THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for the Kataragama Esala Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1942.

A. CALDECOTT, Governor.

Regulations.

- 1. In these regulations, "camp area" includes-
- (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at
- Kataragama; and
 (b) the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar
 Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
- (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1942, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to sixteen days from July 13 to July 28, inclusive.
 (b) No pilgrim shall arrive before July 13 or stay after July 28

(b) No pilgrim shall arrive before July 15 or seay and July 20 in the camp area.

3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.

4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power, on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—

- march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—

 (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking, and for natural offices;

 (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;

 (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;

 (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;

 (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel

- (2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

 5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of,

at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorised by him to issue such permits.

permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 6 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer, or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remunts of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and b. kept at all times ready for careful by the saintary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shell bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agont to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the man, for in which the pilgrims shad depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or an contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted

Appointment of Competent Authority.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 3 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott. Governor of Ceylon, do hereby—

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

Abstract.—The inventor states that in the usual process of acetate, the temperature rises too high on the introduction of sulphure acid. This results in impurities being given off such as

His method of ovorcoming this disadvantage is disclosed in claim (1) which is as follows:—An improved process for the manufacture of high grade commercial acetic acid from either standard grey acetate of lime or sodium acotate consisting in adding and mixing sulphure acid in the correct chemical proportions with calcium or sodium acetate salts in an apparatus (still) provided with a legist or capture for providing acceleration and the correct of the contract of the contr calcium or sodium acctate salts in an apparatus (still) provided with a jacket or cavity for circulating cooling water to prevent a rapid rise of temperature in the mass of salts treated. The sulphuric acid to be fed in correct proportion in a thin stream to the bottom of the still while the mass of salts is agitated with a stirrer. Then distilling the displaced acetic acid by stopping the cooling flow of water and subjecting the static water in the jacket to external heat till it rises to boiling point and then distilling at the constant temperature of boiling water the displaced acetic acid under vacuum and while the mass of salts is agitated with the mixing stirrers.

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (11.) direct that for the purposes of this Order-

 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

 (d) A "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who has been in the habit of selling for resale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;

 - (c) "Importer's Maximum Price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale
 - (f) "Maximum wholesalo price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer; and (g) "Maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (iii.) direct that no trador shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule heroto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (iv.) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description
- (v.) direct that every trader who at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article, on domand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—

 - (a) the date of the sale;
 (b) the weight of the

- (i.) revoke my Order dated March 2. 1942, published in Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,874 of March 2, 1942, in so far as it relates to the brands of Kerosene Oil mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
 (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon, and the maximum price per bottle above which Kerosene Oil of the brand specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold (by wholesale or by retail) within the Municipal limits of Colombo.
 (iii) direct that when four gallons or any multiple of four gallons of kerosene oil of any description and grade specified in

 (v.) direct that no such trader shall sell any Kerosene Oil of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;

(vi.) direct that every trader who sells Kerosene Oil, of any brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that Kerosene Oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—

(a) the brand of the Kerosene Oil sold;
(b) the quantity of Kerosene Oil sold;
(c) the price paid; and
(d) the date of sale;

(vii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1th) of an Imperial gallon.
