the road from Hakmana to Tangalla, thence across the said road and south-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the south-western corner of lot 175, thence north-eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of lot 175 and western boundaries of lots 174 and 153 in final village plan No. 291 to the starting point of the northern limit.

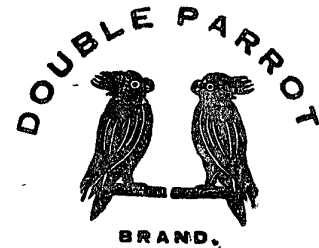

- (i.) rescind my Order dated December 22, 1941, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,838 of December 27, 1941, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of rice of the description named and specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto for sale within areas specified in the Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum retail price per bag, the maximum retail price per bushel and the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the area within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts of the Jaffna District;
- (iii.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts of the Jaffna District exposes for sale rice of any description mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice of that description;
- (iv.) direct that no trader shall sell any rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (v.) direct that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which there shall be set out—

 - (1) the quantity, description and grade of rice sold;
 - (2) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
 - (3) the date of sale;
 - (4) the nature of the sale, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and

- (vi.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard (cut) quart, dry measure, equivalent to 1/32 of a bushel;
 - (d) the maximum retail price which may be demanded within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts of the Jaffna District, for a quantity of rice which is less than a bag but not less than one bushel shall be determined by reference to the maximum retail price per bushel prescribed by this Order, in respect of that area, for rice of that description;
 - (e) a bag of rice other than Rose Rice and Broken Raw rice shall contain not less than 72 cut measures or 154 pounds;
 - (f) a bag of Rose rice and Broken Raw rice shall contain not less than 76 measures or 154 pounds.

- (i.) rescind my Order dated December 12, 1941, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,830 of December 15, 1941, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of sugar of the description named and specified in column 1 of the Schedule thereto for sale within the areas specified in the Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Divisional Revenue Officer's division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area);

 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of sugar sold.

- (i.) rescind my Order dated December 9, 1941, published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,825 of December 10, 1941, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (iii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) An "Importer" shall mean any person who in his name has cleared from the Customs any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (d) A "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who has been in the habit of selling for resale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (e) "Importer's Maximum Price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
 - (f) Maximum wholesale price shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
 - (g) Maximum retail price shall apply to all sales by retail; and
 - (h) A measure shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (iv.) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (v.) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (vi.) direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of the article sold.
