#### THE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE.

I'm Societies Ordinance.

STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS 1942 No. 482

REPRISALS Thailand

ORDER IN COUNCIL APPLYING ORDERS IN COUNCIL FOR RESTRICTING THE COMMERCE OF THAILAND.

#### At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 5th day of March, 1942. Present:

- THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas, by reason of a declaration of war on the part of Thailand against His Majesty, a state of war exists between His Majesty and Thailand:

And whereas, by reason of the said declaration of war, Thailand is allied with Japan in the present war and associated with Germany and Italy with whom Japan has signed a Treaty of Military Alliance:

And whereas the commerce of Thailand is, equally with that of Germany, Italy and Japan, employed to further the common cause of the enemies of His Majesty:

And whereas these facts give to His Majesty an unquestionable right to apply to the commerce of Thailand measures similar to those taken againstthat of Germany, Italy and Japan:

And whereas, by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November July, 1940 (c), and the 12th day of December, 1941 (d), His Majesty was pleased to direct certain measures to be taken against German, Italian and Japanese commerce as an act of retaliation against the illegal acts referred to in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1941.

THE chief features of the vital statistics of Ceylon for the year 1941 are as follows :-

- (a) The marriage rate, 11.4, is higher than that of the previous
- (b) The birth rate, 36.5, shows an increase over the previous
- year's figure;
  (c) The death rate, 18.8, is the lowest recorded in this century;
  (d) The infant mortality rate, 129, is also the lowest recorded in this century.

#### Population.

The estimated population of the Island on July 1, 1941, was 6,020,000, as against 5,951,000 at mid-year, 1940.

The number of General and Kandyan marriages registered during 1941, was 31,956 (25,168 under the (General) Marriage Registration Ordinance and 6,788 under the Kandyan law), and represented a rate of 11 4 per 1,000 of the non-Muslim population, as against 10 6 in 1940. There were 4,528 Muslim marriages, representing an approximate rate of 22 4 of the Muslim population, as against 20 0 in the propulation. in the previous year.

#### Births.

The number of births registered in 1941 was 219,874 (112,055 males and 107,819 females). The birth rate was 36.5 per 1,000 of the population, as against 35.8 in the previous year. The sex ratio at birth was 1039 males to 1,000 females. In the city of Colombo the birth rate was 45.3, as against 44.7 in the previous iyear. There wero 36,182 births on estimates, as against 32,438 in the previous year.

113,003 deaths (58,173 males and 54,830 females) were registered during the year. The death rate was 18.8 per 1,000 population, as against 20.6 in the previous year. The death rate in the city of Colombo was  $24\cdot 2$  as against  $25\cdot 8$  in the previous year. There were 12,054 deaths on the estates, as against 13,801 in the previous year.

#### Infant Mortality.

There were 28,461 deaths of infants in the first year of life. The infant mortality rate was 129 per 1,000 births, as against 149 in the previous year. The city of Colombo had a rate of 136 and the estates 123, as against 143 and 153 respectively, in the previous
