- (1) in rule 9 (2), by the addition at the end thereof of the words “In the calculation of such donations, the part of a cent shall not be taken into account.”;

## BY-LAW.

"Process for the manufacture of sweetened desiccated coconut."

Abstract.—A method of sweetening desiccated coconut in which the final product is permeated with the sweetening substance. Desiccated coconut is treated with a compound of glycerine, sugar and salt and heated in a steam kettle under pressure, the kettle being rotated so as to thoroughly mix the contents. Subsequently the product is passed through a drier and cooled off.

The inventor states that this product is superior to the ordinary sweetened desiccated coconut, in that it is less liable to turn rancid, and to lose its sweet flavour.

"Improvements in and relating to electric fans."

Abstract.—This invention relates to electric fans and more particularly to ceiling fans. The motor consists of an internal stator provided with one winding which is connected across the supply, and another winding which is joined in series with a condenser and connected across the terminals of the first. The condenser is mounted in a recess formed by the stampings of the stator. The rotor is a squirrel cage which is adapted to be supported by and to rotate about the stator by means of suitable bearings. The blades are attached to the rotor.

"Improvements in fountain pens."

Abstract.—The inventor describes a fountain pen which can be readily filled by inserting it in the opening of the stopper on an ink bottle and turning the whole upside down.

The feed bar of this pen comprises an outer portion provided upon its upper side with an air groove, and an inward extension extending almost the whole length of the barrel and provided with ink ducts which are symmetrically spaced with respect to the air ducts and are continued up to the innermost end of the extension. The inner end of the outer portions is provided with a flat portion on its upper side which is continued along the extension. The nib carrier has a bore which is enlarged so that the space between the flat surface of the upper side of feed bar and the enlarged portion of bore is larger than the space on the diametrically opposite side. An auxiliary ink duct runs between and parallel to the main ink ducts and ends within the inner end of the air groove. The cross sectional area of the air duct is about .5 square millimeter and is so proportioned so that although air flows out freely during filling, when the pen is used for writing large displacements of air cannot take place. The ink ducts are narrow and deep so as to induce capillary action. The above arrangement ensures that when the pen is being filled air flows freely along the air duct and escapes into the filling bottle; but when the pen is in use the air duct is sealed with ink at its inner portion. As the ink is used up in writing a slight vacuum is created in the stock and this vacuum is relieved occasionally by air passing past this seal.

"Improvements in or relating to boxes or casings with removable covers or lids for electrical apparatus."

*Abstract.*—A box or casing for electrical apparatus in which the removal of the cover automatically disconnects the apparatus from the electric supply. Such a box may, for instance, house a variable impedance for controlling the speed of an electric fan.

According to the invention, the case and cover are made of moulded insulating material and the terminals of the supply entering through the base of the casing end in flat

contact members; the apparatus inside the case is connected to a pair of contact springs which engage the contact members only when the cover is screwed down. A rotatable handle may be provided in the casing with a key which fits in a slot in the rotary part of the variable impedance.

"Improvements in and relating to the application of protective coatings to metal pipes and the like."

*Abstract.*—The invention relates to improvements in the method of application of a heated bituminous compound and a foraminous reinforcement, such as hessian, to the exterior of a pipe; the article thus treated has finally applied to it a layer of granular material such as sand.

According to the invention, the pipe is closed at both ends and provided with spindles on which it can be rotated in a bath of molten compound. While it is so rotated it is subjected to the action of scrapers which remove excess material, and at the same time cause effective cohesion to take place between the pipe and the compound. Strips of foraminous material are wound on the pipe while it is still in the bath. The pipe is then moved on to higher bearings and rotated for a further period to allow the coating to set partially. Afterwards the pipe is rolled backwards and forwards in a bed of sand.

If the inside as well as the outside of the pipe has to be coated with bitumen, the brackets supporting the spindles should have openings to allow the compound to flow to the inside. If it is desired that the compound inside be subjected to the action of scrapers, then the end brackets and spindles are dispensed with and the pipe rotated by frictional rollers mounted within the trough.
