A PROCLAMATION.

A. CALDECOTT.

KNOW Ye that, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Prisons Ordinance (Chapter 44), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish a Prison for this Island in the premises of the Old Military Detention Barracks at Kandy.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 1 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939.

REGULATION.

Regulation 1 of the Defence (Miscellaneous No. 3) Regulations published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,619 of June 3, 1940, is hereby amended by the addition at the end of that regulation of the following new paragraph, which shall have effect as paragraph (8) of that regulation:—

Cap. 44. “(8) Where under the preceding provisions of this regulation a detention order has been made against any person and where the place authorized by the Governor for the detention of that person is a prison established under the Prisons Ordinance, the provisions of that Ordinance and the rules made thereunder shall, subject as hereinafter provided, apply to that person as though he were a civil prisoner within the meaning of that Ordinance:

Provided that the Governor may issue instructions that in the case of any person detained as aforesaid, any such rule shall not apply or shall apply with such additions, amendments or modifications as may be specified in such instructions.”
