THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 114 (5) of the Criminal Procedure Code (Chapter 16), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification direct that the Order made under the said section 114 by the Magistrate of Kandy and reproduced in the Schedule hereto, shall remain in force for a further period of fourteen days commencing on the twenty-fourth day of January, 1940.

SCHEDULE.

Order.

As it appears to me on evidence that the holding of meetings in Wegama wasama and Diyatilake korale will probably lead to danger to human life and safety, and to rioting, owing to the labour troubles on Mooloya estate and the conduct of the members of the Estate Workers' Union and the Sama Samajist Party in connection with the strike on the said estate. And as already there have been instances of threats and force used by labourers of the said estate and such threats may lead to violence if speedy action is not taken to prevent it.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 114 of the Criminal Procedure Code I direct that no meetings be held in Wegama wasama and Diyatilake korale: I direct this Order to the public generally frequenting or visiting Wegama wasama or Diyatilake korale.

This Order is to be in force for fourteen days from the 10th January, 1940, and is to be in force in place and instead of the Order made by me on the 10th January, 1940, which latter Order I have rescinded.
