 (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedules 1 and 2 hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per case and the maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of the preserved milk or milk food specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of those Schedules and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of those Schedules shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Coylon;
- (iii.) direct that paragraphs (iii.), (iv.), and (v.) of the Order published in Gazette No. 8,908 of April 10, 1942, shall apply in the case of the preserved milk or milk food of the description named and specified in column 1 of the Schedules hereto as though these paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.
