The Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, published in *Gazette* No. 8,628 of June 28, 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended, in the Schedule to that Order, as follows:—

(1) in paragraph 3 of that Schedule, by the substitution, for the word "Dehiowita"; of the following:—

"Dehiowita
Eravur
Erukukulampiddy
Vidattattivu";

and

(2) by the addition, at the end of that Schedule, of the following new paragraph:—

"(11) The whole of the area known as Diyatalawa in Mahapalata korale of the Udakinda division of the Badulla District in the Province of Uva and comprising—

- (a) the Diyatalawa Civil Area as defined by resolution of the State Council under section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199) and shown in the diagram attached to that resolution published in *Gazette* No. 8,251 of October 16, 1936; and
- (b) the areas at Diyatalawa aforesaid, enclosed and occupied by the Military, Naval, Ceylon Defence Force and Survey Camps and shown in the diagram attached to the aforesaid resolution".

THE following amendment to the Public Service Regulations appearing in the Ceylon Government Manual of Procedure (Second Edition) is published for general information:—

Public Service Regulation 83.

To Public Service Regulation 83 add the following:—

All officers who are permitted to remain in service after the age of 55 years are required to give a written undertaking that they will give at least three months' notice to the Heads of their Departments (in the case of Heads of Departments, to the Chief Secretary) before they ultimately retire from the service.

INFORMATION has been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies of the following arrangements for the representation of British interests in enemy-occupied territories.

The German Government have agreed to the Swiss Government representing British, including Dominion, interests in:—

Germany
The Protectorate of Bohemia-Moravia
The General Government of Poland
German-occupied Territories

The Italian Government have agreed similarly as regards:—

Italy
Dalmatia
The Province of Ljubljana
Albania.

As regards Grecco and Italian occupied territory in Yugoslavia, other than Dalmatia and Ljubljana, the Italian Government recognize representation by Switzerland *de facto* but have withheld official approval.

(The above is subject to confirmation.)

(a) as regards Albania
(b) as regards Dominion interests.)

The Roumanian, Hungarian and Bulgarian Governments have agreed similarly as regards Roumania, Hungary, and Bulgaria.

The United States Government remain in charge of British, including Dominion, interests in:—

Tunis
French West Indies
French West Africa
Madagascar.

(i.) The Japanese Government have agreed to the representation by the Argentine Government of British, other than South African, interests in:—

Japan.

(ii.) They have agreed to representation by the Swiss Government of South African interests in Japan.

(iii.) The Japanese Government have agreed to the representation by the Swiss Government of British, including Dominion, interests in:—

Occupied China.

(iv.) The Thai Government have agreed as in (iii.) above as regards Thailand.

(v.) The Vichy Government have agreed as in (iii.) above as regards Indo China.

(vi.) The Japanese Government have refused to allow Allied interests to be represented in:—

Hong Kong
The Philippines.

(vii.) The question of making arrangements for the representation by the Swiss Government of British interests in Manchuria is under consideration.

The Swiss Government are understood to be in charge of British, including Dominion, interests in Denmark, but confirmation is awaited that the Danish Government agree to this. It may however be difficult to obtain express confirmation, although the Swiss Government may still be able to act on a *de facto* basis.

As regards Slovakia it is unlikely that any arrangements can be made owing to the absence of neutral diplomatic or consular representatives.

"Committee" means the Villago Committee of the Mampe-Kosbowa village area;
"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;
"public stand" means a place set apart by the Committee as a place at which omnibuses may be halted or may stand for hire.
- No omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.
- No omnibus shall be parked at any place within a distance of a quarter mile of any public stand established by the Committee.
- No omnibus shall be halted at any place within the village area, other than at a stopping place indicated as such by notice exhibited by the Chairman.
- A fee of one rupee per mensem shall be charged for each permit issued under regulation 2, and shall be paid into the fund of the Committee.
- The driver of any omnibus parked in a public stand shall, when required to do so by a Police officer or a person authorised for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such omnibus under regulation 2.
- Where separate passages for entrance and exit have been provided and indicated by notice or signboard at a public stand, no omnibus shall enter or leave that stand except by the appropriate passage.
- No person other than the driver or the conductor or a bona fide passenger shall remain or be allowed to remain in any omnibus while it is parked in a public stand.
- Every omnibus in a public stand shall be parked in accordance with the orders of the Police officer on duty at the spot.
- No omnibus shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any other omnibus entering or leaving that stand.
- No driver of an omnibus parked in a public stand shall—
(a) start his engine, except for the purpose of changing position or departing from such stand;

(b) sound any warning instrument affixed to that omnibus, except for the purpose of preventing an accident or ensuring the safety of the omnibus or its occupants

12. Every driver or conductor of an omnibus parked in a public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

13. No person shall wash any omnibus while it is parked in a public stand

14. No person shall—

(a) effect any repair to an omnibus parked in a public stand unless such repair is essential for the purpose of removing the omnibus from the stand;

(b) in effecting any such repair, cause any noise which is unnecessary or unreasonable, having regard to the circumstances of the case.

CEYLON GOVERNMENT RAILWAY.

Recruitment of Candidates to Class III. of the Railway Clerical Service.

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the Railway Clerical Service will be held in Colombo on July 11, 1942.

Salary and Conditions of Service.

2. (a) The salary and conditions of service will be those fixed for the lowest grade of the Railway Clerical Service after a decision has been reached on the recommendations of the Select Committee of the State Council appointed to consider the Reports of the Retrenchment Commission, on the structure, salary and conditions of service of the Railway Clerical Service. If any candidates take up duties before a decision has been reached they will receive a provisional salary of Rs. 600 per annum. The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934, in the case of new entrants to the Public Service. No rent allowance is payable, unless the candidate holds an appointment under the Ceylon Government and was appointed before June 1, 1934. Candidates must clearly understand, however, that the salary scale and conditions of service which will be finally applicable to them will be those fixed by Government when a decision has been reached on the recommendations of the Select Committee and that they will have no claims to special consideration on the ground that they have been appointed before a final decision has been reached on their terms of service.

(b) Successful candidates who may have previous non-pensionable or quasi-Government service will not be given incremental credit in respect of such service.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as vacancies occur.

Applications.

4. Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, on forms which may be obtained from his office up to May 29, 1942.

5. (a) Applications must reach the General Manager not later than 12 noon, on June 6, 1942. Applications from candidates not in Railway Service must be accompanied by a Money Order for ten rupees (Rs. 10) in favour of the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway. Stamps will not be accepted.

(b) Subordinate railway employees performing clerical work, who have completed three years' service and whose services have been satisfactory, are eligible for the examination, irrespective of age and educational qualifications and without fee. Their applications for admission to the examination (in the same form as for outside candidates) should be addressed, through the usual channels, to the Heads of their respective Sub-departments or the Divisional Transportation Superintendents, who, in turn, will forward them, together with a statement of such candidates, to the General Manager certifying that they have been three years in service and that their services have been satisfactory.

(c) Subordinate railway employees, possessing the necessary educational qualifications, and within the age limit prescribed, will be admitted to the examination without fee. Their applications should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Sub-Departments or the Divisional Transportation Superintendents in the manner laid down above.

6. The General Manager will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned, and such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the General Manager. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Eligibility.

7. Candidates must be Ceylonese.*

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a), or
- A British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

8. Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—

- The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) examination, or
- The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination and either (i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

9. (i) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 17 nor more than 23 years of age on July 11, 1942, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the General Manager, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Codo for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs,

either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94), and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be obtained from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

Withdrawals and Refunds.

10. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths of the fee.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the General Manager at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1/2 of the fee provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the General Manager at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full fee will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do by this Order:—

(1) fix the maximum wholesale price of paddy as follows:—

The wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall not sell paddy above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in column 2 of the said schedule;

- the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
- "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
- the maximum price fixed by this Order for paddy which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such paddy is sold
