THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

Regulation.

The War Offences (Remission of Sentence) Regulation, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,887 of March 18, 1942, is hereby amended, in paragraph (2) thereof, by the substitution, for the words "sentenced to a term of imprisonment", of the words "sentenced to a term of simple or rigorous imprisonment".

The amendment made by the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be deemed to have been in force with effect from the seventeenth day of March, 1942, being the date on which the War Offences (Remission of Sentence) Regulation was made by the Governor.

By-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals.

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman, within seven days of its receipt, by the person to whom the schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires, or commences to keep or use, any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year:

Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. By-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals.

Section 47.

1 (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt, by the person to whom the schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year: Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of fifty cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6, on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

By-laws.

1. No person shall establish or hold any private market or fair within the village area, except on an annual licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

2. Every licence to establish or hold a private market or fair shall—

- (1) be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto;
- (2) be subject to the conditions specified therein; and
- (3) expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year.

3. No itinerant vendor shall, on any day on which a licenced private market or fair is held, sell or expose for sale any article in the area lying within a circle having a radius of one mile of such market or fair.

4. By-law 9 of the by-laws published by notification dated October 18, 1929, in *Gazette* No. 7,741 of October 18, 1929, and therein called "Rules", is hereby amended, in so far as it relates to the village area, as follows—

- (1) by the omission of the words "fair, market," wherever those words occur collectively in that by-law, and
- (2) by the omission of paragraph (c).

5. In these by-laws—

- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;
"Committee" means the Potuhera Village Committee;
"village area" means the Potuhera village area.

Conditions.

1. The licensee of the private market or fair shall—

- (1) cause a table of fees leviable at such market or fair to be written in Sinhalese and exhibited thereat in a conspicuous place;
- (2) keep the premises of such market or fair clean, and cause all filth and rubbish found thereon to be so buried or burned as to prevent the breeding of flies or the creation of any other nuisance;
- (3) provide accommodation, within the premises of such market or fair, or in the vicinity thereof, for the parking of vehicles; and
- (4) render assistance to the Chairman, or to any person acting on the written authority of the Chairman, in maintaining order within the premises of such market or fair.

2. The licensee of the private market or fair shall not allow—

- (1) any person to have or expose for sale within the premises of such market or fair any article the sale of which therein has been prohibited by the Committee; and
- (2) any person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous, or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, to occupy any stall, seat, or space, in such market or fair, or to take part in any sale therein, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

3. The licensee of the private market or fair shall not commence to renovate, alter, enlarge, or improve the existing buildings or erect any new buildings, within the premises of such market or fair, until—

- (1) at least three calendar months' notice of the intention to do so has been given in writing to the Chairman,
- (2) a plan showing the proposed renovation, alteration, enlargement, or improvement has been submitted to the Chairman, and
- (3) such plan has been approved by the Committee.

4. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to suspend this licence during the continuance of an epidemic, if such suspension is essential in the interests of public health.

5. On a second or subsequent conviction of the licensee of the private market or fair for a breach of any of the above conditions or of any by-law relating to private markets or fairs, it shall be lawful for the village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel this licence.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Anuradhapura Street Collections Regulations, 1942.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Board" means the Board of Control established by these regulations for the area within the administrative limits of the Anuradhapura Urban Council;

"Charity" means the charitable institution or purpose for the use or benefit of which a collection or sale is held;

"collecting committee" means the body of persons organizing or promoting and conducting or supervising any collection or sale;

"collection" means the collection of money for any charitable or other similar purpose;

"collector" means a person participating in any collection by taking money from the public for the purposes of such collection;

"Fund" means the fund which is or is to be set apart for any charitable or philanthropic purpose and for which a collection or sale is held;

"sale" means a sale of articles held for any charitable or other similar purpose;

"vendor" means a person participating in any sale by selling to the public the article or articles provided for the purposes of such sale.

3. For the purpose of supervising and controlling the collection of money or sale of articles for charitable or other similar purposes in any street or other public place within the administrative limits of the Anuradhapura Urban Council, there shall be a Board of Control, which is hereby established, consisting of—

- (a) the Chairman of the Anuradhapura Urban Council, as Chairman of the Board,
- (b) two persons nominated from time to time by the Anuradhapura Urban Council with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration, and
- (c) two persons nominated from time to time by the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

4. (1) No person shall organize or promote any collection or sale in any street or public place within the administrative limits of the Anuradhapura Urban Council—

- (a) unless he is a member of a collecting committee of not less than three persons appointed with the object of organizing or promoting such collection or sale by any society or association, or by the managing body of any Charity or Fund, or by a representative meeting of the section of the public interested in any charitable purpose or institution; and
- (b) unless such collecting committee has obtained from the Board in the manner hereinafter prescribed, a permit authorizing the collection or sale;

Provided, however, that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit or affect in any other way—

- (i.) any collection taken at an open-air meeting; or
- (n.) the sale of any article in any street or public place in the ordinary course of trade, or for the purpose of earning a livelihood, without any representation being made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

(2) No person who is a member of a collecting committee to which a permit is issued under these regulations shall cause or permit the collection to be taken or the sale to be held otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of the permit

5. Every application for a permit shall—

- (a) be substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule hereto;
- (b) be signed by every member of the collecting committee organizing the collection or sale for which the permit is required;
- (c) be addressed to the Chairman of the Board; and
- (d) be made not later than the first day of the month preceding the month fixed for the collection or sale;

Provided, however, that the Board may in the special circumstances of any case entertain an application notwithstanding that such application is made later than the aforesaid date.

6. Every permit issued by the Board shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The collection shall be taken or the sale held only on the day and between the hours and in the districts, streets or places specified in the permit.
- (2) No person under the age of fourteen years shall be authorised or permitted to act as a collector or vendor.
- (3) Every person authorised to act as a collector or vendor shall, before the hour fixed for the commencement of the collection or sale, be given a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority.

- (4) All boxes or other receptacles in which the collection or the purchase money is to be placed shall be numbered serially and shall be securely closed and sealed in a manner capable of preventing the extraction of money placed therein without breaking the seal, and a record shall be kept of the serial number of each box or receptacle issued to each person who is authorised to act as collector or vendor.
- (5) Every such box or receptacle shall bear prominently displayed thereon—
- the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;
 - the date of the collection or sale ; and
 - the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle.
- (6) No payment shall be made or reward given—
- to any collector or vendor for his services in connection with the collection or sale ; or
 - directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of the collection or sale, unless the name of that person and the nature of the payment or reward have been specified in the application made for the permit.
7. No person shall act as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale—
- if he is under fourteen years of age ; or
 - if he is not the holder of a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority ; or
 - if he knows or has reason to believe that the collection or sale has not been authorised by a permit issued by the Board.
8. No person acting as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale shall—
- carry or use any collecting box or receptacle for money which is not securely closed and sealed and which does not bear prominently displayed thereon—
 - the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;
 - the date of the collection or sale ; and
 - the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle ;
 - carry on the collection or sale on any date, or at any time, or in any district or street or place, other than that specified in the permit issued in that behalf ; or
 - carry on the collection or sale in any part of the carriage-way of any street, or in such manner on any part of the foot-way of a street or in any public place as to cause obstruction or annoyance to any person lawfully using such street or public place ; or
 - use for the purposes of the collection or sale any table exceeding 30 inches in length or 20 inches in width, or use any table in a manner which causes or is likely to cause obstruction to the public ; or
 - keep any animal with him at the place where he is to carry on the collection or sale ; or
 - in the course of the collection or sale importune any person to the annoyance of that person ; or
 - fail to place any money received in the course of the collection or sale in the sealed box or receptacle or one of the sealed boxes or receptacles issued to him for the purpose ; or
 - fail or refuse for any reason after the close of the collection or sale to deliver each of the boxes or receptacles issued to him, with the seals intact, to the person authorised by the collecting committee to take charge of such boxes or receptacles.
9. Every person acting as a collector or vendor shall produce forthwith for inspection, on the demand of any Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector, the written authority issued to him by the collecting committee.
10. (1) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the collecting committee shall—
- cause a statement of the amount received and the expenditure incurred in connection with such collection or sale to be prepared substantially in Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, and to be signed by two of the office-bearers authorised in that behalf by the committee ;
 - cause the statement to be audited by the auditor appointed by the committee, or where there is no such auditor, by a responsible person who is not a member of the committee ; and
 - forward to the Chairman of the Board the original of the statement so audited, together with receipts or vouchers in proof of the items of expenditure set out in the statement.
- (2) In any case where the expenses of a collection or sale are defrayed wholly or in part by any contributions distinct from the amount collected or realized, particulars of such contributions shall be inserted in the statement both under the head "Receipts" and under the head "Expenditure".
11. Every collecting committee shall, if required so to do by the Board, produce proof to the satisfaction of the Board as to the due application of the proceeds of the collection or sale to the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection or sale was conducted.

- (v.) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (vi.) direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of the article sold.

 - (c) the quantity of such Rubber Insulated Cables or Flexible Cords sold;
 - (d) the price paid;
 - (e) the date of the sale;
- (iv.) direct that for the purposes of this Order any sale of any article for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.

Schedule.

1. All service, work or labour of any description whatsoever, rendered or performed by officers or servants in the employment of the Government of Ceylon, in their capacity as such officers or servants, whether the remuneration for such service, work or labour is computed or paid on a daily, weekly or monthly basis, or otherwise.

2. All service, work or labour of any description necessary or required to be done in connexion with the execution or performance of any contract or agreement entered into by any individual, firm business or company with—

- (a) the Government of Ceylon;
- (b) the Imperial Government;
- (c) any department of the Imperial Government;
- (d) any of His Majesty's regular, volunteer or auxiliary Naval, Military or Air forces; or
- (e) any other person acting for or on behalf of any such Government, department or forces.

3. All service, work or labour of any description whatsoever, rendered or performed by persons engaged or employed in, or in connexion with, any of the under-mentioned establishments, institutions, or undertakings, in the course of their business or employment, whether the remuneration in the case of persons employed as aforesaid is computed or paid on a daily, weekly or monthly basis, or otherwise:—

- (a) The Colombo Gas and Water Company, Limited.
- (b) The Ceylon Cold Stores, Limited.
- (c) All Private Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Dispensaries and other similar institutions.
- (d) All lighting, water-supply, drainage, conservancy and scavenging undertakings established or maintained by or under the authority of any Municipal Council, Urban Council, Local Board, Sanitary Board or Village Committee.
- (e) All businesses, establishments, shops or boutiques at or from which food, foodstuffs or articles of food are milled, manufactured, sold, distributed, provided or supplied, whether wholesale or by retail.
- (f) All hotels, restaurants, eating-houses, tea or coffee boutiques and all bakeries and dairies.
- (g) All businesses or undertakings concerned in the production, manufacture, sale or exportation of tea, rubber or plumbago.

4. All service, work or labour of any description rendered or performed by persons engaged or employed in, or in connexion

with, the conveyance of passengers or the carriage of goods for fee or reward in motor cars licensed in that behalf under the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938.

5. Within the limits of the Ports of Colombo, Galle and Trincomalee as defined for the purposes of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185)—

- (a) the loading or unloading of goods, oil or coal in or from any ship or vessel;
- (b) the conveyance of goods, oil or coal to or from any ship or vessel;
- (c) the portage of goods and port equipment;
- (d) the landing, craning, carriage, stacking, storage, delivery, haulage or removal of goods, oil or coal;
- (e) the conveyance by water of passengers and of other persons having business in the port;
- (f) towage;
- (g) the supply to vessels of fuel, water, ships' stores, engineering stores or other necessities; and
- (h) the doing of any work or thing that conduces to the safety or convenience of ships or vessels or that facilitates the shipping or unshipping of goods.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Wholesale Dealers in Food) Regulations, 1942.

2. No wholesale dealer in any article of food shall remove or cause or permit to be removed any quantity of such article from—

- (a) the place where such article is usually kept or stored in the course of his business as such dealer, or
- (b) the place where such article is kept or found on the date on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*.

except under the authority of a permit in writing issued by the proper authority or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as that authority may in his discretion attach to such permit.

3. A proper authority may refuse to issue a permit under regulation 2 for the removal of any article of food if that authority is of opinion that the removal of that article is not necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community.

4. For the purpose of securing compliance with the preceding provisions of these regulations, a proper authority may at any time—

- (a) enter and inspect any premises in the occupation or under the control of any person who he has reason to believe is a wholesale dealer in any article of food;
- (b) by order require any such person to furnish to him within a specified time a return setting out such particulars relating to the stocks of food held by that person as the proper authority may think necessary.

5. (1) In these regulations, "proper authority" means—

- (a) as respects the whole Island, the Civil Defence Commissioner;
- (b) as respects any place in any province, the Government Agent or Additional Government Agent of the Province;
- (c) as respects any place in any district, the Assistant Government Agent of the district.

(2) For the purpose of these regulations, every person who at any time within a period of one month immediately preceding the date on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette* carried on business as a wholesale dealer in any article of food shall be deemed to be a wholesale dealer in that article of food.

6. Nothing in the preceding provisions of these regulations shall apply to a *bona fide* sale of any article of food by any wholesale dealer to a retail dealer, made in the ordinary course of business.
