PERSONAL INJURIES (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) ORDINANCE,
No. 4 of 1942.

It is hereby notified that the following Scheme made by the Financial Secretary (Emergency Provisions) Ordinance, No. 4 of 1942, has been approved by the Council and ratified by the Governor.

Financial Secretary's Office,
Colombo, March 18, 1942.

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme, 1942.

2. (1) The Interpretation Ordinance applies to the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies to the interpretation of an Ordinance.

(2) In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires—

“apprentice” means a person who has attained the age of fifteen years but has not attained the age of twenty-four years and who, not being a gainfully occupied person, is undergoing full-time training for any trade, business, profession, office, employment or vocation;

“civil defence organisation” means an organisation which is declared by Article 3 of this Scheme to be a civil defence organisation for the purposes of the Ordinance and of this Scheme;

“civil defence volunteer”, in relation to an injury, means a person certified by a responsible officer of a civil defence organisation to have been a member of that organisation at the time when the injury was sustained;

“Class A injury” means a war service injury sustained by a civil defence volunteer;

“Class B injury” means a war injury sustained by a gainfully occupied person or by a pensioner;

“Class C injury” means a war injury sustained by a person (not being a civil defence volunteer or a gainfully occupied person or pensioner) who is of or above the age of fifteen years;

“Defence Regulation” means a regulation under the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940;

“degree of disablement” in Part III. of this Scheme means degree of disablement as assessed and certified under Article 5 of this Scheme;

“dependent child”, in relation to a person who has sustained an injury, means any child, born at any time not later than nine months after the date (in this definition referred to as “the material date”) on which that injury was sustained, who has not attained the age of fifteen years and who, if born before the material date, was at that date either residing with or being wholly or mainly maintained by the injured person, and who is—

- (a) a legitimate child of the injured person; or
- (b) a child of the injured person who was legitimated before the material date; or
- (c) a child of the injured person who is illegitimate or was legitimated after the material date, being in either case, where the injured person was a male person, a child whose father and mother had for the year immediately preceding the material date, or for the last year of their joint lives, whichever is the earlier, been regularly co-habiting as husband and wife, and whose mother had during that year been wholly or mainly maintained by his father; or
- (d) where the injured person is a male person, a step-child whose mother was married to the injured person before the material date; or
- (e) a child adopted by the injured person before the material date;

Provided that a child who—

- (i) had on the material date attained the age of fifteen years and was on that date a child receiving full-time instruction at a school; or
- (ii) is, on the date when he attains the age of fifteen years, a child receiving such instruction;

may be treated, for the purposes of this definition, as a child who has not attained the age of fifteen years until the date on which he ceases to be a child receiving such instruction or the thirty-first day of July next following the day on which he attains the age of sixteen years, whichever is the earlier date;

“disablement” means loss of physical or mental capacity, and “disabled” shall be construed accordingly;

“gainfully occupied person” means a person who is engaged in any business, profession, office, employment or vocation and is wholly or substantially dependent thereon for his livelihood, and includes a person who, though temporarily unemployed, is normally so engaged;

“local authority” means a Municipal Council, an Urban Council, a Sanitary Board, a Village Committee, a Provincial Road Committee or a District Committee;

“the Ordinance” means the Personal Injuries (Emergency Provisions) Ordinance, No. 4 of 1942;

“pensioner”, in relation to an injury, means a person who, at the time he sustains that injury, is in receipt of a pension or other allowance payable during his lifetime at regular intervals out of the general revenue of the Island or the funds of any local authority or institution established by or under any written law, and includes any person who, at the time he sustains that injury, is in receipt of a pension or other allowance payable during his life-time at regular intervals from any other source or fund by virtue of a grant or disposition which is irrevocable in law;

“period of the present emergency” means the period beginning with the date of the commencement of the Ordinance and ending with such date as the Governor may appoint by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*;

“prescribe” means prescribe by regulations made under this Scheme and “prescribed” shall be construed accordingly;

“public funds” means the general revenue or other funds of the Island and includes the fund of any local authority or any fund established under or by virtue of any written law;

“qualifying injury”, in relation to a person, means an injury sustained by that person in respect of which an award under this Scheme may be made;

“relevant qualifying injury”, in relation to an award of an allowance to or in respect of the wife, or of a pension to the widow, of a person, means a qualifying injury sustained by that person after he was married to that wife or widow, and, in relation to an award of an allowance in respect of, or of a pension to, a dependent child of a person, means a qualifying injury sustained by that person in relation to which that child falls to be treated for the purposes of this Scheme as a dependent child of that person;

“relative”, in relation to a person who has sustained an injury, includes any person related to the injured person illegitimately or in consequence of adoption;

“responsible officer”, in relation to a civil defence organisation, means any officer of that organisation, who is recognised by the Financial Secretary as a responsible officer for the purposes of the Ordinance and of this Scheme;

“student” means a person who has attained the age of fifteen years but has not attained the age of twenty-four years and who is receiving full time instruction at a university, college, school or other educational establishment;

“war injury” means a physical injury—

(a) caused by—

(i) the discharge of any missile (including liquids and gas); or

(ii) the use of any weapon, explosive or other noxious thing; or

(iii) the doing of any other injurious act;

either by the enemy or in combating the enemy or in repelling an imagined attack by the enemy; or

(b) caused by the impact on any person or property of any enemy aircraft, or any aircraft belonging to, or held by any person on behalf of or for the benefit of, His Majesty or any power allied with His Majesty, or any part of, or anything dropped from, any such aircraft;

“war service injury”, in relation to a civil defence volunteer, means any physical injury which the Financial Secretary certifies to have been shown to his satisfaction to have arisen out of and in the course of the performance by the volunteer of his duties as a member of the civil defence organisation to which he belonged at the time when the injury was sustained, and (except in the case of a war injury) not to have arisen out of and in the course of his employment in any other capacity.

“wife”, in relation to a person who has sustained an injury on any date (in this definition referred to as “the material date”), means a lawful wife of that person; and, in a case where that person has no lawful wife on the material date, includes a woman who for the year immediately preceding the material date cohabited regularly with that person as his wife and was during that year wholly or mainly maintained by that person; and “widow” shall be construed accordingly.

(3) For the purposes of this Scheme, a person shall be treated as being incapable of self-support only if he is suffering from physical or mental infirmity of a permanent or prolonged nature whereby he is rendered incapable of self-support.

(4) For the purposes of this Scheme disablement caused by a qualifying injury or by any two or more qualifying injuries shall be treated as being serious and prolonged if it is assessed and certified under Article 5 of this Scheme as being of a degree of not less than twenty per centum or if it has been so assessed and certified but for any such direct or indirect cause mentioned in paragraph (3) of that Article.

(5) A person who is at any date wholly or mainly maintaining a child or children, or is wholly or mainly contributing to the maintenance of a child or children, may, if the Financial Secretary thinks fit having regard to the circumstances of the case, be treated for the purposes of this Scheme as if he were at that date wholly or mainly maintaining that child or children to a reasonable extent to the support of his wife, as the case may be.

3. It is hereby declared that any organisation established in Ceylon for civil defence purposes which is described or named in the Schedule to this Scheme shall be a civil defence organisation for the purposes of the Ordinance and of this Scheme.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, an award under this Scheme may be made in respect of any injury sustained during the period of the present emergency which—

- (a) is a Class A injury, that is to say, a war service injury sustained by a civil defence volunteer; or
- (b) is a Class B injury, that is to say, a war injury sustained by a gainfully occupied person or by a pensioner; or
- (c) is a Class C injury, that is to say, a war injury (not being a Class A injury or a Class B injury) sustained by a person who either had attained the age of fifteen years at the date of the injury or has attained that age since that date.

5. (1) The degree of disablement caused to a person by a qualifying injury or by any two or more qualifying injuries shall be assessed and certified in accordance with the following provisions of this Article by a medical officer or board of medical officers appointed or recognised by the Financial Secretary for the purpose.

(2) The degree of disablement caused to a person by a qualifying injury or by any two or more qualifying injuries shall be assessed by making a comparison between the condition of disablement which has been caused to that person by that injury, or by the combined effect of those injuries, and the condition of a normal healthy person of the same age and sex without taking into account the earning capacity of the disabled person in his own or in any other specific trade or occupation, and so that the extent to which that condition of disablement has been aggravated by individual factors or extraneous circumstances shall not be included in the degree at which that disablement is assessed.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding provisions of this Article, where a person whose degree of disablement falls to be assessed has been awarded a pension or other grant payable out of public funds (not being a pension awarded under this Scheme) in respect of another disablement suffered by him, that degree of disablement shall be assessed in accordance with any direction which may be given by the Financial Secretary for the purpose of securing that in the assessment thereof account shall be taken of that other disablement in such manner and to such extent as may be specified in the direction.

(4) The degree of disablement assessed under this Article shall be certified by way of a percentage, total disablement being represented by one hundred per centum and a lesser degree of disablement being represented by such lesser percentage as, being a multiple of ten, bears to one hundred per centum the same proportion as that lesser degree of disablement bears to total disablement.

PART II.

Injury Allowances.

6. (1) The provisions of this Part of this Scheme shall have effect for the purpose of enabling the Financial Secretary to make, in accordance with such arrangements as may from time to time appear to him best suited for the purpose, temporary and provisional payments to or in respect of persons who have sustained qualifying injuries

(2) No decision of the Financial Secretary upon an application made under this Part of this Scheme in respect of an injury shall be deemed to prejudice or affect any decision which he may have to make in respect of that injury under Part III of this Scheme.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, where a qualifying injury has incapacitated a person for work for a period of not less than seven consecutive days, that person shall be entitled to be awarded in respect of that injury an allowance (hereinafter referred to as an "injury allowance") in accordance with the following provisions of this Part of this Scheme:

Provided that an injury allowance shall not be awarded in respect of an injury sustained by any person—

- (a) if, at the date of that injury, that person was a member of any of the armed forces of the Crown, or a person employed in the nursing service or other auxiliary service of any of those forces, and was required to give whole time service as such a member or as a person so employed; or

- (b) if, at the date of the injury, that person was a member of any of the armed forces of the Crown, or a person employed in the nursing service or other auxiliary service of those forces, and was not required to give who service as such a member or as a person so employed that injury was directly attributable to such a member or as a person so employed;
- (c) if, at the date of the injury, that person was a member of a Defence Force Corps formed under the Defence Force Ordinance or a member of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force raised and maintained under the Naval Volunteer Ordinance; or
- (d) if an award can be made to that person in respect of that injury under a scheme made under the Pensions (Navy, Army, Air Force and Mercantile Marine) Act, 1939, the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1914, or the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1914 (Session 2) of the Imperial Parliament; or
- (e) if that person sustained that injury in the execution of his duty as a professional member of a fire brigade or as a member of the police force.

8. (1) An injury allowance shall be payable for so long only as the person to whom it has been awarded is incapacitated for work by the injury in respect of which it has been awarded and unless the Financial Secretary in the circumstances of any particular case otherwise determines, shall be payable only in respect of a period which falls within a period of six months computed from the commencement of the first period of incapacity in respect of which a payment of injury allowance in respect of that injury was made.

(2) An injury allowance awarded to a person shall not be payable in respect of any period in respect of which a pension awarded to that person under Article 11 of this Scheme has been or will be paid.

(3) An injury allowance shall be payable monthly or at such other intervals of time as the Financial Secretary may direct.

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Part of this Scheme, an injury allowance awarded to a person shall be payable at whichever of the monthly rates specified in the Table set out at the end of this Article in relation to the class of injury sustained by that person is from time to time appropriate in the case of that person.

(2) Where a person to whom an injury allowance has been awarded—

- (a) in respect of a Class A injury or a Class B injury, is a male person who is not married or a female person, and that person is detained in hospital and was, at the date of the commencement of such detention, maintaining in his home a relative who was then wholly dependent on him; or
- (b) in respect of a Class C injury, is a widow who is detained in hospital and who was, at the date of the commencement of such detention, maintaining in her home a dependent child of hers;

that injury allowance may, so long as that person or widow contributes to a reasonable extent to the support of that relative or child, be paid at the rate which would be appropriate if that person or widow were not in hospital.

(3) Where a male person to whom an injury allowance has been awarded is married and that person—

- (a) has married since the date on which he sustained the injury in respect of which that injury allowance was awarded; or
- (b) was not at that date, or is not, residing with his wife or contributing to a reasonable extent to her support;

that person shall, for the purposes of the foregoing provisions of this Article and of the Table set out at the end thereof, be treated as if he were not married.

(4) Where a person to whom an injury allowance has been awarded has not attained the age of eighteen years, that injury allowance shall, unless he was married at the date on which he sustained the injury in respect of which it was awarded, be payable until he has attained that age at half the rate which would, but for the provisions of this paragraph, be appropriate in his case.

(5) In this Article and in the Table set out at the end thereof, the expression "in hospital" means in hospital as an in-patient for the purpose of receiving treatment for a qualifying injury.

10. (1) Where a person to whom an injury allowance has been awarded in respect of a Class A injury or a Class B injury has a dependent child, the rate of that injury allowance may be increased in respect of that child in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

Increases in injury allowances in respect of dependent children.

(2) The amount by which the injury allowance may be increased in respect of a dependent child shall be five rupees in respect of the first child, three rupees in respect of the second child, and two rupees in respect of each additional child.

(3) Where payment of an injury allowance has once been made at a rate increased in respect of a dependent child, payment of that injury allowance shall continue to be made at that increased rate so long as the child is residing with the person to whom that injury allowance has been awarded or that person contributing to a reasonable extent to the support of the child.

(4) An injury allowance awarded to a female person shall be payable at a rate increased in respect of a dependent child of hers only so long as—

- (a) she is not in receipt of any periodical payment in respect of that child from some individual liable to contribute to the support of that child; and
- (b) where she is a married woman residing with her husband her husband is incapable of self-support or is not less than sixty-five years of age.

PART III.

Pensions and Allowances in respect of Injuries causing Serious and Prolonged Disablement or Death.

11. (1) Where a qualifying injury sustained by a person is causing him serious and prolonged disablement, that person may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury a pension in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

Pensions to disabled persons.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, a pension under this Article in respect of an injury shall be at a monthly rate not exceeding—

- (a) where the degree of disablement caused by that injury is one hundred per centum, the appropriate maximum rate; or
- (b) where the degree of disablement caused by that injury is less than one hundred per centum, the rate which bears to the appropriate maximum rate the same proportion as the degree of disablement caused by that injury bears to one hundred per centum, or the rate of two rupees, whichever is the greater.

(3) Where a person to whom a pension has been or may be awarded under this Article in respect of an injury is a person to whom a pension, or in respect of whom an allowance, is payable out of public funds in respect of the death of any person (not being a pension or allowance payable only in a case of need), the monthly rate of the pension under this Article shall not exceed—

- (a) where the degree of disablement caused by that injury is one hundred per centum, the rate which is arrived at by deducting from the appropriate maximum rate a sum equal to two-thirds of the monthly rate of the pension or allowance payable out of public funds; or
- (b) where the degree of disablement caused by that injury is less than one hundred per centum, the rate which bears to the rate calculated in accordance with paragraph (a) of this paragraph the same proportion as the degree of disablement caused by that injury bears to one hundred per centum:

Provided that where the monthly rate of a pension calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph is less than two rupees, the monthly rate of that pension shall be two rupees.

(4) In this Article, the expression "appropriate maximum rate", in relation to a pension which may be awarded to a person under this Article, means whichever of the monthly rates specified in the Table set out at the end of this Article in relation to the class of injury sustained by that person is from time to time appropriate in the case of that person:

Provided that, for the purposes of that Table—

- (a) where a qualifying injury has been sustained by a person before he has attained the age of fifteen years or at a time when he was a student or an apprentice, that injury shall be treated as if it were a Class B injury, unless that person was, immediately before he sustained the injury, suffering from physical or mental infirmity to such an extent as to preclude the likelihood of his ever being able to earn his own living; and
- (b) a person who was married at the date on which he sustained the qualifying injury in respect of which a pension under this Article is awarded, shall, notwithstanding that he has not attained the age of eighteen years, be treated as if he had attained that age.

Allowances to disabled persons in respect of wives.

12. (1) Where an injury in respect of which a pension may be awarded under the last foregoing Article is a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and the person who sustained that injury has a wife, there may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury an allowance in respect of that wife in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(2) Where the person who sustained the injury is residing with his wife, an allowance under this Article may be awarded to him at a monthly rate not exceeding the sum which bears to the sum of five rupees the same proportion as the degree of disablement caused by that injury bears to one hundred per centum.

(3) Where the person who sustained the injury is not residing with his wife, an allowance under this Article may be awarded to him or to his wife as the Financial Secretary may determine at such rate (not exceeding the rate calculated in accordance with paragraph (2) of this Article) as the Financial Secretary may think fit:

Provided that, unless the Financial Secretary in the special circumstances of any particular case otherwise directs, an allowance shall not be awarded under this paragraph unless the person who sustained the injury is contributing to a reasonable extent to the support of his wife.

Allowances to disabled persons in respect of dependent children.

13. (1) Where an injury in respect of which a pension may be awarded under Article 11 of this Scheme is a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and the person who sustained that injury has a dependent child, that person may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury an allowance in respect of that child in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(2) An allowance under this Article in respect of a dependent child shall be at a monthly rate not exceeding the sum which bears to the appropriate monthly rate specified in the Table set out at the end of this Article the same proportion as the degree of disablement caused by the relevant qualifying injury bears to one hundred per centum.

(3) An allowance under this Article in respect of a dependent child of a married woman residing with her husband shall not be awarded unless her husband is in need and either incapable of self-support or not less than sixty-five years of age.

(4) An allowance under this Article in respect of a dependent child of a woman who is not married or of a married woman who is not residing with her husband shall be reduced by an amount equal to the monthly value of any periodical payments which are received by her from any individual liable to contribute to the support of that child or which it is reasonably practicable for her to obtain from any such individual.

(5) Where the monthly value of the contribution which is being made to the maintenance of a child by a person to whom an allowance in respect of that child has been or may be awarded under this Article is less than the amount of that allowance, the amount of that allowance may be reduced to an amount equal to that monthly value.

Special Temporary allowances to widows of deceased persons.

14. (1) Where a person has died as the direct result of a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and there is a widow of that person (not being a widow who at the date of his death was separated from him), that widow may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury a special temporary monthly allowance not exceeding such amount as may be estimated by the Financial Secretary to be the amount of the probable monthly pension of that widow under Article 15 and of the allowances to that widow in respect of dependent children, if any, under Article 16 of this Scheme.

(2) A special temporary allowance to a widow under this Article—

(a) may be awarded only if the death of the person who sustained the injury takes place before the expiration of six months from the date on which the injury was sustained;

(b) may continue to be paid until the first monthly payment is made of any pension awarded to that widow under Article 15 of this Scheme.

(3) All moneys paid to any widow by way of a special temporary allowance under the preceding provisions of this Article shall be deemed to be paid, by way of such allowance, on account of such pension and allowances as may be awarded to that widow under Articles 15 and 16 of this Scheme and shall be set off against such pension and allowances.

15. (1) Where a person has died as the direct result of a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and there is a widow of that person, that widow may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury a pension at whichever of the monthly rates specified in the Table set out at the end of this Article is appropriate in the case of that widow.

(2) Where at the date of the death of the deceased person his widow was separated from him, a pension may be awarded to her under this Article only—

- (a) if she was entitled to periodical payments from him under an order or decree for maintenance or alimony and was, during the period of six months expiring on the date of his death or during such other period as the Financial Secretary may in any special case determine, either receiving the payments to which she was so entitled or taking reasonable steps to obtain them; or
- (b) in any other case, if the deceased person was during any such period contributing to a reasonable extent to her support;

and the monthly rate of the pension shall be such as the Financial Secretary may determine, being a monthly rate which does not exceed—

- (i) in the case mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, the rate (calculated on a monthly basis) of the periodical payments; or
- (ii) in the case mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, the average monthly amount that the deceased person had been contributing to the support of the widow during any such period as is mentioned in that sub-paragraph;

and does not in any case exceed twelve rupees where the death of the husband was due to a Class A injury or ten rupees where the death of the husband was due to a Class B injury.

(3) For the purposes of this Article, a widow who at the date of the death of her husband was separated from him may be treated as if she were not then separated from him if the separation was, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, caused by his mental instability, being mental instability due to a qualifying injury sustained by him.

16. (1) Where a person has died as the direct result of a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and there is a dependent child of that person residing with or under the control of his widow, being a widow who was on his death eligible for a widow's pension under Article 15 of this Scheme, that widow may be awarded under this Article, in respect of that injury, an allowance in respect of that child in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(2) An allowance under this Article shall be at a monthly rate not exceeding five rupees in respect of the first child, three rupees in respect of the second child, and two rupees in respect of each additional child.

(3) Where the monthly value of the contribution which is being made to the maintenance of a child by a widow to whom an allowance in respect of that child has been or may be awarded under this Article is less than the amount of that allowance, the amount of that allowance may be reduced to an amount equal to that monthly value.

17. Where a person has died as the direct result of a relevant qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and has left a dependent child or dependent children, and a pension under Article 15 of this Scheme is not being paid or applied to or for the benefit of any person as widow of the deceased person, that child or those children jointly may be awarded in respect of that injury the pension under Article 15 and the allowance under Article 16 which might otherwise have been awarded to any person as the widow of the deceased person.

Pensions to widows of deceased persons.

Allowances to widows of deceased persons in respect of dependent children.

Pension to dependent children of deceased person.

Pensions to
parents of
deceased
persons.

18. (1) Where a person has died as the direct result of a qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury, and there is a parent of that person—

- (a) who is in need arising from the fact that he is not less than sixty-five years of age, or, in the case of a female parent, that she is not less than sixty years of age, or from some infirmity or other adverse condition which is not of a temporary character; and
- (b) to whose support that person had been regularly contributing during the year immediately preceding the date of his death, or during such other period as the Financial Secretary may in any special case determine;

that parent may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury a pension in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(2) In determining whether and to what extent a parent is in need, the Financial Secretary shall take into account the amount of the contributions to the support of that parent which the deceased person had been making before his death and which he would, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, have been likely to continue to make if he had not died.

(3) Where an award to a parent may be made under this Article in respect of qualifying injuries sustained by two or more deceased persons—

- (a) one pension only may be awarded under this Article in respect of those injuries; and
- (b) paragraph (2) of this Article shall have effect as if it referred to the contributions of all those deceased persons.

(4) Where the conditions for the award of a pension under this Article are fulfilled in the case of both the parents of a deceased person or of two or more deceased persons, one pension only may be awarded under this Article and that pension may be awarded to whichever of those parents the Financial Secretary may select:

Provided that where those parents are separated a pension may, if the Financial Secretary thinks fit, be awarded to each of them, so, however, that the aggregate monthly rate of those pensions shall not exceed the maximum monthly rate at which a pension under this Article could have been awarded if those parents were not separated.

(5) A pension awarded under this Article shall be at such monthly rate as the Financial Secretary may determine, being a monthly rate which is not more than five rupees for each parent:

Provided that the monthly rate of the pension of any parent determined by the Financial Secretary under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not in any case exceed the amount of the monthly contribution made by the deceased person to the support of that parent.

(6) For the purposes of this Article, a person shall be deemed to be a parent of a deceased person if that deceased person was his illegitimate child or a child whom he had adopted.

Pensions to
dependent
grandchildren,
brothers and
sisters of
deceased
persons.

19. (1) Where a person has died as the direct result of a qualifying Class A injury or Class B injury and there is an orphan grandchild, an orphan brother or an unmarried or widowed sister of that person who is in need and to whose support that person had been regularly contributing during the year immediately preceding the date of his death or during such other period as the Financial Secretary may in any special case determine, that grandchild, brother or sister may be awarded under this Article in respect of that injury a pension at such monthly rate (not exceeding five rupees) as the Financial Secretary may, after taking into consideration the financial resources of that grandchild, brother or sister, consider appropriate in the circumstances of the case:

Provided that—

- (a) where the monthly value of the contribution made by the deceased person to the support of an orphan grandchild, an orphan brother or an unmarried or widowed sister as aforesaid is less than the maximum pension that may be awarded to such grandchild, brother or sister under the preceding provisions of this paragraph, the amount of such pension may be reduced to an amount equal to that monthly value;
- (b) a pension under this Article shall not be awarded in respect of an injury if a pension or allowance under any of the foregoing provisions of this Part of this Scheme is being paid in respect of that injury;
- (c) where more than one pension awarded under this Article in respect of the same injury is being paid, the aggregate rate of those pensions shall not at any one time exceed ten rupees.

(2) Not more than one pension may be paid at the same time under this Article to the same person.

(3) For the purposes of this Article, the principles applicable for the purpose of determining whether a person is a dependent child of its parents shall apply for the purpose of determining whether an orphan grandchild is a grandchild of a deceased person.

(4) In this Article, the expressions "orphan grandchild" and "orphan brother", in relation to a deceased person, mean a grandchild or brother of that person whose parents are both dead, and who has not attained the age of fifteen years:

Provided that a brother of that person who—

- (i) had on the day of the death of the deceased person attained the age of fifteen years and was on that date a person receiving full-time instruction at a school; or
- (ii) is, on the date when he attained the age of fifteen years, a person receiving such instruction;

may be treated, for the purposes of this paragraph, as a brother of that person who has not attained the age of fifteen years until the date on which he ceases to be a person receiving such instruction or the thirty-first day of July next following the day on which he attains the age of fifteen years, whichever is the earlier date.

PART IV.

Grants for Artificial Limbs, &c.

20. (1) The Financial Secretary may, in his discretion, award to any person who has sustained a war service injury or a war injury, a grant of such sum as may, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, be sufficient to enable such person to purchase an artificial limb or surgical or other appliance required by that person as a result of such injury and certified by a medical officer or board of medical officers appointed or recognised by the Financial Secretary to be necessary in the case of that person.

(2) In lieu of a grant of money in a case to which the provision of paragraph (1) of this Article apply, the Financial Secretary may, in his discretion and at the expense of Government, provide the injured person with such artificial limb or surgical or other appliance as may be certified under that paragraph to be necessary in the case of that person.

Grants for purchase of artificial limbs, &c.

PART V.

General Provisions relating to Injury Allowances, Pensions, Allowances and other Grants.

21. Except where the Financial Secretary in any special case otherwise directs, an award under this Scheme in respect of a qualifying injury (not being a Class A injury or a Class B injury) sustained by a person before attaining the age of fifteen years shall not be made unless, within three months from the date on which the injury was sustained, such notice of the fact that he sustained that injury and such other particulars have been given as may be prescribed.

Notice of injuries sustained by children.

22. Except where the Financial Secretary in any special case otherwise directs, an award under this Scheme in respect of an injury shall not be made unless an application for that award is made in the prescribed manner and within the following period, that is to say—

Time limits for applications.

- (a) where the injury is claimed to have incapacitated the injured person for work, a period of three months from the date on which he sustained the injury, or if he was not incapacitated for work by the injury until after that date, the date on which he was first so incapacitated; or
- (b) where the injury is claimed to have caused the injured person serious and prolonged disablement, a period of three months from whichever is the later of the following dates, that is to say—
 - (i) the date on which he sustained the injury;
 - (ii) in a case where the injury necessitated his immediate treatment as an in-patient in hospital, the date of his discharge from such treatment;
 - (iii) in a case where the application is made in respect of an injury (not being a Class A injury or a Class B injury) sustained by him before attaining the age of fifteen years, the date on which he attained that age;
 - (iv) in a case where he was, on the date on which he sustained the injury, a member of the Ceylon Defence Force or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force, and was required to give whole time service as such a member, the date on which he ceased to be such a member; or
- (c) where the application is made in respect of an injury sustained by a person whose death is claimed to have been the direct result of that injury, a period of three months from the date on which the death occurred.

23. Where in connection with an application for an award under this Scheme any medical question arises, that question shall not be determined except upon the certificate of a medical officer or board of medical officers appointed or recognised by the Financial Secretary for the purpose:

Determination of medical questions.

Provided that in a case of serious doubt or difficulty arising on the evidence relating to a medical question, the Financial Secretary may obtain the opinion of one or more of a panel of independent medical experts nominated by the Governor.

24. (1) Where the Financial Secretary is satisfied that a payment has been or will be made under an appropriate provision in respect of an injury (whether resulting in disablement or death), no award of a pension or allowance in respect of that injury shall be made under Part III. of this Scheme and any such award which has been made shall be cancelled.

Provisions for prevention of double payments.

(2) Where periodical payments are being made under an appropriate provision or under this Scheme to or in respect of a person in respect of an injury by whomsoever sustained, the Financial Secretary may take the monthly value of those payments

into account against the amount of any pension or allowance to or in respect of that person which may be or has been awarded under Part III of this Scheme in respect of any other injury (not being an injury sustained by the person who sustained the injury first mentioned in this paragraph), and may, for the purpose of securing that only so much, if any, of that amount as exceeds that value shall be or shall have been paid to or in respect of that person, withhold or cancel the award of that pension or allowance or reduce the amount thereof.

(3) Where—

- (a) periodical payments out of public funds, not being payments under an appropriate provision or under this Scheme, are being made to or in respect of a child; or
- (b) a child is being maintained in any institution wholly or mainly supported out of public funds;

the amount of any pension or allowance which may be or has been awarded under Part III of this Scheme to or in respect of that child as a dependent child may be reduced by an amount equal to the monthly value of those payments or by such amounts as the Financial Secretary may think fit having regard to the fact that the child is being so maintained.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall prevent the Financial Secretary from making an award in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) of Article 11 of this Scheme.

(5) Reference in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article to periodical payments or to a pension or allowance shall not include references to periodical payments or to a pension or allowance payable only in a case of need, and references in those paragraphs to periodical payments made to a person shall include references to any periodical payments which would have been made to that person if they had not been commuted, and to any periodical payments granted to that person and applied for his benefit.

(6) In this Article, the expression "an appropriate provision" means—

- (a) sections 30 and 31 of the Minute on Pensions published by notification dated February 5, 1934, as amended by any subsequent notification;
- (b) section 17 of the Defence Force Ordinance;
- (c) regulation 27 of the regulations under section 10 (2) of the Naval Volunteer Ordinance, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8;332 of November 26, 1937, as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,668 of October 11, 1940.

Provision as to members of regular and volunteer forces.

25. (1) No pension or allowance under Part III and no grant under Part IV of this Scheme shall be awarded in respect of any injury sustained by any member of any of the armed forces of the Crown or any person employed in the nursing service or other auxiliary service of any of those forces who was required to give whole time service as such a member or as a person so employed.

(2) Where a person to or in respect of whom an award may be made under this Scheme was, at the date on which he sustained the injury in respect of which the award may be made, a member of the Ceylon Defence Force or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force, and was required to give whole time service as such a member, no pension or allowance awarded under this Scheme in respect of that injury shall be paid—

- (a) where the injury is causing him serious and prolonged disablement, in respect of any period during which he continues to be such a member; or
- (b) where his death is the direct result of the injury, in respect of any period during which any allowances are paid under any written law by reason of the fact that he was a member of the Ceylon Defence Force or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force:

Provided that where the aggregate amount of any pension and allowances in respect of dependent children which might, but for the foregoing provisions of this Article, have been paid under this Scheme in respect of the period mentioned in paragraph (b) of this Article are in excess of the aggregate amount of those allowances, an amount equal to that excess may be paid.

Provision as to negligence or misconduct.

26. Where an injury, or where incapacity for work, disablement or death arising from an injury, is attributable to the serious negligence or misconduct of the person sustaining the injury, the Financial Secretary may withhold or cancel any award which may be or has been made under this Scheme in respect of that injury, or may reduce the amount thereof.

Injuries sustained outside Ceylon.

27. An award under this Scheme shall not be made in respect of an injury sustained outside Ceylon by—

- (a) a person ordinarily resident outside Ceylon; or
- (b) a person ordinarily resident in Ceylon while absent from Ceylon for personal, domestic, or pleasure purposes:

Provided that nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall preclude the making of an award under this Scheme in respect of—

- (i) a Class A injury; or
- (ii) a war injury sustained by a person ordinarily resident in Ceylon while travelling by sea or by air between any place in Ceylon and any other place in Ceylon.

28. The Financial Secretary may withhold or cancel an award of an injury allowance, pension, allowance or grant under this Scheme if he is satisfied that the person to or in respect of whom the injury allowance, pension, allowance or grant may be or has been awarded is or has become ordinarily resident outside Ceylon.
- Persons ordinarily resident outside Ceylon.
29. Where on an application for the award of a pension or allowance under Part III of this Scheme the death of a person is claimed to be the direct result of an injury, no award shall be made on that application in respect of that injury if it was sustained more than seven years before the date of the death of that person.
- Provision as to awards on death.
30. (1) Where a person to or in respect of whom an injury allowance, pension or allowance may be or has been awarded under this Scheme in respect of an injury has received or recovered damages in respect of that injury, or has been paid any sum in settlement or composition of his claim to any such damages, the Financial Secretary may take the monthly value of the whole or such part as the Financial Secretary may think fit of those damages or of that sum into account against the amount of that injury allowance, pension or allowance, and may, for the purpose of securing that only the excess, if any, of that amount over that value shall be or shall have been paid to or in respect of that person, withhold or cancel the award of that injury allowance, pension or allowance or reduce the amount thereof.
- Provisions for taking into account.
- (2) Where a person—
- (a) refuses or neglects to claim or to take or prosecute proceedings to recover, damages in respect of an injury in respect of which an award of an injury allowance, pension or allowance may be or has been made to or in respect of that person; or
- (b) continues proceedings to recover any such damages; or
- (c) accepts any sum in settlement or composition of his claim to any such damages;
- and the Financial Secretary considers that such refusal, neglect, continuance or acceptance is unreasonable, the Financial Secretary may withhold or cancel the award of that injury allowance, pension or allowance or reduce the amount thereof.
31. Where it is certified by a medical officer or board of medical officers appointed or recognised by the Financial Secretary for the purpose that a person who has sustained a qualifying injury should in his own interests undergo medical treatment for that injury, and that person refuses or neglects to undergo that treatment, the Financial Secretary may, if he considers that such refusal or neglect is unreasonable, withhold or cancel any award of any injury allowance, pension or allowance which may be or has been made under this Scheme in respect of that injury, or may reduce the amount of any such award.
- Refusal of medical treatment.
32. Where the Financial Secretary is satisfied in the case of any person to whom a pension or allowance may be or has been awarded under Part III of this Scheme that the payment of a lump sum in lieu of that pension or allowance is justified by the circumstances of the case, the Financial Secretary may award to that person such a lump sum as aforesaid.
- Power to award lump sum.
33. Any pension or allowance under Part III of this Scheme may be awarded provisionally or upon any other basis, and for such period as the Financial Secretary may think fit, and may be paid monthly in advance.
- Making and payment of awards.
34. The Financial Secretary may at any time review any award made by him under this Scheme and, if it appears to him that by reason of any mistake of fact, any change in the condition or circumstances of the person to whom the award was made, or for any other reason whatsoever, it is expedient so to do, he may increase or reduce the rate of any pension or allowance awarded, cancel an award, or make a fresh award, so, however, that no pension or allowance shall be increased to a rate exceeding the appropriate rate specified in the Article under which it was awarded.
- Review of awards
35. Where a person to whom a pension may be or has been awarded under this Scheme in respect of an injury is being maintained in any Government hospital for the purpose of receiving medical treatment for that injury, the Financial Secretary may reduce that pension by such an amount as he may think fit having regard to the fact that that person is being so maintained.
- Provisions as to persons admitted to hospital.
36. Where the Financial Secretary is satisfied that any sum is due to the Crown from a person to or in respect of whom an injury allowance, pension or allowance has been awarded under this Scheme or that any overpayment has been made to or in respect of any such person by the Crown, the Financial Secretary may deduct from that injury allowance, pension or allowance such amounts and at such times as he may think fit in respect of that sum or overpayment and may apply the amounts so deducted in or towards paying or repaying that sum or overpayment.
- Payment of Crown debt out of pensions, &c.

Administration of pensions and allowances.

37. (1) Any injury allowance, pension or allowance, or any lump sum in lieu thereof, awarded under this Scheme may be administered in accordance with the following provisions of this Article if the person to or in respect of whom it has been awarded—

- (a) has not attained the age of twenty-one years; or
- (b) is, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, suffering from mental infirmity to such an extent as to be incapable of managing his own affairs; or
- (c) is being maintained in a Government hospital; or
- (d) is a person in whose case an injury allowance, pension or allowance can be forfeited or has been restored under Article 38 of this Scheme;

or if in any other case the Financial Secretary considers that it is in the interests of that person that it should be so administered.

(2) Any injury allowance, pension, allowance or lump sum awarded to or in respect of any person which is being administered under this Article may, as to the whole or such part thereof as the Financial Secretary thinks fit and at such times as he thinks fit, be paid or applied by the Financial Secretary to or for the benefit of that person, or to or for the benefit of the wife or husband or any child or dependant of that person, or be paid by the Financial Secretary to any person whom he considers to be the fit and proper person so to pay or apply the whole or any part of that injury allowance, pension, allowance or lump sum.

(3) Where part of an injury allowance, pension or allowance which has been administered under this Article has not, when that injury allowance, pension or allowance ceases to be so administered, been paid or applied, payment in respect of that part may be made either in a lump sum or by instalments of such amounts and at such intervals as the Financial Secretary thinks fit, so, however, that the lump sum or the aggregate of the instalments, as the case may be, shall not exceed the sum of five hundred rupees.

Forfeiture of pensions and restoration of forfeited pensions, &c.

38. (1) Where a person to or in respect of whom an injury allowance, pension or allowance may be or has been awarded under this Scheme—

- (a) is, in pursuance of a sentence or order of a court upon his being found guilty of an offence, serving a term of imprisonment or undergoing preventive detention or detained in a Training School or certified industrial school, reformatory, approved home or similar institution; or
- (b) is an enemy alien who, as such, has been interned or detained, or has been deported from Ceylon; or
- (c) is a person who under the Aliens Registration Ordinance, the Passports Ordinance, the Defence Regulations, or any other written law, is detained or has been deported from, required to leave or prohibited from entering, Ceylon;

the Financial Secretary may withhold the award of that injury allowance, pension or allowance or, if that injury allowance, pension or allowance has been awarded, may direct that that injury allowance, pension or allowance shall be forfeited as from such date (including any past date) as the Financial Secretary may think fit.

(2) Where a person to or in respect of whom a pension or allowance may be or has been awarded under Part III of this Scheme in respect of an injury sustained by a person who has died is, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, unworthy of a grant from public funds, the Financial Secretary may withhold the award of that pension or allowance or direct that it shall be forfeited as from such date (including any past date) as the Financial Secretary may think fit.

(3) The Financial Secretary may, in his discretion and upon such terms and as from such date (including any past date) as he thinks fit, restore, either in whole or in part, any injury allowance, pension or allowance forfeited under this Article.

Provisions with respect to failure to obtain payment of pensions, &c.

39. (1) No sum shall be paid under an award made under this Scheme where the person to whom payment thereof might have been made fails to obtain such payment within three months from the date on which he might first have obtained such payment.

(2) Where a person to whom a pension or allowance awarded under Part III of this Scheme may be paid fails to draw that pension or allowance for a continuous period of not less than twelve months, the Financial Secretary shall cancel the award of that pension or allowance, and no payment of the arrears of that pension or allowance shall be made.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Article, where the failure of any person to obtain payment of a sum within three months from the date on which he might first have obtained payment thereof, or to draw a pension or allowance for a continuous period of not less than twelve months, is due to circumstances for which that person cannot in the opinion of the Financial Secretary justly be held responsible, the Financial Secretary may pay that sum or may refrain from cancelling the award of that pension or allowance, or, if he has already cancelled it, may restore that award and may pay the whole or such part as he may think fit of the arrears of any such pension or allowance:

Provided that the amount which may be paid in respect of any sums payment whereof has not been obtained within the aforesaid period of three months or in respect of any such arrears shall not exceed five hundred rupees.

40. Where an award under this Scheme has been made to a female person as being the widow or parent of a deceased person, the award shall cease to have effect on the date on which that widow marries, or on which that parent marries any person other than the male parent of that deceased person, or on which that widow and any person, or that parent and any person other than the male parent of that deceased person, begin to live together as man and wife :

Re-~~marriage~~
widows, &c.

Provided that where an award to the widow of a deceased person ceases to have effect by virtue of this Article and there is a dependent child of that deceased person in respect of whom an allowance has been awarded to the widow, the Financial Secretary may continue the award of that allowance for such period as he may think fit, not exceeding the period for which that allowance could have been paid if that award had not ceased to have effect.

41. Where an award has been made under any Part of this Scheme which could have been made only if some condition specified in that Part of this Scheme were fulfilled, that award shall cease to have effect if and when that condition ceases to be fulfilled.

42. (1) Where a person to whom any payment could have been made under this Scheme before his death dies before that payment is made and the amount so unpaid does not exceed five hundred rupees probate of the will or letters of administration to the estate of the deceased person may be dispensed with, and the amount so unpaid may be paid or distributed to or among the persons appearing to the Financial Secretary to be the persons beneficially entitled to the estate of the deceased person, or to or among any one or more of those persons ; and, in determining the persons to whom or the proportions in which the amount so unpaid shall be paid or distributed, the Financial Secretary may have regard to any payments made or expenses incurred by any such person for or on account of the funeral of the deceased person.

(2) Where a deceased person has died intestate and he was, or any child of his was or is, illegitimate, that deceased person and any such child shall, for the purposes of this Article, be treated as legitimate.

43. (1) Any person to whom a pension or allowance under Part III of this Scheme, or a lump sum in lieu thereof has been awarded and any person to whom payment of that pension, allowance or lump sum is to be made shall, if and when required by the Financial Secretary so to do, subscribe such declaration as the Financial Secretary may from time to time prescribe or direct.

Declarations

(2) Where a declaration is subscribed under paragraph (1) of this Article by a person who is not the person to whom the pension, allowance or lump sum has been awarded, there shall be furnished, if and when required by the Financial Secretary, such certificate as the Financial Secretary may from time to time prescribe or direct.

(3) If such a declaration or certificate as may have been required by the Financial Secretary under this Article to be subscribed or furnished is not subscribed or furnished, payment of the pension, allowance or lump sum shall be withheld until the requirements of the Financial Secretary under this Article have been complied with.

44. Subject to the provisions of the Ordinance, the Financial Secretary may make regulations for the purpose generally of carrying this Scheme into effect, and such regulations may in particular (without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions of this Article) make provision for prescribing—

- (a) the persons by whom, and the form and manner in which, applications for awards of injury allowances, pensions, allowances or grants under this Scheme may be made ;
- (b) the records, documents and other information which must be furnished to the Financial Secretary by applicants in connection with such applications as aforesaid or in connection with any injury allowance, pension, allowance or grant which has been awarded under this Scheme ;
- (c) anything which by this Scheme is to be prescribed.

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, (1) an anicut on the river to divert water to the tank via the existing inlet channel, (2) to raise the existing bund to level 110.5 with top width 5 ft. and $\frac{1}{2}$ down-stream slope, and $1\frac{1}{4}$ up-stream slope, (3) to construct a concrete spill way 100 ft. long at the L.B. end of the bund with crest level at 107.00, and (4) to construct 2 No. 9" dia. controlled pipe sluices up to the estimated cost of Rs. 11,000 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, *110 cubes of earthwork in regrading the inlet channel and strengthening its bund, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

(5) The proprietors further agree to give free of cost all lands necessary for the above improvements.

* If this work has to be carried out by Government the rate including department charges such as overseerage will be Rs. 2 per cube. In the event of total default the total cost to be recovered will be Rs. 220.

THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE.

RULES made by the Governor for the Local Board of Minuwangoda, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 89 of the Local Boards Ordinance (Chapter 196).

Pension Rules—Local Board, Minuwangoda.

1. (a) No officer shall be deemed to have an absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or allowance under these rules, and the Board reserves to itself the power to dismiss an officer without compensation.

(b) No pension, gratuity or retiring allowance shall be granted on retirement to any officer without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions and exceptions hereinafter contained, every officer holding a permanent office in the service of the Board and drawing a salary of not less than Rs. 400 per annum may be granted a pension calculated at the rate of $1/720$ th of the salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service counting for pension, provided that he has completed not less than 120 months' gross service, and provided further that no pension awarded under these rules shall exceed $480/720$ ths of the salary upon which the pension is computed.

(2) If such an officer retires on account of illness or age before completing 120 months' gross service, he may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of $1/12$ th of a month's salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service.

3. Any officer may be required to retire from the service of the Board on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years; but retirement shall be compulsory on his attaining the age of sixty years, unless the Governor decides that his services shall be retained.

4. No pension shall be granted to an officer retiring before he attains the age of fifty-five years unless a Medical Board, consisting of two Medical Practitioners nominated by the Chairman, certifies that the officer is unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or body, and unless he shall have theretofore discharged such duties to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

5. The Chairman may call upon an officer, who is below the limit of age for retirement on pension, to retire from the service on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office. In such a case the Board may by special resolution, subject to the approval of the Governor, grant such retiring allowance or gratuity as is considered just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which the length of service of the officer would qualify him.

6. In the case of the abolition of any pensionable office, the pension or gratuity payable to the officer holding such office will be that which would have been payable to him, had he retired on grounds of ill-health.

7. No pension or gratuity granted under these rules shall be assignable or transferable.

8. (1) The service to be reckoned for pension shall be calculated from the date on which the officer commences to draw salary in respect of his first permanent appointment, whether pensionable or not. Acting service in an office carrying claims to pensions shall, when continuous with permanent employment, count as service for pension, provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office. The service of an officer under sixteen years of age shall not in any case count for pension.

(2) An officer is entitled to reckon as service for pension the whole period of absence on vacation leave, and half the period of absence on leave with half salary. Absence without salary will not count as service for pension.

9. (1) The pension or gratuity awarded to an officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him, at the time of his retirement, in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices, to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached for at least three years, otherwise the pension or gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such officer during the three years next preceding the date of his retirement.

(2) For the purposes of these rules salary will include, in addition to the salary of the permanent office or offices held by him, any allowance voted to him by resolution of the Board as a pensionable allowance, but no other emolument whatsoever.

10. The rates of pension, retiring allowance, and gratuity set forth in these rules shall be granted only in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a deduction may be made from the pension or gratuity, and where the misconduct of an officer has been of a serious nature the pension or gratuity may be entirely withheld.

11. The service in respect of which pensions or gratuities are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous unless interrupted by abolition of office or by temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation. Service prior to a break of service may, however, be allowed to count for pension together with service subsequent to such break, if the whole of the intervening period has been spent in some employment under government or under another statutory Local Authority.

12. If any retired officer in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance is convicted of any offence in any Court in the Island and sentenced to death or to any term of rigorous imprisonment exceeding six months, the payment of such pension or allowance shall be forthwith discontinued unless such retired officer shall within three months of such conviction receive an unconditional pardon, or unless the Board with the approval of the Governor in any case for special reasons otherwise decides.

13. If any retired officer to whom a pension, annuity, or allowance has been granted under these rules becomes a bankrupt, such pension, annuity, or allowance shall forthwith cease; but it shall be lawful for the Board with the approval of the Governor, from time to time during the remainder of such retired officer's life or during such shorter period or periods, whether continuous or otherwise as may be necessary, to pay all or any part of such pension, annuity, or allowance to, or to apply the same for the maintenance and personal support or benefit of such retired officer and his wife and children

jointly or any one or more of them exclusively, as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary or expedient.

14. (1) Every officer who is transferred to a post under Government or under another statutory Local Authority with the approval of the Board, shall be entitled on ultimate retirement to pension for the services rendered to the Board provided that he retires from the latter service in circumstances which would entitle him to pension under those rules. In all such cases the amount contributed by the Board by way of pension shall be based only on the service under the Board and the final salary drawn from the Board.

(2) An officer who has been transferred to the service of the Board from some other employment under Government or under another statutory Local Authority may if he retires from the service of the Board after completing ten years' public service in all, but before completing ten years' service under the Board, be awarded, in lieu of a gratuity, an annuity based on service and salary under the Board calculated in the manner prescribed by rule 2 (1).

15. No retired officer may at any time draw from the funds of the Board an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such retired officer at any time in the course of his service under the Board or in such other public service.

16. If any retired officer in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance from the Board returns to the service of the Board, he may be allowed to retain his pension or retiring allowance during the period of his re-employment in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement no award whatever under those rules; or he may be required to forego the pension or retiring allowance then drawn by him, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement a pension or retiring allowance based on his aggregate service and the highest salary drawn by him at any time during that service. The Chairman shall have the power to decide according to the circumstances of each case the terms on which a retired officer of the Board may be re-employed.

17. In the event of any officer (whether in a pensionable or non-pensionable office or on daily pay) dying while in the service of the Board, it shall be competent to the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, to grant to such person as the Board may approve for the benefit of the widow or next-of-kin of such officer, a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay and an additional gratuity equivalent to one month's pay for each child.

18. If any case not covered by these rules shall arise which in the opinion of the Board merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report setting out the circumstances of such case together with the recommendation of the Board, shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Controller of Establishments, General Treasury, to the Governor for his decision as to the nature and the amount of compensation, if any, that may be awarded.

THE INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES (CONCILIATION) ORDINANCE.

IN terms of section 8 of the Industrial Disputes (Conciliation) Ordinance, (Ch. 110), it is hereby notified for general information that Mr. H. E. Stone, General Manager, Messrs. Colombo Gas and Water Co., Ltd., the representative of the employers, has intimated by his letter dated March 17, 1942, that he has accepted the recommendations for a settlement which were published in *Gazette* No. 8,872 of February 2, 1942; as Mr. P. H. W. de Silva, President, All Ceylon Industrial and General Workers Union, the representative of the workers, Messrs. Colombo Gas and Water Co., Ltd., has failed to state in writing to the Controller as required by section 7 (2) of the Ordinance whether he accepts or rejects the recommendations for a settlement, he is deemed under section 7 (4) of the Ordinance to have accepted the said recommendations for a settlement on behalf of the workers.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Edward Trevor Dyson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kandy District, do by this Order:—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon, and the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brand specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold (by wholesale or by retail) within the areas specified in column 5 of the Schedule;
- (ii) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any kerosene oil of the brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order at any premises within the areas specified in column 5 shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (iii) direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;
- (iv) direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil on demand a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) The brand of the kerosene oil sold;
 - (b) The quantity of kerosene oil sold;
 - (c) The price paid; and
 - (d) The date of sale;
- (v) direct that for the purposes on this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6th) of an Imperial gallon.

CURRY STUFFS.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John Radley Walters, Deputy Controller of Prices, Badulla District, do by this Order:—

- (1) rescind section (iii.) of my order relating to curry stuffs dated January 4, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,845 of January 9, 1942, so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;

- (2) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo increased by the amount specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the said Schedule, as the maximum retail price above which any article of that description and grade shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto;

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 24, 1942, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated January 20, 1942.

Present:—Gate Muhandram N. Canaganayagam, Mayor, Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte, Deputy Mayor, Mr. A. M. Spaar, Mr. V. D. Paul Raj, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille, Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa, Mr. L. B. Mawilmada, Mr. M. A. S. Marikar, Mr. S. A. Wiyatilake, Mr. H. L. Ratwatte, Mr. S. A. Wiyatilake, and the Municipal Commissioner.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meetings held on December 20, 1941, and January 9, 1942, having been previously submitted to the Mayor for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Mayor. Before the Minutes were confirmed, Rs. 50 appearing in item 7 (22) of December 20, 1941, was corrected to read Rs. 55.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1940 to November 30, 1941, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for December, 1941.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1941.
- The reservoir reading for the week ending Friday, January 23, 1942.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies inspected during December, 1941.

4. Petitions—Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte presented a copy of a petition from eating-house and tea kiosk owners protesting against the levy of the new licence fees.

4A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille asked the following questions:—Q.—(1) How many Air Raid Wardens and assistants have so far been selected for this town? A.—At a Conference held at the Town Hall on January 3, 1942, eleven members of Council were selected as A. R. P. Wardens. In view of the regulations published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,843 of January 7, 1942, those selected have not been able to act without an order from the Civil Defence Commissioner. Q.—(2) What steps have so far been taken to expedite Civil Defence Measures and to give necessary instruction to Air Raid Wardens and others associated with them? A.—In reply to certain enquiries made by the Municipal Commissioner the Civil Defence Commissioner states that Kandy is not an area indicated as requiring intensive Air Raid Precautions and it is not considered necessary to establish an A. R. P. Service in Kandy. He proposes, however to forward soon a simple A. R. P. Scheme suitable for Kandy. Q.—(3) Does the Mayor intend to arrange lectures and get leaflets published in Sinhalese, Tamil, and English dealing with explicit instructions relating to precautionary measures? A.—Leaflets for general distribution were applied for. I am awaiting the simple Air Raid Precautions Scheme referred to above. Q.—(4) Have any steps been taken so far to dig trenches in suitable places in the town? A.—Instructions have been given to the Works Engineer to dig slit trenches at the Town Hall premises and Market square to serve as the models to be copied by members of the public. Q.—(5) Have any proposals been made by the Central Government for the construction of shelters or trenches in this town? A.—No, not so far as I am aware. Q.—(6) In what parts of the town is it proposed to establish First Aid Posts? A.—The Divisional Medical Superintendent, Kandy, is taking steps to establish 16 First Aid Posts at the following places—Main Central Station, Town Hall. *First Aid Posts*.—(1) Maharyawa Railway Station, (2) Siyambalagastonne Government Tamil School, (3) Katugastota Dispensary, (4) Baptist Mission School, Katugastota, (5) St. Paul's School, Kandy, (6) New Municipal Clinic, Buwelkade, (7) Semmary School, Ampitiya, (8) Y. M. C. A., (9) Mowbray School, (10) Girls' High School, Katukolle, (11) Municipal Ayurvedic Dispensary, Katukolle, (12) Government School, Katukolle, (13) Home for the Destitutes, Getambe, (14) St. John's School, Getambe, (15) Post Office, New Peradeniya, (16) Government Outdoor Dispensary, Kandy. Q.—(7) Will steps be taken to train whole time Air Raid Wardens from suitable unemployed people, who might be paid a salary when actually engaged in service? A.—These will depend on the terms of the Scheme which I am expecting from the Civil Defence Commissioner. Q.—(8) How many sirens are there in this town to give "alert signals" and "all clear" signals, and where are they located? A.—Two. One at Gregory road premises No. 10 and the other at the Police Barracks. Q.—(9) Has Government indicated any intention to provide additional operating theatres in Kandy to cope with Air Raid Casualties? A.—The Divisional Medical Superintendent, Kandy, informs me that there are two additional operating theatres and they are not being used for want of equipment.

4B. The Mayor read a letter from Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne declining to function as an Air Raid Warden of the Ward he represents.

5. Notice of Motions.—Nil.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—"This Council is of opinion that the Bogambara Grounds and the reclaimed grounds at Nittawela should be immediately thrown open to the use of such poor citizens of Kandy as desire to cultivate food crops thereon, and that this Council should take immediate steps to call for applicants for that purpose and to set them to the cultivation of these grounds with suitable food crops." Mr. M. A. S. Marikar seconded and asked the mover to amend the motion as follows:—"This Council is of opinion that open spaces other than playgrounds, the Victoria Esplanade including the South African Memorial should be immediately thrown open to the use of such poor citizens of Kandy as desire to cultivate food crops thereon, and that this Council should take immediate steps to call for applicants for that purpose and to set them to the cultivation of these grounds with suitable food crops." Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne agreed. The following spoke on the motion. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille and Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra. The motion was unanimously carried.

6A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved:—"That a section of the unbuilt drains along Peradeniya road from Kingswood College to the main culvert at Getambe be built without delay." Mr. V. D. Paul Raj seconded. Agreed to refer to the Works Committee for report.

6B. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—"Inasmuch as rice and other essential commodities cannot in a crisis be made effectively available to the entire population at reasonable prices and on a fair and equitable basis except through direct governmental distribution, and in view of the fact that the only manner of making rationing effective and of completely preventing profiteering and other forms of exploitation of the poor is by arranging the distribution of such commodities at low prices through public controlled depots, this Council is of opinion that Government should immediately take over the importation of, and the wholesale and retail trade in rice and other essential commodities, and organize the distribution thereof through Government, Municipal, Urban Council and Village Committee depots of the type that have already been set up in Colombo, Kandy, and elsewhere." Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra seconded. The following spoke against the motion: Mr. M. A. S. Marikar and Mr. B. H. Dunuwille. The following spoke for the motion: Mr. V. D. Paul Raj, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne was heard in reply. A division was called. The following voted for the motion:—Messrs. L. B. Mawilmada, S. A. Wiyatilake, H. A. C. Wickremaratne, H. R. U. Premachandra, V. D. Paul Raj, and W. A. B. Soysa.

6. Against the motion:—Messrs. H. L. Ratwatte, A. C. L. Ratwatte, B. H. Dunuwille, M. A. S. Marikar, A. M. Spaar, and the Mayor. With the casting vote of the Mayor the motion was declared lost.

7. (a) To elect five Councillors for each Standing Committee.
The Council went into Committee.
The following Committees were elected by ballot :—
A.—*Law Committee*.—Messrs. B. H. Dunuwille, H. R. U. Premachandra, M. A. S. Marikar, R. S. S. Gunawardana, and S. A. Wijayatillako. Mr. Wijayatillako having declined to serve on the Committee and Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne was elected in his place.
B.—*Public Health, Markets and Sanitation*.—Messrs. V. D. Paul Raj, S. Halim Deen, S. A. Wijayatillake, H. L. Ratwatte, and H. R. U. Premachandra.
C.—*Finance and Establishment*.—Messrs. A. C. L. Ratwatte, A. Morley Spaar, B. H. Dunuwille, L. B. Mawilmada, and S. Halim Doon.
D.—*Municipal Works*.—Messrs. W. A. B. Soysa, A. Morley Spaar, M. A. S. Marikar, H. L. Ratwatte, and L. B. Mawilmada.
E.—*Electricity Committee*.—Messrs. R. S. S. Gunawardana, W. A. B. Soysa, H. A. C. Wickremaratne, V. D. Paul Raj, and S. A. Wijayatillako.

Mr. M. A. S. Marikar proposed a vote of appreciation of the services rendered by Mr. A. Morley Spaar, the retiring Mayor, during the past year. The Mayor seconded. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne opposed the motion. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille was heard in support of the motion. The motion was put to the house and carried. Ten members voting for the motion. Items 8 and 9 considered together.
8. To consider application from Mr. P. B. Senarath Yapa for a Hotel licence to the Firs Hotel, Kandy, with report thereon from the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, and Endorsement from the Government Agent, Central Province.
9. To consider Endorsement dated December 8, 1941, from the Government Agent, Central Province, forwarding for the views of the Excise Advisory Committee letter from the Acting Excise Commissioner addressed to him recommending the extension of the local area of the foreign liquor tavern at Colombo street, Kandy, for 1942-43 by including either side of Colombo street from its junction with Trincomalee street and its junction with Colombo road. Mr. M. A. S. Marikar proposed "In view of the fact that recommendations of this Council have been rejected by the Authorities this Council refuses to make any further recommendations in its capacity as Excise Advisory Committee". Mr. L. B. Mawilmada seconded.—Carried.
10. To consider papers re indebtedness of Mr. G. B. M. Hay, Assistant Municipal Electrical Engineer, with his explanation thereon. The Council went into Committee and decided to refer Mr. Hay's explanation to the Law Committee for inquiry and report.
The Council having resumed adopted the decision made in Committee.
11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Standing Committee on "Finance and Establishment" held on December 20, 1941.*
To consider the following motion moved by Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne.—"As the only effective means of checking profiteering and of ensuring to the people a sufficient supply of goods at reasonable prices is by the provision of public depots where all essential commodities will be available at fixed prices, this Council is of opinion that immediate steps should be taken to set up at least one Municipal Depot in each Ward where all foodstuffs and other essentials are made available to the public in sufficient quantities and at controlled prices. The motion was accepted and referred to the Finance Committee.
Recommend that a vote of Rs. 5,000 be allowed to an advance account and that the Municipal Commissioner be authorised to open check rice stores in suitable areas. Pending sanction of Council the Commissioner is authorised to implement this recommendation. Recommendation adopted.
12. To consider Commissioner's Memorandum dated January 3, 1942, on the subject of recruitment of firemen for the Brigade consequent on the Police being unable to spare Policemen for fire fighting duties. Decided to refer to Finance Committee for report.
13. To consider the Works Engineer's Memorandum regarding measures to be taken in the event of damage to Waterworks, Municipal buildings, &c., by Air Raids. Circulated to members for consideration in terms of Commissioner's Minute of January 5, 1942, to wit—Items A, B, C, D, and F recommended. Item E will have to be modified. Decided to refer it to the relevant Committees.
14. To consider letter from the Municipal Electrical Engineer dated January 5, 1942, forwarding estimate from Mr. B. William for Rs. 656 for dismantling the chimney stack at the Power Station and sanction of Council is required to remove the chimney stack and to incur the expenditure. Decided to refer it to the relevant Committees.
15. To consider letter from the Government Agent, Central Province, stating that the General Officer Commanding has suggested that street lamps round the lake should be extinguished, and asking that steps be taken to have this done. The Council approved of the proposal to bring the area shown in the sketch plan under Part I. of the Lighting Restriction Order.

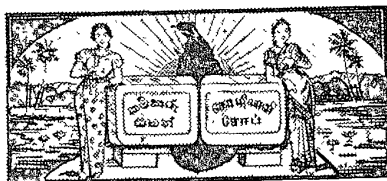

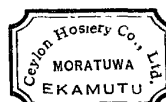

ORDER IN COUNCIL APPLYING ORDERS IN COUNCIL FOR RESTRICTING THE COMMERCE OF JAPAN.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 12th day of December, 1941.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas, by reason of her unprovoked aggression, His Majesty has been compelled to proclaim the existence of a state of war with Japan:

And whereas Japan has carried out attacks against British, United States and other territory without previous warning, either in the form of a declaration of war or of an ultimatum with a conditional declaration of war, in flagrant violation of international law and particularly of Article 1 of the Third Hague Convention relative to the opening of hostilities, to which both Japan and the United Kingdom are parties:

And whereas, after the outbreak of the present war, Japan signed a Treaty of Co-operation and Mutual Assistance with Germany and Italy, dated the 27th day of September, 1940, and has from time to time by her actions and declarations manifested the clear intention of affording Germany and Italy support and assistance in the prosecution of their hostilities against His Majesty

And whereas, on the 11th day of December, 1941, the said Treaty was supplemented by a Treaty of Military Alliance between the three powers, and Japan is accordingly now allied with Germany and Italy in the present war:

And whereas these facts give to His Majesty an unquestionable right of retaliation by applying to the commerce of Japan measures similar to those taken against that of Germany and Italy:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939(a), the 11th day of June, 1940(b), and the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940(c), His Majesty was pleased to direct certain measures to be taken against German and Italian commerce as an act of retaliation against the illegal acts referred to in the said Orders.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Subject to the substitution of the 7th day of December, 1941 for the 4th day of December, 1939, in articles 1 and 2 of the Order in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, the said Order and the Orders in Council dated the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940, shall apply for restricting the commerce of Japan in the same manner as they apply for restricting that of Germany and Italy.

 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of the article sold.

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.

 - (a) the description and grade of article sold;
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale;
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be;
- (7) rescind my order relating to maximum prices of sugar, flour, potatoes, currystuffs and pulses dated December 22, 1941, and published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,839 of December 31, 1941, in so far as it relates to maximum prices of sugar, potatoes, currystuffs and pulses and my order relating to maximum prices of flour dated January 3, 1942, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,845 of January 9, 1942.
