GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 1 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified, and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939.

REGULATION.

The Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations are hereby amended by the omission from the schedule thereto of the items bearing numbers 8 and 9.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Prohibition of Exports) Regulations.
2. No article or commodity specified in the schedule shall be exported from Ceylon for any purpose or in any circumstances whatsoever.
3. The Governor may, by Order published in the *Gazette*, add any new item to the schedule or amend or delete any item set out therein.
4. (1) The provisions of these regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Ordinance and the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations; and for the purposes of the application of the Customs Ordinance, any article or commodity specified in the schedule shall be deemed to be an article the exportation of which is prohibited by Ordinance.
(2) The provisions of these regulations shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, the provisions of any other written law relating to any article or commodity specified in the schedule and to the regulation or restriction of the exportation of any such article or commodity:

Provided, however, that where in any case any of these regulations is in conflict or inconsistent with any such other written law, the provisions of such regulation shall prevail.
