## Order.

The Controlled Articles (Iron and Steel) Order, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,368 of February 21, 1942, is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 2 of that Order, by the addition, immediately after the item "Expanded Metal", of the following new items:—
  - Welded reinforcement, including B.R.C. fabric
  - Barbed wire
  - Wire netting
  - Iron and Steel pipes and tubes
  - Fittings for iron or steel pipes and tubes (including valves and cocks)
  - Steel wire rope
  - Spring steel
  - Tool steel
  - Tanks of galvanized iron or steel
  - Hoop iron, other than hoop iron of the description used for strapping packages; ;
- (2) in sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of that Order, by the substitution, in the definition of "controlled iron and steel", for the words "declared by paragraph 1", of the words "declared by paragraph 2";
- (3) in paragraph 5 of that Order—
  - (a) by the substitution, in sub-paragraph (1) of that paragraph, for all the words from "sell or supply" to the end of that sub-paragraph, of the following:—
 

"sell or supply to that person, for the purposes of such repair or maintenance, any controlled iron and steel of a value not exceeding one hundred rupees.";

(1) Where any officer of any of His Majesty's forces or any engineer in the employment of any such forces, acting in the course of his duty as such officer or engineer, or any person who is authorised by the Controller to issue certificates for the purposes of this paragraph, delivers to a dealer a certificate to the effect that controlled iron and steel is necessary for the purpose of the execution of urgent progressive repairs (the extent of which cannot be estimated in advance) to any building, bridge, plant, machinery, vehicle, vessel, aircraft, or other work or equipment, the dealer may, notwithstanding anything in the preceding provisions of this Order, sell or supply to that person such quantity of any controlled iron and steel as the dealer may deem reasonable for the purposes of such repairs.

(2) In any case where any dealer sells or supplies any controlled iron or steel upon the delivery to him of a certificate under sub-paragraph (1), the dealer shall forthwith transmit a copy of the certificate to the Controller and shall, upon the completion of the sale or supply, transmit to the Controller a statement setting out the total quantity of controlled iron and steel so sold or supplied.";

- (5) in paragraph 6 of that Order, by the substitution, for the words "two hundred and fifty rupees", wherever those words occur collectively in that paragraph, of the words "one hundred rupees";
- (6) in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 7 of that Order, by the insertion, immediately after the item "Coconut Desiccators", of the following new items:—
  - "Copra Driers
  - Baling Presses"
 and
- (7) in sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 8 of that Order, by the substitution, for the word and figure "paragraph 5 (1)", of the words and figures "paragraph 5 (1) or paragraph 5A".

## Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Iron and Steel) (No. 2) Order, 1942.
2. Each of the articles specified or described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a controlled article within the meaning of Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, for the purposes of the application of the provisions of that Regulation to each such article.
3. (1) In this Order—
  - "Controller" means the Controller of Imports, and includes—
    - (a) any Assistant Controller of Imports,
    - (b) the Purchase and Supply Officer, and
    - (c) any other person acting under the authority of the Controller of Imports;
  - "dealer" means a person who imports any scheduled article into Ceylon for the purposes of trade or carries on any business (whether wholesale or retail) as a seller or supplier of any scheduled article, and includes any person who carries on any such business together with any other business;
  - "permit" means a permit granted by the Controller under this Order;
  - "scheduled article" means any article for the time being specified or described in the Schedule to this Order;
  - "value", in relation to any scheduled article, means the retail price of that article for the time being.
- (2) Where any scheduled article imported or kept by any dealer for the purposes of trade or business is used by that dealer in the execution of any contract for any work of construction, manufacture, repair or maintenance undertaken by him, that scheduled article shall be deemed for the purposes of this Order to be sold or supplied by such dealer to the other party to such contract.

4. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided, no dealer shall on any occasion sell or supply any quantity of any scheduled article of a value exceeding ten rupees to any person, unless that person is the holder of a permit granted by the Controller authorising him to purchase a quantity of that article of such value as may be specified in the permit:

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this sub-paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit or restrict the sale or supply by any dealer of any quantity of any article specified in item 1 or item 2 of the Schedule to this Order in any case where any such article is required for the purposes of any urgent progressive repairs in relation to which a certificate has been delivered to that dealer under paragraph 5A of the Controlled Articles (Iron and Steel) Order, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,868 of February 21, 1942.

(2) Except under the authority of a permit in that behalf granted by the Controller, no dealer shall appropriate to his own use any quantity exceeding ten rupees in value of any scheduled article imported or kept by that dealer for the purposes of trade or business.

5. (1) Every application for a permit shall be made to the Controller in such form as he may provide for the purpose, and shall contain all such particulars as may be required to be set out in such form.

(2) Every application for a permit shall contain a declaration signed by the applicant to the effect that the facts stated in the application are true and correct. Every such declaration shall be free of stamp duty.

(3) The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit to any applicant therefor;
- (b) determine, and specify in the permit, the quantity, value and description of any scheduled article which any such applicant may be authorised to purchase or acquire, or to use, as the case may be.

(4) Every decision or determination of the Controller under the preceding sub-paragraph shall be final.

6. (1) No dealer shall, upon the surrender to him of any permit granted under paragraph 4 (1), sell or supply to the holder of that permit any quantity of any scheduled article of a value exceeding the value specified in the permit in relation to that article.

(2) Where a permit granted to a dealer under paragraph 4 (2) authorises him to appropriate for a purpose specified in the permit any quantity of any scheduled article of a value specified in the permit, that dealer shall not appropriate for that purpose any quantity of that scheduled article of a value exceeding the value so specified.

7. Every dealer shall—

- (a) keep and maintain, in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose, such records, relating to stocks of scheduled articles imported, held, purchased, acquired, sold, used or otherwise disposed of by such dealer, as the Controller may from time to time require for the purposes of this Order;
- (b) furnish to the Controller such returns and information, relating to such stocks and to the importation, purchase, acquisition, use or disposal of such stocks, as the Controller may from time to time require for the purposes of this Order.

- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (7) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out:—
- (a) the description and grade of article sold,
- (b) the quantity of the article sold,
- (c) the date of the sale,

6. The security required from the Grantee of the tavern can be furnished in the form of Promissory Notes of any of the Ceylon Government interest bearing loans (including the interest bearing War loans). These loans carry a higher rate of interest than fixed deposits in banks and the interest is paid half-yearly by Government to the holder. When the rent period is over and the security can be released, the Notes can be tendered by the holder as security for subsequent rents or contracts with Government, or where the holder has no further rents or contracts with Government, the value of the Notes can be realized without loss in the open market. #### Post of Professor of Physiology, Ceylon Medical College.

APPLICATIONS from Ceylonese candidates for training for the above-mentioned post which becomes vacant in 1944 will be received by the Ceylon Medical College Council.

2. The salary scale of the post is Rs. 9,600 per annum rising by 5 annual increments of Rs. 480 and 2 of Rs. 600 to Rs. 13,200 per annum. This scale will not necessarily apply if a candidate already in Government Service is appointed to the post. If such a candidate is appointed to the post his salary will be specially fixed. In the case of any person selected after the date on which any decisions that may be reached on the salary scales proposed in Sessional Paper XVIII. of 1939, and Sessional Paper XII. of 1940, take effect, such new salary scales and conditions of service as may be decided upon in that connection will apply.

3. The Professor of Physiology may be required to undertake the duties of Registrar, Ceylon Medical College, without additional remuneration.

4. Applicants unless already in Government Service must not be less than 30 years of age and preferably not more than 45 years of age. They must hold a registrable medical qualification and a University degree in Physiology approved by the Medical College Council. The Professor of Physiology will be in charge of the teaching of Physiology both theoretical and practical.

5. The selected candidate must be prepared to go abroad for training at a school approved by the Medical College Council, in Great Britain, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India or the United States of America.

The period of training will vary from 1-3 years with the qualifications already possessed by the candidate selected for training. The details of training can only be determined after the candidate for training has been selected. The details will be drawn up by the Medical College Council, in consultation with the University authorities concerned.

The selected candidate, if he is already holding a post in the Public Service, will receive the salary attached to his substantive appointment during the period of his training. If he is not holding a post in the Public Service he will be paid a living allowance at a rate fixed by the Treasury.

The fares of the candidate to and from the selected University will be paid by Government.

The University fees will be paid by Government.

6. The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination as to his fitness to proceed abroad and to undertake the course of training.

7. The selected candidate must enter into an agreement to fulfil the conditions of the Scheme of Training, and thereafter to serve under the Government for five years. He should execute a Bond in favour of Government with a surety.

8. Applications should be addressed to the Registrar, Ceylon Medical College, Colombo, and should reach him not later than June 19, 1942.
