## Order under Regulation 41 (2).

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 41 (2) of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caklecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order delegate to the Minister for Agriculture and Lands the power to issue directions under paragraph (1) of that regulation in the manner specified in sub-paragraph (b) of that paragraph in relation to any agricultural land, other than an estate to which the Food Production (Estates) Order, 1942, applies.

## Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria

ORDER IN COUNCIL APPLYING ORDERS IN COUNCIL FOR  
RESTRICTING THE COMMERCE OF FINLAND, HUNGARY,

ROUMANIA AND BULGARIA.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of January, 1942.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas a state of war exists between His Majesty and Finland, Hungary Roumania and Bulgaria, who are conducting the war against His Majesty as allies of Germany and Italy :

And whereas Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria, by associating themselves with Germany and Italy in the present war, have made themselves parties to the method of waging war adopted by Germany and Italy, and share in any advantages derived therefrom :

And whereas the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria is, equally with that of Germany and Italy, employed to further the common cause of the enemies of His Majesty :

And whereas these facts give to His Majesty an unquestionable right to apply to the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria measures similar to those taken against that of Germany and Italy :

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939(a), the 11th day of June, 1940(b), and the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940(c), His Majesty was pleased to direct certain measures to be taken against German and Italian commerce as an act of retaliation against the illegal acts referred to in the said Orders :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

Subject to the substitution, in the case of Finland, Hungary and Roumania, of the 6th day of December, 1941, and, in the case of Bulgaria, of the 13th day of December, 1941, for the 4th day of December, 1939, in articles 1 and 2 of the Order in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, the said Order and the Orders in Council dated the 17th and 31st days of July, 1940, shall apply for restricting the commerce of Finland, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria in the same manner as they apply for restricting that of Germany and Italy.

## THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

IT is hereby notified that information has been received by telegraph from the Secretary of State for the Colonies :—

- (a) that the ships specified in Schedule A hereunder have been included in the Statutory List of ships owned by persons or firms who are enemies or deemed to be enemies for the purpose of the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939 ; and
- (b) that the ship specified in Schedule B hereunder have been included in the list of ships which shippers and charterers would in their own interests find it advisable to avoid in connection with any business transaction whatsoever.

- (v.) direct that every trader who sells any preserved milk or milk food specified in Schedules 1 and 2 hereto shall give the purchaser of such preserved milk or milk food a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of sale;
  - (b) the quantity sold;
  - (c) the description and name of the brand of preserved milk or of milk food sold;
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
  - (e) the price paid for the quantity sold.

## Notice of Applications for Licences for Omnibuses and Lorries for 1942.

IN terms of section 46 (1) (b) of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, as amended by Ordinance No. 38 of 1939, a notice of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the year 1942 is published below for general information:—

Provisions of section 46 (2) (a) and (b) and of section 46 (4) of the Motor Car Ordinance apply to objections against the issue of licences. The objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him NOT LATER THAN 2 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22, 1942.

Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail. If the objection is in respect of any application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry "under construction", the serial number given to the application in the list must be quoted.

## KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 28, 1942, at 8.55 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated February 24, 1942.

Present:—Gate Muhandiram N. Canaganayagam, Mayor; Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte, Deputy Mayor; Mr. A. M. Spaar; Mr. V. D. Paul Raj; Mr. B. H. Dunuwille; Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra; Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. L. B. Mavilmada; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Mr. S. Halim Deen; Mr. H. L. Ratwatte; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake, and the Municipal Commissioner.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on January 24, 1942, having been previously submitted to the Mayor for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Mayor.

Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake with the permission of the House moved that a vote of congratulation be passed and sent to the Hon. Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, who was recently elected Minister of Health, in view of the long association Mr. de Silva had with this Council and the keen interest he had taken in the welfare of the Town. The Mayor in seconding associated himself with all that the mover had said and stated that he would convey it to Mr. de Silva and have it recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

The motion was unanimously carried.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1940 to December 31, 1941, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to January, 1942.

(c) Health Officer's report for January, 1942.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of January, 1942.

(e) The Reservoir reading for the week ending February 27, 1942.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Report by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies inspected during January, 1942, report of the Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary for December, 1941, and January, 1942, and the Minutes of the Public Assistance Committee held on January 16, 1942.

4. Petitions.—Mr. M. A. S. Marikar presented a petition from the Kandy Municipal Workers' Union for an immediate increase of their wages.

4A. Notice of Motions.—Nil.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake asked:—Q.—(1) Will the Mayor be pleased to state what steps have been taken to give effect to the resolution of this Council to give out on lease all Municipal land suitable for agricultural purposes? A.—All lands suitable for agricultural purposes were inspected and were given out on lease. Q.—(2) Has a list of such lands been made and how many applications have so far been received and dealt with? A.—Yes. 56 applications were received. 44 applicants were given lands. Q.—(3) What is the approximate extent of the land available and what extent of land has so far been given out? A.—Land available is 9 A. 2 R. 34 P. and extent given out is 9 A. 2 R. 34 P.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. B. H. Dunuwille asked:—Q.—(1) Are there any departmental regulations governing the sale to the public of Municipal timber and earth? A.—Yes. Q.—(2) Are they ordinarily sold by public auction? A.—Yes. Q.—(3) Is it true that several giant branches on roadside trees on Galaha road were cut down on January 27, 1942, to extend the electric main to the Railway level crossing? A.—Certain branches overhanging the road were felled to extend the electric main. Q.—(4) Is it true that on January 29, 1942, timber to the value of Rs. 20 was dragged by an elephant to a neighbouring bungalow? A.—The Municipal Electrical Engineer states that the men of his department did not observe timber to the value of Rs. 20 being dragged by an elephant to a neighbouring bungalow. Q.—(5) Who was responsible for the disposal of this timber by private sale? To whom was it sold and for how much? A.—The timber was not the property of the Council. The Municipal Electrical Engineer reports that the timber was claimed by the Public Works Department Overseer and the Postmaster. Q.—(6) Was any sum of money for this timber credited to Municipal funds, and, if so, how much, and on what date? A.—Does not arise?

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake moved:—(1) That this Council do request Government to suspend the operation of the Shops Act in respect of all Rice and Sundry Goods boutiques during the duration of rice-rationing. Mr. V. D. Paul Raj seconded. Mr. L. B. Mavilmada and Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne spoke on the motion. The motion was put to the House and carried unanimously.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake moved:—(2) That the Works Engineer be requested to submit an estimate for cleaning all the wells in the residential areas of the Town to make them suitable for use at a time of emergency. This was withdrawn in view of a statement made by the Mayor regarding the steps already taken for cleaning wells.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake moved:—(3) In view of the extreme urgency for intensive Food Production, I move that this Council do order the Sanitary Inspectors in charge of the village areas in the Town to act as Propaganda Officers for the supervision and encouragement of cultivation of food products in all Municipal and other available lands. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille seconded. Mr. V. D. Paul Raj, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne and the Mayor spoke on the motion. With the leave of the house, the words "as Propaganda Officers" were altered to read as "under the direction of the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency)" and the motion was put to the House and carried unanimously.

6A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved:—That two enclosures be constructed for the convenience of male and female bathers at the "Pathaha" or tank at Bogahawatte in Welata. Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake seconded. Agreed to refer it to the Works and Finance Committees for report.

6B. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—(1) This Council is of opinion that the administration of the entire rationing scheme within the Kandy Municipal limits should be handed over to this Council. Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake seconded. Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte was heard in support of the motion. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille proposed an amendment which fell for want of a seconder. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne was heard in reply. The motion was put to the House and unanimously carried.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved :—(2) In view of the fact that the cost of living index as prepared by Government shows a rise of over 30 per cent., and as the actual rise in the cost of living is in fact much heavier, this Council is of opinion that the pay of all wage-earners in its employ should be immediately raised by at least 30 per cent. Mr. M. A. S. Marikar seconded. It was agreed to refer it to the Finance Committee for report.

Pursuant to notice Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved :—(3) In view of the present food difficulties this Council is of opinion that all wages of its employees should be paid weekly. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille seconded. It was agreed to refer it to the Finance Committee for report.

7. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Public Health, Sanitation and Markets, held on February 14, 1942.*

(1) To consider :—The Commissioner's memo dated January 30, 1942, recommending that the requirements laid down in the Anti-plague Regulations (Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897) in respect of grain and grain boutiques be not enforced during the duration of the war. Recommend that Commissioner's recommendation be adopted and that the rules be relaxed.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishments held on February 14, 1942.*

(2) To obtain sanction of Council to charge a fee of Rs 10 per annum as licence fee for a Glue-making factory. The Health Committee recommends that the fee of Rs. 10 be charged. Recommend that the Health Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(3) To consider :—Memorandum dated January 12, from the Medical Officer of Health making proposals for carrying out the conservancy and scavenging work of the Town by bullock carts, in the event of petrol and kerosoline not being available. The Health Committee recommends (1) a septic tank be constructed behind the Mahayaya Cemetery, (2) that ten conservancy carts be ordered and (3) 15 scavenging carts be ordered. Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be adopted and the following votes be allowed :—For the construction of a septic tank Rs. 15,000; for the construction of 10 conservancy carts Rs. 3,700; for the construction of 15 scavenging carts Rs. 4,500.

(4) To consider :—The licence of Beef Stall No. 58A Public Market having expired on January 1, his brother Madarsa has applied for the transfer of the licence of the stall in his favour. The other members of the late licensee's family have no objection to the transfer. The Account suggests that Madarsa be called upon to pay four months' rent as premium for the transfer and also to obtain a butchers' licence. The Health Committee recommends that the transfer be made on lines suggested by the Accountant. Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(5) To consider :—The report of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon that on October 20 last, 56 head of cattle were exposed for slaughter and as the shed was insufficient to accommodate such a large number of cattle, one animal died of asphyxia. The animal is valued at Rs. 12. The Council's lawyer is of opinion that the butcher who owned the animal has a just claim and should be adequately compensated. A vote of Rs. 12 is required for the purpose. The Health Committee recommends that a vote of Rs. 12 be made to pay compensation to the owner.—Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(6) To consider :—Papers re the Heerassagala road bridge. The contractor having failed to carry out the construction of the bridge within the stipulated time, which expired on June 8 last, and failed to make reasonable and fair progress towards the completion of the work, the Commissioner has informed the contractor that he is instructing the Works Engineer to take possession of the work from January 12, and complete the same. The original tenderers were asked if they would undertake the completion of the remaining items of work. Mr. Q. C. Abeygoonesekera whose tender is the lowest for the remaining work (Rs. 1,500) is prepared to complete the work in 4 months. Sanction is required to entrust the work to him, and to terminate agreement with Martyn & Co. The Works Committee recommends that the Commissioner, in consultation with Mr. A. Morley Spaar, be authorised to enter into a contract for the execution of the remaining work with Mr. Abeygoonesekera or any other contractor on reasonable terms to be agreed upon by them.—Recommended that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(7) To consider :—Papers re drain over 1B and C, Udawatakelle. Sanction of the Council is required to place it last, in order of priority, in the amended list of other drains.—Recommended.

(8) To consider :—Estimate from the Works Engineer for Rs. 990 for widening the road connecting Market streets with Peradeniya road along side the Police Station in order to form an outlet road for the Fire Engine to Peradeniya road. This work was put in hand pending sanction of Council. The Works Committee recommends the widening of the road.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(9) St. John's School, Getambe, was allowed a metered water service in 1934 on the condition that it paid the meter rent of Rs. 1 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed. The Manager of the School wrote in July 1941, suggesting that the Council should allow the supply fee, or on the payment of a nominal charge. The children attending this school are provided with a mid-day meal. The Baptist Mission School at which a mid-day meal is being similarly provided has a daily average attendance of 212 children and is allowed 24,000 gallons of water per quarter. The Works Engineer recommends that St. John's School which has an average daily attendance of 252 should be given a free allowance of 25,000 gallons per quarter. The Works Committee recommends the free allowance of 25,000 gallons per quarter be allowed.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(10) To consider :—Papers re appointment of Mr. Tissa W. de S. Amarasekera as Storekeeper in terms of Municipal Council resolution of June 28, 1941.—Recommends the appointment of Mr. Tissa W. de S. Amarasekera made by the Mayor and Commissioner provided Mr. Amarasekera fulfils the conditions on which he was originally appointed.

(11) To consider :—Applications received for the posts of two part-time playground instructors. The Playgrounds and Bogambara Grounds Committee recommends that No. 8, Mr. A. C. M. Aswer and No. 7, Mr. K. K. W. Perera be appointed.—Recommend that Playgrounds and Bogambara Grounds Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(12) To consider :—Commissioner's memorandum dated January 3, 1942, on the subject of recruitment of firemen for the Fire Brigade consequent on the Police being unable to spare Policemen for fire fighting duties. Recommend that applications be called from those who have passed the 7th Standard in English and the rate of pay to be cents 60 per diem for 3 months during the time of training and thereafter cents 75 per diem rising to Rs. 1.25 per diem by annual increments of cents 5 per diem.

(13) To consider :—Papers re land in Malabar street for Transformer Sub-station. It is necessary to have the land on which the transformer sub-station has been erected in Malabar street surveyed with a view to having it vested in the Council. The Surveyor-General estimates the cost of the survey at Rs. 50. This amount has been remitted in order to expedite survey proceedings, pending sanction of Council. Sanction of Council is required for a supplementary vote of Rs. 50 on this account. Recommended.

(14) To consider :—Papers re leave granted to Mr. B. P. Piyadasa, Switchboard Attendant, Power Station. He has been examined by a Medical Board, which has recommended that he be allowed 12 weeks' leave for institutional treatment at the Kandy Hospital. He has 68 days' lapsed vacation leave available for him. Sanction is required for the leave. Recommended.

(15) To consider :—Papers re the insurance of Municipal Council Motor Vehicles. The General Insurance Co. with whom five of the Council's Motor Vehicles have been insured, are prepared to allow a rebate of Rs. 35.56 on the premium claimed in the event of their being allowed to paint their trade emblem on the vehicles insured with them. There is no objection to the painting of the emblem. Sanction of Council to allow them to do so is required. Recommend that approval be given to paint the trade emblem of the Company on vehicles insured with the said Company.

(16) To consider :—Papers re half-yearly inspection, Kandy Power Station. A supplementary vote of Rs. 300 is required to meet the travelling expenses and inspection fees for half-yearly inspections of lighting schemes, Kandy, by the Government Electrical Undertakings. Recommended.

(17) To consider :—Papers re House Allowance. An enhanced rent allowance is payable to Mr. R. D. Buultjens, Chief Clerk, Works Department from December 27, 1941, consequent to his marriage. A vote of Rs. 81.82 is required for the payment of the enhanced allowance from December 27, to the end of this year. Recommend a vote of Rs. 81.82, be allowed.

(18) To obtain a vote of Rs. 880.49 for increment of salaries. In terms of a decision of Council (M. C. 10 (55) of September 28, 1940) a supplementary vote of Rs. 880.49 is required to pay the following officers who have passed the Efficiency Bar Examination :—

(19) To consider :—Papers re motion moved by Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte for payment of a war allowance to officers drawing salaries between Rs 50 and Rs. 100. Recommend a war allowance of 5 per cent. be given.

(20) To consider :—Commissioner's memo dated January 20, 1942, on the subject of the sale of rice at the Municipal Check Rice Stores.—Tabled. Recommend that these Stores be continued.

(21) The Acting Electrical Engineer, Lighting Schemes, of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings has asked for plans of the transmission and distribution system and detail plans of the system showing pole positions, mains and services in Kandy drawn to scale. The Municipal Electrical Engineer wants the services of a draughtsman for 6 months to attend to this work.—Recommend the employment of a draughtsman for 6 months on a salary of Rs. 40 per mensem.

(22) To consider:—Papers re application of Mr. Rex Goonetilleke, Electrical Fitter, Pumping Station, Peradeniya, for an increase of salary. The Municipal Electrical Engineer recommends an increment of 25 cents per diem.—Recommend an increase of cents 15 per diem as from January 1, 1942.

(23) To consider:—Petition from the stall-holders of the Public Market, Katugastota, asking that a water tap and an electric light be provided in the Market. The water tap has already been fixed. A supplementary vote of Rs. 25 is required for a bracket light.—Recommend a supplementary vote of Rs. 25 for a bracket light.

(24) To consider:—Memorandum from the Fire Brigade Officer dated January 8, 1942, with a list of equipment required.—Recommend that orders be placed immediately for the following:—(1) 1 Tractor motor fire pump, any make, 350 to 500 gallons per minute capacity complete with at least the following:—1 collecting head with 2 or 3 inlet valves to suit Morris instantaneous couplings. 1 screw down hydrant post for ground hydrants made by John Morris & Sons, and to suit Morris instantaneous couplings of 2½ in. 4 lengths suction hose to suit pump. 1 short length of suction for use with above hydrant post. 1 hydrant key and poker. 1 copper strainer for suction. 1 basket strainer for suction. 3 suction spanners. 4 Branch pipes to suit Morris instantaneous couplings with two ½ in. and two ¾ in. nozzles. 4 lengths at least of canvas fire hose 75 feet by 2¼ in. each and fitted with Morris instantaneous couplings. 1 dividing breeching, 1 into 2, to suit Morris instantaneous couplings 2½ in.

2. 40 lengths of canvas hose each 75 feet by 2¼ in. and fitted with Morris instantaneous couplings. If couplings cannot be obtained bound to the 40 lengths, all binding material should be included.

3. 4 stirrup pumps complete with suitable hose to each.

(25) To consider:—Letter from the President, Cattle Breeders' Association of Ceylon, asking permission to use the Bogambara Grounds for their Cattle Show on March 26 and 27, 1942, on a nominal rent.

The Commissioner recommends a rent of Rs 40 for the two days.—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, held on February 14, 1942.*

(26) To consider:—The motion moved by Mr. B. H. Dunuwille: 'That a section of the unbuilt drains along Peradeniya road from Kingswood College to the main culvert at Getambo be built without delay'.—Recommend that this work be undertaken according to the priority list.

*Extracts from the Minutes of a Meeting of the Finance Committee held on February 28, 1942.*

(27) To consider:—The Works Engineer's memorandum regarding measures to be taken in the event of damage to Waterworks, Municipal buildings, &c., by Air Raids. The Works Committee recommends that for item (A)—Protection of the reservoir a vote of Rs. 380, for item (C)—For the supply of chlorinated lake water—a vote of Rs. 425 and for item (E)—Materials for repairs to damages to the Distribution System—a vote of Rs. 10,000 be allowed.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(28) To consider:—Letter from the Municipal Electrical Engineer dated January 5, 1942, forwarding estimate from Mr. B. William for Rs. 656 for dismantling the Chimney Stack at the Power Station and sanction of Council is required to remove the Chimney Stack and to obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 656. The two Committees (Works and Finance) recommend that consideration be deferred and expert opinion be obtained.

The recommendation of the Finance Committee as well as the motion was adopted unanimously.

RICE.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do by this Order—

- (1) rescind my Order dated March 2, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,877 of March 9, 1942, fixing the maximum retail prices of rice;
- (2) fix the prices shown in column 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto as the maximum prices per measure for which rice of the description noted at the head of these columns may be sold within the villages mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (3) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice of any description mentioned at the head of columns 2 and 3 in Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any village in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for rice of that description;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description mentioned at the head of columns 2 and 3 in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells rice of any description mentioned at the head of columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto shall on demand give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold; and
  - (d) the date of the sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (i) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - (ii) "ordinary" shall mean all grades of rice except raw rice.

RICE.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do by this Order—

- (1) rescind my order dated March 2, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,877 of March 9, 1942, in so far as they relate to the maximum wholesale prices of rice fixed in respect of the areas mentioned in column (1) of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price of the rice as follows:—  
The wholesale dealers for the areas mentioned in column (1) of Schedule hereto, shall not sell rice of the description and grade specified in columns (2) and (3) above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in the respective columns of the said Schedule;
- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers for the areas mentioned in column (1) of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of rice for sale and the maximum price of each of them fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of any rice other than raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures;
  - (b) a bag of raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;
  - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - (f) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;

- (g) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
- (h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold by wholesale shall include the container in which such rice is sold;
- (i) "Ordinary" shall mean all grades of rice except Raw Rice.

  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold, and
  - (d) the date of the sale;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 

“measure” shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (6) rescind my Orders dated March 2, 1942, March 13, 1942, and March 21, 1942, relating to prices of rice in Matale District, published in *Government Gazettes* dated March 9, 1942, March 20, 1942, and March 27, 1942, respectively.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Alfred Silva Kohomban-Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices, Matara District, do by this Order:—

- (1) rescind my Order dated March 2, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,877 of March 9, 1942, prescribing the maximum Prices for rice within the Revenue District of Matara;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale Price which is for the time being fixed by me at the Supply Stations increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 or 3 (as the case may be) of the First Schedule hereto as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which rice of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 to 7 of the Second Schedule hereto be the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail, in respectivity, the 6 areas specified in the Third Schedule;
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of Second Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for rice of that description and grade.
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality.
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of rice other than raw rice shall contain not less than 80 out measures;
  - (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;
  - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to 1/32nd part of a bushel;
  - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this order.

- (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer from an Authorised Distributor for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- (f) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part 3 under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
- (g) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part 3 under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
- (h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such rice is sold.
