THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by regulation 6A of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939.

The Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 2,646 of July 31, 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) by the insertion, immediately after Article 1 of that Order, of the following new Article:—

"1A (1) Article 1 of this Order shall not apply to any money which, but for the existence of a state of war, would be payable by a Bank to or for the benefit of—

(a) any individual who is an enemy only because he is resident in any area which is in the occupation of a power with whom His Majesty is at war and which is situated in any of the territories specified in the Schedule hereto;

(b) any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business in any place which is an enemy only because it is controlled by a person resident in any such area;

(c) any individual or any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) who or which is an enemy only because of his or its carrying on business in any such area.

(2) Any Bank which invests any such money in any securities registered as to both principal and interest for the time being specified by the Governor under regulation 5AA of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, for the investment of sums standing to the credit of a blocked account, shall not by reason only of so doing be deemed to have traded with the enemy.

(3) A Bank which credits interest in its books on any such money shall not by reason only of so doing be deemed to have traded with the enemy."

(2) in Article 7 of that Order—

(a) by the substitution for the words "the value at the date of vesting" of the words "the value";

(b) by the substitution for the words "the right of transfer is vested in him" of the following:—
"the right of transfer is vested in him:

Provided that the Custodian, acting under a general or special direction of the Governor, may reduce or remit any of the fees which are required to be retained by the Custodian under this Article;" and

(c) by the addition, at the end of that Article, of the following:—

"Nothing in the preceding provisions of this Article shall apply to any money paid to the Custodian under Article 1 of this Order in respect of persons resident or carrying on business in the Channel Islands." ; and

(3) by the addition, at the end of that Order, of the following Schedule:—

The Defence (Finance No. 2) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,525 of October 11, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended, in regulation 2, by the substitution for the Proviso to paragraph (1) of that regulation of the following:—

"Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply—

- to any goods, not being gems and not exceeding twenty five rupees in value, which are sent by post to any such territory, otherwise than in pursuance or in execution of any contract or agreement for the sale, exchange or barter of such goods;
- to any rubber or rubber latex exported from Ceylon by or under the authority of the Rubber Commissioner, Ceylon, on behalf of the Ministry of Supply in the United Kingdom;
- to any copra, oil seeds or coconut oil exported from Ceylon by or under the authority of the Commissioner of Commodity Purchase, on behalf of the Ministry of Food in the United Kingdom;
- to any plumbago exported from Ceylon by or under the authority of the Commissioner of Commodity Purchase, on behalf of the Ministry of Supply in the United Kingdom."

THE DEFENCE (ESSENTIAL SERVICES LABOUR CORPS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 9 of the Defence (Essential Services Labour Corps) Regulations.

Order.

The clothing and equipment of officers and members of the Essential Services Labour Corps shall be as described hereunder:—

I.—Uniform.

(a) Assistant Civil Defence Commissioner, Officers-in-charge of Camps, Assistant Officers-in-charge of Camps, Accountant Officer, Chief Inspector, Purchasing Officer, Senior and other Inspectors:—

Tunic—white drill 'bush pattern', worn with brass universal buttons.

Slacks or shorts—white drill.

Shirt—white twill, military pattern.

Socks or stockings—white.

Shoes—black.

Headgear—steel helmet or white peaked cap or blue forage cap or white topee, or white turban with blue edging worn with the Corps crest consisting of a lion with the letters E.S.L.C. set in a border of palm leaves.

Belt—white drill with brass buckles.

(b) Overseers:—

Tunic—blue drill 'bush pattern', worn with black buttons.

Shorts—blue drill.

Shirt—blue drill, military pattern.

Stockings—black.

Shoes—black.

Headgear—steel helmet, white topee or white turban with blue edging.

(c) Other Ranks:—

Shorts—blue drill.

Shirt—blue drill, without collar.

Headgear—white turban with blue edging.

II.—Badges of Rank.

(a) Assistant Civil Defence Commissioner:—

blue epaulettes on each shoulder with three gold stripes, Crown and star.

(b) Officers-in-charge of Camps and Accountant Officer:—

blue epaulettes on each shoulder with three gold stripes and Crown.

(c) Chief Inspectors and Assistant Officers-in-charge of Camps:—

blue epaulettes on each shoulder with two gold stripes and three stars.

(d) Senior Inspector and Purchasing Officer:—

blue epaulettes on each shoulder with two gold stripes and two stars

(e) Inspectors:—

blue epaulettes on each shoulder with two gold stripes and one star.

(f) Overseers:—

the letters E.S.L.C. on base of shoulder straps of tunic or shirt, and three white stripes on right sleeve.

(g) Sappers and Suboverscers:—

Corps identification plate on left breast pocket. Suboverscers will, in addition, wear two white stripes on right sleeve.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Rice Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1942.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Deputy Food Controller" means a Deputy Food Controller appointed under the Food Control Ordinance;

"estate" has the same meaning as in the Food Control Regulations, 1938;

- "paddy field" means any land ordinarily cultivated with paddy;
- "producer", in relation to paddy, means the proprietor of any paddy field, and includes any person who, under any contract or agreement or otherwise, takes or receives the whole or any part of the produce of any paddy field; and "to produce", in relation to paddy shall be construed accordingly;
- "proper authority" means a Deputy Food Controller or a Revenue Officer;
- "proprietor", in relation to a paddy field, means the owner, lessee, usufructuary mortgagee, or other person in possession and taking or receiving the produce or any part or share of the produce of that paddy field;
- "Revenue Officer" means the Government Agent or Additional Government Agent of a Province, and includes an Assistant Government Agent of a District, and an Assistant Government Agent (Emergency);
- "rice ration book" means a ration book issued under the Food Control Ordinance for the purpose of the rationing of supplies of rice;
- "rice ration card" means a licence, issued for the purposes of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, in the form of a rice ration card authorising the superintendent of any estate to purchase a specified quantity of rice;
- "superintendent" has the same meaning as in the Food Control Regulations, 1938.

(2) For the purposes of these regulations, a person shall not be deemed to be a member of the household of a producer of paddy unless that person resides with that producer and is dependent on him for food.

3. Where—

- (a) a rice ration book containing coupons enabling rice to be purchased or obtained during any period has been issued to any producer of paddy, and
- (b) the quantity of paddy produced by that producer is sufficient for the requirements of that producer and of the members of his household for the whole of that period or for any one or more weeks in that period,

it shall be the duty of that producer to surrender to the proper authority of the Province, District or area in which he resides the rice ration book issued to him for that period, or the coupons for such week or weeks, as the case may be; and it shall be the duty also of every person who is a member of the household of that producer and is the holder of a rice ration book in like manner to surrender the rice ration book issued to him or the coupons for such week or weeks, as the case may be

4. Where a rice ration book has been issued to a person who does not ordinarily consume rice as part of his daily food, it shall be the duty of that person to surrender his rice ration book to the proper authority of the Province, District or area in which he resides.

5. (1) Where a proper authority has reason to believe that any person to whom a rice ration book has been issued is a person who is required by the provisions of regulation 3 to surrender his rice ration book, the proper authority may, by order, require such person to surrender his rice ration book to the proper authority:

Provided, however, that the proper authority—

- (a) may, in any case where the proper authority is satisfied, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary, that the person to whom the order relates is not a producer of paddy, rescind such order; or
- (b) may, in any case where the proper authority is satisfied, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary, that such person, being a producer of paddy, produces a quantity of paddy sufficient for the requirements of such person and of the members of his household for

only one or more weeks in the period for which such rice ration book was issued but not for the whole of that period, modify such order and remove from the ration book and destroy such of the coupons as the proper authority is satisfied should be surrendered in accordance with the provisions of regulation 3; and the proper authority shall, after the removal of such coupons, forthwith return such ration book to such person.

(2) Where a proper authority has reason to believe that any person to whom a rice ration book has been issued is a person who is required by the provisions of regulation 3 to surrender any coupons from his rice ration book the proper authority may, by order, require that person to produce his rice ration book to such authority and may remove from that ration book and destroy such of the coupons as the proper authority is satisfied should be surrendered in accordance with the provisions of regulation 3.

(3) Where a proper authority has reason to believe that any person to whom a rice ration book has been issued is a person who is required by the provisions of regulation 4 to surrender his rice ration book, the proper authority may, by order, require such person to surrender his rice ration book to the proper authority:

Provided, however, that the proper authority may, in any case where the proper authority is satisfied, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary, that the person to whom the order relates ordinarily consumes rice as part of his daily food, rescind such order

(4) It shall be the duty of every person, to whom an order made by a proper authority under any of the preceding provisions of this regulation is communicated, forthwith to comply with that order.

(5) Any order made by a proper authority under any of the preceding provisions of this regulation may be communicated to the person to whom the order relates either orally or in writing

6. Where any paddy field is comprised within or forms part of any estate, the Deputy Food Controller (Estates) shall, in determining the quantity of rice which the superintendent of that estate should be authorised to purchase during any week under the authority of a ration card, have regard to the quantity of paddy produced on that estate which is available for the purpose of providing rice for consumption by persons resident on the estate, after such quantity of such paddy as may be necessary for the requirements of any producer of such paddy and of the members of his household has been taken by such producer, and the Deputy Food Controller may, in his discretion, refuse to issue a ration card to the superintendent of any estate in respect of any week if he is satisfied that the quantity of paddy available as hereinbefore provided is sufficient for the purpose of providing the weekly ration of rice to the persons resident on that estate during that week.

7. The Defence (Surrender of Rice Ration Books) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,873 of February 28, 1942, are hereby rescinded.

8. (i.) The Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders without assigning any reason therefor.
(ii.) Conditions of sale and any other particulars can be obtained on application at the Colombo Kachcheri.

(iii.) Should the tenders or bids for the individual taverns or groups not be acceptable, the Government Agent will proceed to grant the various privileges to approved persons at such figures as he may consider satisfactory. All tenderers as well as others who have not tendered, but would like to participate in the arrack tavern rents, are invited to be present.

9. The tenders for each of the taverns to be sold individually and for each of the groups will close at different times as shown below against the name of the tavern or designation of the group on July 21, 1942.

10. The attention of tenderers is drawn to new condition 11A of the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions, which aims at ensuring the return of empty arrack bottles to the bottling warehouses and preventing their diversion to other uses. According to this condition the first issue of the bottled arrack for the new rent period will be on the security of a deposit to be made by the renter for each tavern as shown in schedule AA representing the value of empties proposed to be drawn. This deposit should be made at the same time as the payment for the first consignment of arrack. Two separate Kachcheri receipts should be produced at the warehouse for the deposit to cover the value of empties and the first payment for the arrack. The second and subsequent issues of bottled arrack will be conditional on the gallonage of empty bottles brought by the renter to the warehouse. In broad terms, the gallonage that will be issued will be equivalent to the gallonage of empty bottles returned by the renter—for details see conditions 11A (1) and (6). Renters will be expected to make every effort to collect the empties of the sealed bottles sold at their respective taverns.

11. Condition 20 will enable the Department to compel a renter to take his quota of sealed bottles of arrack, so that a renter may not exploit the situation by making bigger profits on unduly inflated sales of bulk arrack.

12. Attention is also drawn to Schedule A. The issue price at the warehouse of the Extra Special Quality of arrack has been increased from Rs. 15.40 per gallon to Rs. 20.20 per gallon, but there is no alteration in the gross profit to the renter, as the selling price at the tavern has correspondingly been increased from Rs. 19.20 to Rs. 24 per gallon—*vide* condition 1 (b) of the arrack tavern licensed form in Excise Notification 373. The gross profit of Rs. 3.80 on all these qualities thus remains as at present.

13. The proviso to condition 1 (c) of the new licence form should be noted. Bulk arrack sold for off consumption will not be allowed to be sold at the tavern price for bulk arrack fixed by the renter under condition 1 (c).

14. Condition 1 (e) of the new licence form will help the renter to establish the habit of customers bringing back their empty arrack bottles to the tavern (for return to the warehouse).

15. Attention is also drawn to amended condition 3 (b), new condition 3 (d), amended condition 7, and new condition 10 (a) (i.) of the new licence form.

16. The security required from the GRANTEE of each tavern may most usefully be deposited in the form of Government of Ceylon loans:—Registered Stock, Promissory Notes, and War Loans (with or without interest). The interest bearing stock, promissory notes and war loan may possibly be found to be more paying than the fixed deposits in banks, &c. This is merely a suggestion to prospective grantees, and carries no further security from Government than the script itself.

 - the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer for any quantity of wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - the maximum prices fixed by this Order for wheat flour which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

PADDY (WHOLESALE).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Edward Trevor Dyson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kandy District, do by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) direct that wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for paddy fixed by this Order;
- (3) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article;
- (4) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells paddy shall give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the date of sale, and
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (c) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to Authorised Distributors or depots;
 - (d) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (e) the "wholesale dealer's maximum price" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an Authorised Distributor;
 - (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an Authorised Distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (g) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for paddy sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such paddy is sold.
