AMENDMENT TO THE MINUTES ON PENSIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that the rules regulating the pensions to be granted to public servants of Ceylon, set out in the Minute on Pensions dated February 5, 1934, as amended by any subsequent Minute, be further amended as follows:—

This Council resolves under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) that, with effect from the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*—

- Import duty upon the goods specified in column I. of the First Schedule to this resolution shall be levied and paid at the general rate prescribed in column II. of that Schedule, in lieu of the import duty payable upon such goods at the date of this resolution; and
- import duty on the goods specified in column I. of the Second Schedule in this resolution shall be levied and paid at the general rate prescribed in column III. of that Schedule (being the rate now payable on tallow for candles) in lieu of the import duty payable upon such goods at the date of this resolution.

Provided that import duty at the preferential rate prescribed in column II. of that Schedule shall be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs, to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, Burma, the territories administered by His Majesty's Government in the Dominions under mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and protected states and the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate.

Capitation Tax.

Exemption.

1. The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax:—

- accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination;
- members of the Ceylon Defence Force;
- railway telegraph linesmen; and
- persons over fifty-five years of age.

Preparation of lists.

2. The person or persons authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall, on or before July 31 in each year, prepare, in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.

3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever required by the Chairman or by any duly authorised person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purposes of the preparation of the list, or furnished all such information, written or oral, as may be required, relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the householder himself), and the name, age, race, and other particulars of each such person.

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office of the Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from August 1 to 31 of that year.

5. Any person whose name is included in the list may, by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before September 1, object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter, or that he has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the liability to pay the capitation tax. The Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider necessary, make such order as may seem to him just.

6. Any person not already exempted under by-law 1 may, on or before February 1, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such liability for that year or for life, or for such other period as he may think fit on the ground that such person is, by reason of bodily infirmity or disease, incapable of performing labour.

7. The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-laws 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman, on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

Annual programme of work.

8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before October 31 in each year—

- prepare a programme of all the items of work which have to be constructed or maintained during the next succeeding year;
- determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him;
- determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which the labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

(2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1) shall be published by the Chairman, as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that area.

9. In the case of any item of work not included in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1), any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period, but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

Commutation of tax.

10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money at the rate determined by the Committee under by-law 8 (1), on or before March 31 or such later date in that year as the Committee may fix with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, information shall be given in the village area by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman, specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour, and the hours of work on each such day. The persons required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name or as inhabitants of any specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

Performance of labour.

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited, or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

Performance or commutation of double labour.

14. Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13, shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be liable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days in respect of each day on which he is in default.

15. Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perform such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by-law 8 (1):

Provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14 and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. 4. (1) A fee of Re. 1 per month shall be charged for a permit issued under regulation 3.

(2) Every permit issued under regulation 3 shall contain the number of the omnibus or motor cab in respect of which it is issued and shall be valid for a period of one calendar month from the date of issue.

5. The driver of every omnibus or motor cab parked in a public stand shall, whenever required to do so by a police officer in uniform or by a person duly authorised in writing by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or motor cab under regulation 3.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Sanitary Board of the Batticaloa District.

“public stand” means a place set apart by the Sanitary Board of the Batticaloa District as a place at which omnibuses or motor cabs may be halted or may stand for hire.

NOTICE TO SHIPPERS.

Export Control.

1. A notice to shippers published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,848 of January 16, 1942, gave details of the procedure to be adopted in respect of the issue of licences for certain destinations.

2. In the case of Spain a modified procedure for the commodities specified below will be adopted. The importer in Spain should persuade the Spanish Government authorities to sponsor the consignment in London. Application to me for an export licence should not be made until the shipper is informed by the importer in Spain that the application has been finally approved in London.

3. This new procedure will be applied to all applications received in March for export licences required for goods to be shipped during the April-June quarter. Applications in respect of shipments in March will however be dealt with as at present.

4. The commodities referred to above are as follows:—

Industrial oil seeds, oils and fats; substitute edible oils; jute, coffee; cocoa; rubber, raw and scrap, and latex.

The procedure for other commodities will be as given in paragraph 1 of my notice to shippers published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,848 of January 16, 1942.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of the under-mentioned quantities of local timber in log form delivered to the Department of Prisons at (a) Welikada Prison, Colombo, and (b) Bogambara Prison, Kandy, inclusive of transport and loading charges in each case as per particulars and conditions given below:—

(a) For Welikada Prison: Halmilla 1,000 cubic feet and Ceylon Teak 1,000 cubic feet.

(b) For Bogambara Prison: Suriyamara 500 cubic feet, Satin 500 cubic feet, Hulanhik 500 cubic feet, Ceylon Teak 500 cubic feet, Halmilla 1,000 cubic feet, Helemba 1,000 cubic feet and Kolon 1,000 cubic feet.

All logs should be well matured and free from sap wood, knots, slakes, cracks and other imperfections. Quotations should be calculated on the basis of a rate per cubic foot. THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended by Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Evacuation) (Expenses of Accommodation) Regulations, 1942

2. (1) Where, at the request of any person, any dependant of that person has been granted accommodation by the Civil Defence Commissioner, at the expense of the Government of Ceylon, at any evacuation camp or elsewhere, that person shall pay to the Civil Defence Commissioner, in respect of each such dependant so accommodated, the appropriate amount specified in the Schedule in respect of each day during which such dependant is so accommodated.

(2) No amount shall be payable under paragraph (1) of this regulation by any person in respect of any dependant who is under the age of three years.

3. Where any person is liable under regulation 2 (1) to pay any amount to the Civil Defence Commissioner, the employer of that person shall, at the request of the Civil Defence Commissioner and

subject as hereinafter provided, be entitled to deduct, and shall deduct, from the salary, wages or other remuneration payable to such person at any time, any amount which may, at that time, be due from that person to the Civil Defence Commissioner under regulation 2 (1):

Provided, however, that the deduction made under the preceding provisions of this regulation in the case of any person at any one time shall not exceed one half of the total amount of the salary wages or other remuneration due to that person at that time.

4. All sums deducted under regulation 3 by the employer of any person shall be remitted by such employer to the Civil Defence Commissioner in such manner and at such intervals as the Civil Defence Commissioner may determine, and in accordance with such general or special directions as may be issued by the Civil Defence Commissioner.

5. The provisions of these regulations shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Wages Boards Ordinance, No. 27 of 1941, or in any other written law.

6. In these regulations, "dependant", in relation to any person, means the wife of that person or any child of his of either sex under the age of fourteen years, and includes any female or any child under the age of fourteen years, where such female or child is wholly or in part dependent on the earnings of that person.

 - (f) Maximum wholesale price shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer; and
 - (g) Maximum retail price shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (iv.) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (v.) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (vi.) direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold;

- (1) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the Maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price above which any article of that description and grade shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article ;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade ;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - (c) "Measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel ;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold ;
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold ;
 - (c) the date of the sale ;
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold ; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do, by this Order :—

- (1) rescind my order fixing the maximum retail prices of, curry stuffs, sugar, wheat flour and pulses in the area within the Revenue District of Kegalla, dated December 19, 1941, and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,836 of December 23, 1941;
- (2) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the areas specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule shall give to the purchaser of that article a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
 - (b) the quantity of article sold,
 - (c) the date of sale;
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold,
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) a measure shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel.
