A. CALDECOTT.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare the area delimited in the Schedule hereto to be a town for the purposes of that Ordinance, and define the administrative limits of that town to be the limits set out in that Schedule.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. Every claim for compensation or for apportionment of compensation under the Defence (Compensation) Regulations, 1941 (other than a claim for compensation or apportionment of compensation in respect of the requisition or acquisition of a vessel or aircraft or in respect of the requisition of space or accommodation in a ship or aircraft) shall be made by notice in the form specified in relation to such claim in the Schedule hereto.
2. Two copies of every notice of claim referred to in regulation 1 shall—
 - (a) be signed by the claimant or by a person duly authorised by the claimant in that behalf; and
 - (b) be delivered or transmitted to the competent authority or the authorised officer or person by whom the act was done in respect of which compensation is claimed or to such other officer or person as may be specified by that competent authority or authorised officer or person on application made to him for directions in that behalf.
3. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Claims for Compensation) Regulations, 1942.

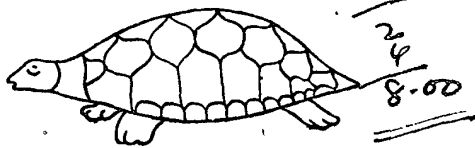

Regulation

The Defence (Internal) Regulations, 1942, published in the *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,880 of March 10, 1942, are hereby amended by the addition of the following new regulation:

"5. The Governor may, by Notification published in the *Gazette*, declare that the provisions of Regulations 2, 3, and 4 of these regulations shall cease to apply to any internal circular specified in that Notification: and such provisions shall, accordingly, cease to apply to that internal circular on the date on which that Notification is published in the *Gazette*."
