THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for the Kataragama Esala Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1942.

GOVERNOR.*Regulations.*

- In these regulations, "camp area" includes—
 - the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at Kataragama; and
 - the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
- (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1942, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to sixteen days from July 13 to July 28, inclusive.
 - No pilgrim shall arrive before July 13 or stay after July 28 in the camp area.
- The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
- (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power, on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—
 - to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking, and for natural offices;
 - to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
 - to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
 - to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
 - to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.
- (2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).
- No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
- No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
- No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.
- No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorised by him to issue such permits.
- Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.
- No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.
- (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.
 - No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
 - It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer, or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
- (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
 - All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

18. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 (1) of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Order of exemption under that regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,787 of August 29, 1941 (as last amended by the Order published in *Gazette* No. 8,889 of March 20, 1942), as follows—

- (1) in paragraphs (f), (g), (h) and (i) of that Order, by the substitution, for the word and figures "item 12", of the words and figures "items 12 and 62"; and
- (2) by the addition, immediately after paragraph (k) of that Order, of the following new paragraphs—
 - (l) the exportation by or on behalf of the Commissioner of Commodity Purchase, on behalf of the Ministry of Food in the United Kingdom, of any commodity specified in items 57 and 58 of the Schedule.
 - (m) the exportation by or on behalf of the Commissioner of Commodity Purchase, on behalf of the Ministry of Supply in the United Kingdom, of the commodity specified in item 59 of the Schedule.
 - (n) the exportation by or on behalf of the Tea Commissioner, Ceylon, on behalf of the Ministry of Food in the United Kingdom, of the commodity specified in item 62 of the Schedule.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Appointment of Competent Authority.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 3 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby—

- (1) revoke the appointment (notified in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,928 of May 4, 1942) of the Director of Public Works and of each of the Superintending Engineers of the Public Works Department to be competent authorities for the purpose of requisitioning certain articles under Regulation 37 of those Regulations; and
- (2) appoint the Director of Public Works to be a competent authority for the whole Island, and each of the Superintending Engineers of the Public Works Department to be a competent authority within his division, for the purpose of requisitioning, under the aforesaid Regulation 37, any article other than—
 - (a) a ship or any article on board any ship; any aircraft or any article on board any aircraft; rice or other foodstuffs; mechanically propelled vehicles; and tyres, tubes, flaps and spare parts for motor vehicles; medical stores and appliances; ships' stores; steel; or
 - (b) any article or any description of article, not specified in the foregoing sub-paragraph (a), for the requisitioning of which any other officer or person has heretofore been, or may hereafter be, appointed to be a competent authority under the aforesaid Regulation 3.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

(2) The photographs to be taken may include a photograph of the full face, a photograph of the true profile and a full length photograph.

(3) The measurements to be taken may include—

- (a) his height when standing;
(b) the size and relative position of every scar and distinctive mark upon any part of his body; and

(c) the external filament of the fingers and thumbs of both hands—to be taken by pressing them, first upon an ink plate, and then upon paper or cardboard, so as to leave a clear print of the skin surface

3. A photograph of any alien taken in pursuance of the powers conferred by these regulations shall not—

- (a) be published, except for the purpose of tracing him, or
(b) be shown to any person, other than a servant of His Majesty acting in the course of his duty or a person authorised by a servant of His Majesty so acting to see such photograph.

4. Where any alien has been photographed or measured under these Regulations, all photographs (both negatives and copies), finger-print impressions and records of measurements so taken shall, unless he is convicted of any offence specified in the Schedule to these Regulations, be destroyed upon the conclusion of the proceedings taken against him unless the Governor otherwise directs, and in any case as soon as may be after the date on which the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, ceases to be in force.

5. In these regulations, "alien" means any person not being either a British subject or a British protected person.

"Improvements in the treatment of artificial sponges."

Abstract—The inventor states that if artificial sponges made of cellulose derivative such as viscose are subjected to heat and pressure for a short time, their thickness would be considerably reduced without any change in their surface dimensions. These sponges will remain in this compressed state till they are immersed in water, when they will rapidly regain their original dimensions.

The optimum pressure and temperature are 100 lb. per square inch and 90°C respectively, and the time of treatment 30 seconds. Considerable advantages are claimed for this method of treating sponges for packing, transport and display purposes.

"An improved process and a mixing and recovery apparatus for the manufacture of high grade commercial Acetic Acid from either standard grey acetate of lime or sodium acetate."

Abstract—The inventor states that in the usual process of distilling acetic acid from standard grey acetate of lime or sodium acetate, the temperature rises too high on the introduction of sulphuric acid. This results in impurities being given off such as H₂S and SO₂.

His method of overcoming this disadvantage is disclosed in claim (1) which is as follows:—An improved process for the manufacture of high grade commercial acetic acid from either standard grey acetate of lime or sodium acetate consisting in adding and mixing sulphuric acid in the correct chemical proportions with calcium or sodium acetate salts in an apparatus (still) provided with a jacket or cavity for circulating cooling water to prevent a rapid rise of temperature in the mass of salts treated. The sulphuric acid to be fed in correct proportion in a thin stream to the bottom of the still while the mass of salts is agitated with a stirrer. Then distilling the displaced acetic acid by stopping the cooling flow of water and subjecting the static water in the jacket to external heat till it rises to boiling point and then distilling at the constant temperature of boiling water the displaced acetic acid under vacuum and while the mass of salts is agitated with the mixing stirrer.

POTATOES AND ONIONS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (ii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) An "Importer" shall mean any person who in his name has cleared from the Customs any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (d) A "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who has been in the habit of selling for resale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (e) "Importer's Maximum Price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
 - (f) "Maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer; and
 - (g) "Maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (iii.) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (iv.) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (v.) direct that every trader who at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the weight of the quantity sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of the article sold.

KEROSENE OIL.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (i.) revoke my Order dated March 2, 1942, published in Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 3,874 of March 2, 1942, in so far as it relates to the brands of Kerosene Oil mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon, and the maximum price per bottle above which Kerosene Oil of the brand specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold (by wholesale or by retail) within the Municipal limits of Colombo;
- (iii.) direct that when four gallons or any multiple of four gallons of kerosene oil of any description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto are sold in four-gallon tins (within the Municipal limits of Colombo) the maximum price to be charged for the same shall be determined by reference to the appropriate maximum price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto;
- (iv.) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any kerosene oil of the brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order at any premises within the Municipal limits of Colombo shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (v.) direct that no such trader shall sell any Kerosene Oil of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;

(vi.) direct that every trader who sells Kerosene Oil, of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that Kerosene Oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—

- (a) the brand of the Kerosene Oil sold;
- (b) the quantity of Kerosene Oil sold;
- (c) the price paid; and
- (d) the date of sale;

(vii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$) of an Imperial gallon.
