Tenderers must make their deposits for tender forms and produce receipts before 12 noon on the day preceding the closing date for tenders and obtain the necessary forms. Tender forms will not be issued on the day the tenders close.

6. Alterations and erasures must be initialled by the tenderers otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

7. A cash deposit according to the schedule hereunder will be required to be made at a Kachcheri (other than the Colombo Kachcheri), or at the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish the approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing of the acceptance of the tender, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish cash security according to the schedule hereunder, and to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of the contract; also to furnish with each tender a letter in duplicate signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given engaging to become an additional security for the due performance of the contract. 9. If required, samples must be deposited.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender or the whole of it for any period less than three years.

12. Government reserves the right to supply the requirements of any hospital or Government institution from the stocks of the Marketing Department or otherwise.

13. Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous written sanction of the Tender Board obtained through the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. Sanction will not be given for any transfers including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor should be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

14. The Director of Medical and Sanitary Services may for reasons which appear to him sufficient give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

15. Tenderers, who have not previously held Government contracts, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses, stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and the extent of other interests should also be given.

In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Medical Department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, they should state in which divisions or districts of divisions or districts they held contracts.

## Ceylon Government Railway.

## Recruitment of Underguards.

A competitive examination for recruitment of candidates to the grade of Underguard in the Ceylon Government Railway will be held in Colombo on July 4, 1942.

2. Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they are Ceylonese, i.e.—

- A British subject born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or
- A British subject deemed by the Governor, with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

They must be unmarried, possess good physique and eyesight, and be not less than 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must be able to speak one of the vernacular languages, have passed the Junior School Certificate (English) or higher examination and hold certificates of good conduct and character from responsible persons. No testimonial which is not signed by some one who is himself personally acquainted with the candidate will be considered.

3 A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 23 years of age on July 4, 1942, must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools and affidavits will not be accepted.

4. Candidates will in the first place, be required to appear before a Board of Selection, at their own expense, for a general oral examination as to suitability and for a colloquial test in one of the vernacular languages. Those selected will be required to sit for a written competitive examination in the following subjects:—

- English composition.
- Dictation.
- Arithmetic.
- One of the following:—

Sinhalese,  
Tamil,  
Arabic,  
English (Special Paper).

5. In order to qualify, candidates must obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. of the marks in each of the first three subjects, and the order of merit will be determined taking into account the marks obtained in all the subjects. The number to be selected for appointment on the results of each examination will be at the discretion of the General Manager.

6 The selected candidates will be required to pass medical examination (including a test in eyesight) as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island immediately on selection; also before appointment, if the interval is sufficiently long to warrant such further examination.

7 The General Manager does not undertake to provide the selected candidates with posts immediately, but they will be given appointment as vacancies occur, on two years' probation, on a salary of Rs. 480 per annum rising to Rs 720 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 48.

8 The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934, in the case of new entrants to the Public Service. No rent allowance is payable, unless the candidate holds an appointment under the Ceylon Government and was appointed before June 1, 1934.

9. Applications on the prescribed form, which can be obtained at the General Manager's Office, up to May 14, 1942, must be forwarded to reach the General Manager not later than May 21, 1942. ## COMMON SALT.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Montagu Gybbon-Monypenny, Deputy Controller of Prices, Puttalam-Chilaw Districts, do, by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound above which salt of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the area specified in the Second Schedule hereto;

  - (a) any sale of any quantity of salt for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

- (3) direct that no trader shall sell salt of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or salt of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (4) direct that every trader who at any premises within the area specified in the Second Schedule hereto exposes for sale salt of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of salt of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that salt on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale;
  - (b) the quantity, description, and grade of the salt sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of salt sold; and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (1) rescind my Order dated April 20, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,919 of April 24, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per measure, in so far as it relates to the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description mentioned in the headings of columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the corresponding areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of rice mentioned in the First Schedule hereto ;
- (4) direct that wholesale dealers and authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of rice for sale and maximum prices fixed by this Order ;
- (5) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality ;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorised distributor who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold ;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold ;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold ;
  - (d) the date of sale ;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel ;
  - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
  - (d) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller, under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people ;
  - (e) "Wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller, under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots ;
  - (f) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such rice is sold.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively, the importer's maximum wholesale price per bag, Controller's maximum price per bag, wholesaler's maximum price per bag, retailer's maximum price per bushel, and the retailer's maximum price per measure, above which Broken Raw rice shall not be sold in the area within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts ;

- (ii) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts of the Jaffna District, exposes for sale rice of the above description shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice of that description;
- (iii) direct that no trader of the above description which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior quality;
- (iv) direct that every trader who sells rice of the above description shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which there shall be set out—
- (1) the quantity and description of rice sold;
  - (2) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (3) the date of sale;
  - (4) the nature of the sale, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and
- (v) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
- (a) the importer's maximum wholesale price shall apply to the sale by an importer of Broken Raw Rice to the Food Controller, any Deputy Food Controller, or any Assistant Food Controller;
  - (b) an importer shall mean any person who at any time after July 31, 1941, has cleared in his name any rice through the Customs;
  - (c) the Controller's maximum price shall apply to the sale by the Food Controller or any person acting on his behalf;
  - (d) the wholesaler's maximum price shall apply to the sale of rice by a wholesale dealer to a retail dealer or other person;
  - (e) the retailer's maximum price shall apply to the sale by a retailer for the purpose of consumption or use;
  - (f) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard (cut) quart, dry measure, equivalent to  $1/32$  of a bushel;
  - (g) the retailer's maximum price which may be demanded within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Jaffna (including the Jaffna Urban Council area) and the Sanitary Board areas of Point Pedro and Kayts of the Jaffna District, for a quantity of rice which is less than a bag but not less than one bushel shall be determined by reference to the retailer's maximum price per bushel prescribed by this Order in respect of that area, for rice of that description;
  - (h) a bag of rice shall contain not less than 80 cut measures.
