## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, November 2, 1895, at 8 o'clock a.m.

*Present*:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. Frederick Keyt; R. D. Ormsby, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; Edwin Beven, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 21, 1895, were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from end of 1894 to September 30 last; separate Statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of September.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, be forwarded, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following recommendation of the Standing Committee was considered:—That steps be taken to acquire a strip of land along a portion of the bank of the Mahaweli-ganga, near Watapoluwa village, and which is required for the extension of the new road from Lewella to Alutgantota.

It was proposed by Dr. F. Keyt, seconded by Mr. J. B. Siebel, "that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted."—Carried unanimously.

4. Considered the following recommendation of the Standing Committee:—That a branch pathway, 246 yards in length, situated at Deyannewela, and used by the public for many years, be taken over by the Municipal Council as prayed for by the residents of that locality.

Proposed by Mr. R. D. Ormsby, seconded by Mr. J. B. Siebel, "that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted."—On being put to the vote this was carried unanimously.

5. The Council proceeded to fix the number of opium licenses to be issued for 1896.

Resolved,—That the number of opium licenses for 1896 be four, the same as for 1895.

6. In respect of taxes and water-rate to be levied during 1896, it was resolved that the tax or rate for the maintenance of the police and incidental charges for 1896 be fixed at five per cent. on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of lands and tenements, under section 127 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, and that the sanction of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council be applied for.

7. Resolved,—That the water-rate for 1896 be fixed at six per cent., under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 18 of 1884.

8. Resolved, as proposed by the Standing Committee, that the following taxes be levied in 1896:—

9. Read memorial dated October 10 from residents at Katukele, objecting to the establishment of a private cemetery at Katukele for the interment of the deceased nuns of the Convent of the Good Shepherd.

The connected papers were submitted. It was stated at the Meeting that the burial of a deceased nun had recently taken place on the premises attached to the Convent.

Resolved,—That the memorialists be informed that before recommending the private burial ground the Municipal Council satisfied themselves that there was no objection to the place selected by the Council. The recent burial was, it is believed, not on the ground selected, and took place before authority had been granted by the Governor.

The Secretary was instructed to cause a list to be made of all cemeteries or burial grounds within the Municipality.

10. The report of the Special Committee appointed on September 21 to consider the draft of an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils' Ordinance of 1887 was brought forward and read.

It was proposed by Mr. R. D. Ormsby, seconded by Dr. F. Keyt, "that the report be adopted, and that a copy be sent to the Attorney-General."—Carried unanimously.

11. The Chairman submitted the final revision of the by-laws.

It was resolved that the amendments suggested by the Chairman be approved, that a fair copy be made of the by-laws as so amended, and forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, with a view to their being embodied in an Ordinance as suggested by the Attorney-General.

12. Read letter dated October 19 from Mr. L. E. Blazé, thanking the Municipal Council for allowing him the free use of the Town Hall for a prize distribution of the Boys' High School on September 14.

13. Read letter No. 13537 of October 18 from the Government Agent, forwarding report of the sale of toll rents for 1896.

Resolved,—That as suggested the offer for the Lewella and Halloluwa tolls be rejected and tenders be called for all the toll rents.

14. The Secretary reported that on the night of October 31, consequent on the recent fall of rain, the water in the reservoir reached spill level.

Several applications for house-service pipes were submitted.

It was ordered that a report in each case be first made for consideration.

15. Read letter dated September 23 from the Secretary, foregoing for the present, owing to lateness of the year, the leave of absence granted him on September 21.

(a) 12 manhole covers repaired and renewed; clearing out gratings.

(b) 159 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared; transport of stone for building along edge of Hantane road drain; 1 cube of retaining wall constructed; proportion of cost of thatching cooly lines.

(c) wages of watcher; proportion of cost of cadjans for re-covering lines.

(d) Proportion of cost of cadjans for re-covering cooly lines.

(e) Whitewashing walls; making a new gate and repairing old one at Town Hall; repairs of a wheelbarrow; new coping stone wall of store.
