THE DEFENCE (FINANCE NO. 3) REGULATIONS.

Order under Regulation 1.

IN pursuance of the provisions of regulation 1 of the Defence (Finance No. 3) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this order grant exemption from that regulation in respect of—

- (a) the bringing into Ceylon at any one time, by any person travelling to Ceylon in any ship or aircraft (not being a person employed or engaged in any capacity on board the ship or aircraft), of bank notes to which the aforesaid Regulations apply, if, but only if, the amount of such notes does not exceed ten pounds;
- (b) the bringing into Ceylon, by any person employed or engaged in any capacity on board a ship touching at any port or aircraft landing at any place in Ceylon, of bank notes to which the aforesaid Regulations apply, if, but only if, the amount of such notes does not exceed such amount as may be specified in a certificate issued to him by the Master or Purser of such ship or the person in charge of such aircraft.

The Order under regulation 1 of the aforesaid Regulations published in *Gazette* No. 8,654 of August 22, 1940, is hereby rescinded.

THE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by the Defence Regulations published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,854 of January 29, 1942, in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,887 of March 18, 1942, and by any other Defence Regulation, are hereby further amended, by the substitution, for Regulation 27D, of the following new regulation:—

Looting and kindred offences.

27D. (1) If any person—

- (a) commits theft of any article from premises which have been damaged by war operations or vacated by reason of attack by the enemy or in consequence of any authorised directions given for the purpose of meeting or hindering any actual or apprehended attack by the enemy or of protecting persons and property from the dangers involved in any such attack, or
- (b) commits theft of any article which has been left exposed or unprotected as a consequence of war operations; or
- (c) enters any premises, damages any property, assaults any person, or is found with any offensive weapon or housebreaking instrument, with intent to commit any offence punishable with rigorous imprisonment;

he shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation, and shall, on conviction thereof before the Supreme Court, be liable to suffer death or imprisonment of either description for life, or, on conviction thereof after summary trial before a Magistrate, be liable to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding twelve months.

(2) In this regulation the expression "authorised directions" means any directions given in the exercise of powers conferred by these regulations or given by any officer of His Majesty's forces.

(3) A person sentenced to death after conviction by the Supreme Court of an offence against this regulation shall be dealt with in like manner as persons convicted on indictment of murder.

Cap. 15.

(4) Section 96 of the Penal Code (which relates to the right of private defence of property and prescribes the circumstances in which death or other harm can be caused to a wrongdoer in the exercise of such right) shall have effect as though there were added at the end of that section the following:—

"*Fifthly*—any offence against Regulation 27d of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations."

- (3) fix the amounts specified in columns 3, 5 and 7 of the First Schedule, as the maximum retail price above which any article of the description and grade mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the First Schedule, shall not be sold in the areas referred to at the head of columns 3, 5 and 7 as sections A 1, A 2, and A 3 and set out in sections A 1, A 2, and A 3 respectively of the Second Schedule;
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto, at any premises within the limits of any areas mentioned in sections A 1, A 2, and A 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade;
- (6) direct that where any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto is sold by wholesale or by retail that sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified respectively against the price of each article in columns 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order —
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail; and
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (8) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
 - (b) the quantity of article sold,
 - (c) the date of sale,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail as the case may be.

 - (b) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) "Measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (e) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (f) "Wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (g) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for paddy of any variety which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such paddy is sold.

 (e) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 (f) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 (g) the maximum price fixed by this Order for paddy of any description and grade which is sold by wholesale shall include the container in which such paddy is sold;
 (h) "ordinary" shall mean all grades of paddy.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Alfred Silva Kohomban-Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices, Matara District, do by this Order—

- (1) amend my Order dated April 20, 1942, prescribing the maximum prices for rice within the Revenue District of Matara;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price which is for the time being fixed by me at the Supply Stations increased by the amounts specified in Column 2 or 3 (as the case may be) of the First Schedule hereto as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which rice or paddy of the description and grade specified in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
- (3) fix the prices specified in Columns 1 to 11, of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per measure above which rice or paddy of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail, in respectively, the 10 areas specified in the Third Schedule.
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for rice of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell rice or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice or paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells rice or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice or paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice or paddy sold;
 - (b) the quantity of rice or paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice or paddy sold;
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of paddy or rice (other than raw rice) shall contain not less than 80 cut measures;
 - (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 cut measures;
 - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, equivalent to 1/32 part of a bushel;
 - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice or paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.

 - the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - the date of the sale;
- direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - a bag of paddy shall contain not less than 80 measures;
 - any sale of paddy by the bag shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - any sale of paddy by the measure or half measure shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - "Measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel, and half measure shall be equivalent to one sixty-fourth of a bushel.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

PADDY.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John Radley Walters, Deputy Controller of Prices, Badulla District, do by this Order—

- (1) fix the maximum retail price per measure of paddy as follows:—

The authorized distributors and retail dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell paddy of any description and grade above the maximum retail price per measure specified in column 2 of the said Schedule against the area in which their boutiques or stores are situated;

- (2) direct that every authorized distributor and retail dealer in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the description and grade of paddy for sale and the maximum price fixed by this Order;
- (3) direct that no authorised or retail dealer shall sell paddy of any description and grade which is adulterated with any article or with paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (4) prescribe that every authorised distributor and retail dealer who sells paddy of any description and grade shall give to the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of paddy sold;
 - (b) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (d) the date of sale;

- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) a bag of any paddy shall contain not less than 80 measures and 120 pounds by weight or 112 measures and 168 pounds by weight;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (d) authorised distributor means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III. of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John Radley Walters, Deputy Controller of Prices, Badulla District, do, by this Order—

(1) fix the maximum wholesale price of paddy as follows—

The wholesale dealers for the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall not sell paddy of any description and grade above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in columns 2 and 3 of the said Schedule;

(2) direct that the wholesale dealers for the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the description and grade of paddy for sale and the maximum prices fixed by this Order;

(3) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell paddy of any description and grade which is adulterated with any article or with paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;

(4) direct that when paddy of any description and grade is sold by the bag the maximum wholesale prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the container in which such paddy is sold;

(5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells paddy of any description and grade shall give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the description and grade of paddy sold;
- (b) the quantity of paddy sold;
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
- (d) the date of sale.

(6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) a bag of any paddy shall contain not less than 80 measures and 120 pounds by weight or not less than 112 measures and 168 pounds by weight;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be a standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- (e) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
- (f) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors.

- "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people

- the maximum price, which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag, shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5 of Part III. under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
- "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III. under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
- the maximum prices fixed by this Order for paddy which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such paddy is sold.

 - "Maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
 - "Maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail; and
 - A measure shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
- direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit, in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - the date of the sale;
 - the weight of the quantity sold;
 - the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - the description and grade of the article sold.
