## Order.

The Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, published in *Gazette* No. 8,628 of June 28, 1940, as amended by any subsequent

Order, is hereby further amended, in the Schedule to that Order, by the addition, at the end of that Schedule, of the following new paragraphs:—

“ 12. That part of the Kelaniya village area in the Colombo District of the Western Province, bounded on the—

North: By an imaginary line drawn from the junction of the Hunupitiya-Enderamulla road with Hunupitiya-Padiliyatuduwa road eastwards along the northern boundary of the Hunupitiya-Padiliyatuduwa road till it meets the Padiliyatuduwa-Talawatuhenpita North road, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Colombo-Kandy road, thence north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the Kadawata-Mawara Mandiya road.

East: By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of Kadawata-Mawara Mandiya road till it meets the road leading to Makola North, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Mawara Mandiya-Talawatuhenpita South road, thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said road till it meets the Makola South-Pattawila road, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Hoyiyantuduwa-Talwatta road, thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said road till it meets the Talwatta-Bollegala road, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Colombo-Radawana road, thence due south across the said road to the Kelanganga.

South: By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern boundary of the Kelanganga as far as a point in prolongation southwards of the western boundary of the Kelaniya Railway Station Approach road.

West: By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards crossing the Colombo-Radawana road to the western boundary of the Kelaniya Railway Station Approach road, thence northwards along the said boundary to the northern boundary of the Colombo-Kandy road, thence north-eastwards along the said boundary till it meets the Wedamulla-Wanawahala road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the Wanawahala-Wewelduwa road, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the Wewelduwa-Hunupitiya road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the Hunupitiya-Wattala road, thence north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road to the starting point of the northern boundary of the area.

The town for which the Kuliyaipitiya Urban Council is to be constituted under the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, is hereby divided into the seven electoral divisions defined in the Schedule hereto

*Schedule.*

**Electoral Divisions of the Town of Kuliyaipitiya.**

*Electoral Division No. 1—Kandulla.*

*North*: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the said limit as far as the centre of the northern side of the bridge over Dambugolle-oya on the Madampe—Kurunegala road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Dambugolle-oya till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area, thence south-westwards along the said limit as far as the landmark at the south-eastern corner of lot 53 in Final Village Plan 64 (Dandagamuwa).

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards and westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to the western extremity of the said limit.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-eastwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 2—Kadurugashena.*

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Circular road to the centre of its junction with Madampe—Kurunegala road, thence along the centre line of the foot path leading from market junction to Uru-pitiya till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

*South*: From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area as far as a point opposite the south-western corner of lot 7 in Final Village Plan 979 (Kadurugashena).

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the eastern limit of Division No. 1, thence northwards along the said limit to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 3—Kuliyaipitiya West.*

*North*: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 2 eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of Gansabhawa road leading to Madampe—Kurunegala road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Gansabhawa road to the centre of its junction with Madampe—Kurunegala road, thence eastwards along the centre line of Madampe—Kurunegala road to the centre of its junction with Gansabhawa road leading to Uru-pitiya, thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said Gansabhawa road to the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

*South*: From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Division No. 2.

*West*: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 2 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 4—Kuliyaipitiya East.*

*North*: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 3 north-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the southern limit of Pallepitiya Village (Final Village Plan 977), thence eastwards along the said village limit till it meets the western limit of Aswedduma Village (Final Village Plan 976), thence due east through Kolongahumulawatta to the centre of Kuliyaipitiya—Hettipola road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Kuliyaipitiya—Hettipola road to the centre of its junction with Madampe—Kurunegala road, thence south-westwards along the centre line of Madampe—Kurunegala road to the cement drain near G. P. Perera's boutique, thence southwards along the said drain to the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Division No. 3, thence north-westwards along the said limit as far as a point at the centre of the western boundary of lot 9G3 in Supplement E to Final Village Plan 978 (Kuliyaipitiya), thence westwards to the centre of Gansabhawa road.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

BY-LAWS under section 49 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), made severally by the Village Committees of the Gampaha and Bultala-Wedirata village areas in the Badulla District, approved by the Executive Committee of Local Administration, and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

*By-laws.*

1. For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows :—

- in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent ;
- in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent ;
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent ; and
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and
- to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may, in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall, within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

EMERGENCY PARTIAL BLACKOUT.

IT is hereby notified that, by virtue of the power vested in the Minister for Local Administration by the Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, published in the *Gazette* of June 28, 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order, the Minister has, under paragraph 7 of the said Order, imposed from 6 P.M. on January 14, 1943, until further notice, a partial blackout in the additional areas set out below :—

*East* : By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of Kadawata-Mawara Mandiya road till it meets the road leading to Makola North, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Mawara Mandiya-Talawatuhenpita South road, thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said road till it meets the Makola South-Pattiwila road, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Heyiyantuduwa-Talwatta road, thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said road till it meets the Talwatta-Bollegala road, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the Colombo-Radawana road, thence due south across the said road to the Kelani-ganga.

*South* : By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern boundary of the Kelani-ganga as far as a point in prolongation southerwards of the western boundary of the Kelaniya Railway Station Approach road.



West: By an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards crossing the Colombo-Radawana road to the western boundary of the Kelaniya Railway Station Approach road, thence northwards along the said boundary to the northern boundary of the Colombo-Kandy road, thence north-eastwards along the said boundary till it meets the Wedamulla-Wanawahala road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the Wanawahala-Wewelduwa road, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the Wewelduwa-Hunupitiya road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the Hunupitiya-Wattala road, thence north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road to the starting point of the northern boundary of the area.

13. The area comprising the Village Headmen's divisions set out under the heading "Ambatalenpahala Village area" in the notification under section 11 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198) published in *Gazette* No. 8,448 of April 28, 1939.

2. The provisions of Part III. of the Lighting Restriction Order (viz., paragraphs 13 to 17 inclusive) relating to Outdoor and Indoor Lights and Lights on Vehicles other than Motor Cars shall come into operation from the date set out above, and shall continue until the Minister issue directions that the partial blackout shall cease to be in force in the areas set out above.

  - the date of the sale;
  - the weight of the quantity sold;
  - the price paid for the quantity sold; and
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

  - (b) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
  - (c) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors, depots or estates;
  - (d) the "wholesale dealers' maximum prices" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor or to an estate;
  - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or an estate for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - (f) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice sold by a wholesale dealer are already subject to the reduction allowed to the retailer for the container in which such rice is sold;
  - (g) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order in respect of currystuffs dated December 17, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, in so far as it relates to the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Urban Council limits of the town of Matale;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price, as the case may be, above which articles of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (4) direct that paragraphs 4, 5, 6, and 7 of my Order dated November 27, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,043 of November 28, 1942, relating to currystuffs shall apply in the case of currystuffs of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto as though these paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.

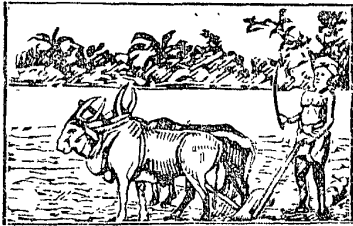
