GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS the Yangtze Insurance Association, Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), functioning in Ceylon through its duly appointed Agents, Messrs. Aitken, Spence & Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the Agents"), is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939:

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations:

And whereas by paragraph (1) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that any person who trades with the enemy within the meaning of those Regulations shall be guilty of an offence:

And whereas by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that a person shall not be deemed to have traded with the enemy by reason only that he has done anything under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas prior to the date on which the Company became an enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations, the Company, through the Agents, carried on the business of fire and marine insurance in Ceylon and did other business arising out of or in connexion with such fire and marine insurance business with persons resident in Ceylon:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Agents and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, do hereby authorize the Agents to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the Company and do, further, authorize persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company through the Agents in Ceylon.

THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 OF 1939.

Order under Section 6.

Gorokgahamada Electoral Division (No. 1).

North—From a central point at Balagahamada junction eastwards along the centre line of Mahawalatenne road till it meets the footpath and thence northwards and eastwards along the centre line of the said footpath till it meets the centre of the Edanda across Dorawel-oya.

East—From the last mentioned point south-eastwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets its southern extremity.

South—From the last mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of Ratnapura-Balangoda road.

West—From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre line of the Ratnapura-Balangoda road till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Kotugodella Electoral Division (No. 2).

North: From a point at the centre of Dorawel-oya where it crosses the western limit of the Urban Council area, north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Dorawel-oya till it meets the centre of the bridge across the said Dorawel-oya.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the old road till it meets the centre of the Church road, thence eastwards along the centre line of the said Church road till it meets the centre of the Ratnapura-Balangoda road at the junction, thence southwards along the centre line of the Ratnapura-Balangoda road and western limit of Division No. 1 till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets its western extremity.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Balagamulla Electoral Division (No. 3).

North: From a point on the old road at the junction of the Resthouse approach road eastwards along the centre line of the said Resthouse approach road till it meets the centre of the Ratnapura-Balangoda road crossing the said road along the centre line of the masonry drain till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area, thence along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the northerly point of the bend of Dorawel-oya.

East: From the last mentioned point south-eastwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 1.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards and southwards along the northern limit of Division No. 1, and eastern limit of Division No. 2 till it meets the centre of old road.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 2 till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Bazaar Electoral Division (No. 4).

North: From the north-eastern corner of Division No. 2 eastwards along the centre line of Dorawel-oya till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area, thence eastwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the bend of Dorawel-oya.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards and eastwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 3.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of the Division No. 3 till it meets the eastern limit of Division No. 2.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of the Division No. 2 till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Thumbagoda Electoral Division (No. 5).

North: From a point at the centre of the Public Works Department road from Rassagala at the northern extremity of the western limit of the Urban Council area, south-eastwards along the northern limit of Urban Council area and along the centre line of the said Public Works Department road till it meets a point about 10 chains to the north of the junction where it meets the Main road.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the Public Works Department road and the Main road till it meets the northern extremity of the eastern limit of Division No. 2.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Division No. 2 and the western limit of the Urban Council area up to a point about 10 chains from Dorawel-oya.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards and north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Kirindigala Electoral Division (No. 6).

North: From the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 98 in Final Village plan No. 471 eastwards along the northern limit of Urban Council area till it meets its eastern extremity.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the Balangoda-Haputale road.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards and south westwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the western extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 4.

QUARTERLY EXAMINATION FOR CIVIL SERVANTS AND OTHER PUBLIC OFFICERS.

The examination for officers in the Police Force and the Forest Department, and the *viva voce* examination in the vernaculars for officers in the Public Works Department, the Survey Department, the Post and Telegraph Department, the Department of Agriculture, the Irrigation Department, the Railway Department, the Harbour Engineer's Department (Colombo Port Commission), and the Department of Electrical Undertakings, will be held at the same time and place.

Candidates are required to send in their applications to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments, so as to reach the Education Office, Colombo, not later than June 30, 1942. Candidates should write their full names legibly on the application and give full particulars of the examinations for which they are entering and the subjects they are offering.

Officers in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking Sinhalese or Tamil. Civil Service candidates offering Sinhalese or Tamil at the Second Examination should state whether they are entering for the Lower Paper or the Higher Paper.

Customs Notification (Tariff) No. 42/5.

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE.

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance passed by the State Council at its public session on May 19, 1942, and sanctioned by the Governor has been submitted to and sanctioned by the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

This Council resolves under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance that, with effect from the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*, import duty upon the goods specified in Column I. of the Schedule to this resolution shall be levied and paid at the corresponding rates severally specified in Column III. of that Schedule:

Provided that preferential import duty at the corresponding rates, if any, prescribed in Column II. of the Schedule shall be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, Burma, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and Protected States, or the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate.

(vi.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—

- (a) the Controller's maximum price shall apply to the sale by the Food Controller or any person acting on his behalf;
- (b) the wholesaler's maximum price shall apply to the sale by a wholesaler to a retailer or other person;
- (c) the retailer's maximum price shall apply to the sale by a retailer for the purpose of consumption or use;
- (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard (cut) quart, dry measure, equivalent to $1/32$ of a bushel;
- (e) the maximum retail price which may be demanded within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Divisions of Pachchilaipali-Karachchi and Pooneryn-Tunukkai and the Islands of Delft, Pungudutivu, Nainativu, Analaitivu, and Eluvaitivu for a quantity of paddy which is less than a bag but not less than one bushel shall be determined by reference to the maximum retail price per bushel prescribed by this Order in respect of that area, for paddy of that description;
- (f) a bag of paddy shall contain not less than 104 cut measures.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (i.) revoke my Order dated May 19, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of paddy;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the Controller's maximum price per bag, the wholesaler's maximum price per bag, the retailer's maximum price per bushel, and the retailer's maximum price per 2 measures, above which paddy of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the area within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Divisions of Vadamaradchi, Valikamam West, Valikamam North and East, Tenmaradchi and Islands (exclusive of the Sanitary Board areas of Kayts and Point Pedro and the Islands of Delft, Pungudutivu, Nainativu, Analaitivu and Eluvaitivu);
- (iii.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Divisions of Vadamaradchi, Valikamam West, Valikamam North and East, Tenmaradchi, and Islands (exclusive of the Sanitary Board areas of Kayts and Point Pedro and the Islands of Delft, Pungudutivu, Nainativu, Analaitivu and Eluvaitivu) exposes for sale paddy of any description mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by the Order in respect of paddy of that description;
- (iv.) direct that no trader shall sell any paddy of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;

(e) Tea taken out as ships' stores or for the personal use of a passenger or his family, in such quantities as the Principal Collector of Customs may consider reasonable.
(f) Tea exported by post in parcels not exceeding 2 lb. to the United Kingdom or 5 lb. to any other destination.

"Improvements in or relating to the mercerizing and lustreing of textile fibres."

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is disclosed in the following claims:—

Process for the mercerization and lustreing of textile fibres, which process consists in winding the material composed of such fibres, in the roving or fully twisted or spun or doubled yarn condition, upon a perforated holder with winding tension sufficient to draw the component fibres as far as possible to their full or natural length, the fibres of the roving or yarn of one winding layer being nipped and held fast in that position or condition by succeeding winding layers, and passing the mercerizing and other liquors through the wound mass by differential pressure.

As apparatus for winding a roving under tension for subsequent mercerizing treatment, a driven drum which frictionally drives the perforated holder: a further drum driven from the first drum and at substantially equal speed therewith, such further drum frictionally driving a rotatably mounted roving bobbin, and a spring tension device over which the roving passes from the roving bobbin as supply unit to the perforated holder.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2, sub-section (3)), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Noel Edward Ernst, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kurunegala District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Orders dated December 9, 1941, and December 10, 1941, relating to sugar published in *Government Gazettes* No. 8,826 of December 11, 1941, and No. 8,829 of December 13, 1941;

- (2) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the 1st Schedule shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (3) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this order for sugar of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of any inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) prescribe that every trader who sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that sugar on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the description and grade of sugar sold,
 - the quantity of sugar sold,
 - the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold,
 - the date of sale, and
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail as the case may be.
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
- any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
 - any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
 - the gross weight of a bag of sugar shall not be less than 2 cwt.

 (d) whether the sale is by wholesale or by retail ;

 (a) any sale of any quantity of flour for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 (b) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from a retail dealer in flour for any quantity of flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
 (c) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for flour of any description and grade which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such flour is sold.

 - (d) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III. of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.
 - (e) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III. of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors.

 - (c) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5, Part III. of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people.

 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer for any quantity of Wheat Flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (e) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Wheat Flour sold by a Wholesale Dealer shall include the price of the container in which such Wheat Flour is sold.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Morgan Davies, Deputy Controller of Prices, Ratnapura District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Order dated June 1, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,940 of June 5, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices of Wheat Flour, Australian;
- (2) fix the prices specified in column 2 (a), (b) and (c) as the Wholesale dealers' maximum prices per bag 49 lb., 150 lb. and 196 lb., respectively, in column 4 as the Authorised Distributors' maximum retail price per pound above which Australian Wheat Flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in columns 1 and 3 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that Wholesale Dealers and Authorised Distributors in the areas mentioned in columns 1 and 4 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for Australian Wheat Flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no Wholesale Dealer or Authorised Distributor shall sell Australian Wheat Flour which is adulterated with any other article;
- (5) direct that every Wholesale Dealer and Authorised Distributor who sells Australian Wheat Flour shall give the purchaser of that flour, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of flour sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail.
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Australian Wheat Flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (c) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to Authorised Distributors or depots;
 - (d) the "Wholesale Dealers' maximum prices" shall apply only to sales by a Wholesale Dealer to an Authorised Distributor;
 - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer from an Authorised Distributor for any quantity of Australian Wheat Flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (f) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Australian Wheat Flour sold by a Wholesale Dealer shall include the price of the container in which such flour is sold.

 - (a) the description and grade of Wheat Flour sold;
 - (b) the quantity of Wheat Flour sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of Wheat Flour sold;
 - (d) the date of the sale;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of Wheat Flour shall contain not less than 196 lbs;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (c) "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound, avoirdupois weight, equivalent to one-hundred and twelfth part of a hundredweight;
 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any bag of Wheat Flour containing more or less than 196 pounds shall be in proportion to the maximum price per bag of 196 pounds fixed by this Order;
 - (e) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (f) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (g) the maximum price fixed by this Order for Wheat Flour of any description and grade which is sold by wholesale shall include the container in which such Wheat Flour is sold;
 - (h) "ordinary" shall mean all grades of Wheat Flour.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Alfred Silva Kohomban-Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices, Matara District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Order dated April 27, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,930 of May 8, 1942, prescribing the maximum prices for rice and paddy within the Revenue District of Matara;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price which is for the time being fixed by me at the Supply Stations as shown in second Schedule increased by the amounts specified in column 2 or 3 (as the case may be) of the First Schedule hereto as the Wholesale Dealer's maximum price per bag above which rice or paddy of the description and grade specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 to 11 of the Third Schedule hereto to be the Authorized Distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which rice or paddy of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail, in respectively, the 10 areas mentioned in the Fourth Schedule;
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for rice or paddy of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell rice or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice or paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells rice or paddy of any description or grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice or paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice or paddy sold,
 - (b) the quantity of rice or paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice or paddy sold.
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of paddy or rice (other than raw rice) shall contain not less than 76 cut measures,
 - (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 cut measures,
 - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice or paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to 1/32 of a bushel.
 - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded from an Authorized Distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice or paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.

- direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out:—
 - the description and grade of article sold,
 - the quantity of the article sold,
 - the date of the sale,
 - the price paid for the article sold, and
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be.

Rules.

1. The Ceylon Telegraph Rules (Inland and Indo-Ceylon) published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 8,198 of January 24, 1936, are hereby amended as follows—

(1) in rule 68 (i) by the insertion immediately after clause (b), of the following new clause—

"(c) A fixed charge of 15 cents for each telegram irrespective of the length of the message."

(2) in rule 68 (ii.) by the insertion immediately after clause (b), of the following new clause—

"(c) A fixed charge of 30 cents for each telegram irrespective of the length of the message.", and

(3) by the substitution, for rule 193, of the following new rule—
"193. The charges for Indo-Ceylon telegrams shall be as follows—"

(i.) In the case of Ordinary telegrams—

- (a) for any number of words not exceeding twelve Rs. 1
(b) for each word after the first twelve words 10 cts.
(c) a fixed charge of 15 cents for each telegram irrespective of the length of the message

(ii.) In the case of Express telegrams—

- (a) for any number of words not exceeding twelve Rs. 2
(b) for each word after the first twelve words 15 cts.
(c) a fixed charge of 30 cents for each telegram irrespective of the length of the message."

2. Rule 1 of the rules made under section 5 of the Telegraph Ordinance and published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 8,906 of April 8, 1942, is hereby rescinded.
