THE CEYLON STATE MORTGAGE BANK ORDINANCE.

RULE made by the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 92 (1) (c) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance (Chapter 277).

Rule.

The rules relating to the State Mortgage Bank Provident Fund published in *Gazette* No. 8,048 of May 11, 1934, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in rule 4, by the substitution, for the words "interest thereon", of the words "interest thereon, other than moneys necessary for making payments authorised by these rules,"; and

(2) by the addition immediately after rule 5A, of the following new rule:—

"5B. (1) It shall be lawful for the Manager to open in the Bank of Ceylon a current account, which shall be called the State Mortgage Bank Provident Fund Account, for the purpose of depositing moneys pending investment in accordance with the provisions of rule 4, and moneys necessary for making payments authorised by these rules.

(2) The State Mortgage Bank Provident Fund Account shall be operated on by—

(a) a Director and the Manager, or

(b) a Director and the person for the time being acting for the Manager.

(3) The moneys so deposited in the Bank of Ceylon, with the interest thereon, shall be assets of the Fund."

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance (Chapter 312), approved under section 8 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on November 25, 1942, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Tottama tank irrigation work in the Batticaloa District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work, free of all charges, namely, 4 cubes of earthwork per acre before the end of August, 1943, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII of the Ordinance.

HEADLAMP MASKS FOR SERVICE VEHICLES.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Minister for Local Administration, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by paragraph 4 of the Lighting Restriction (Motor Cars) Order, 1942, dated March 7, 1942, and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,877 of March 9, 1942, has generally approved that the headlights of motor vehicles used by His Majesty's forces be shaded or obscured in one of the following ways:—

- (1) by the use of the civilian pattern mask described in Schedule B to the Lighting Restriction (Motor Cars) Order, 1942;
- (2) by the use of the Indian pattern mask, the specifications of which are set out below; and
- (3) by the use of the War Office pattern mask, the specifications of which are set out below.

2. It is also notified that the Minister has approved that the special distinctive recognition device on Service motor vehicles shall consist of a pin-point of light $\frac{1}{4}$ in. in diameter on the off side lamp or, on vehicles without side lamp, on the off side head lamp.

*Specifications referred to.**Indian Pattern.*—Headlamps are masked:—

- (a) by fitting a special metal mask on the outside of the lens, or
- (b) by painting the lens either on the outside, or inside, or both, or
- (c) by fitting a cardboard disc within the headlamp.

In each case, the light aperture is cut down to a 2 in. diameter semi-circular orifice concentric with the reflector with its base on the horizontal centre line and its circumference below it.

The lower half of the reflector is painted black.

War Office Pattern.—The headlamp lens is replaced by a metal disc having a glazed rectangular aperture. The size of the aperture varies between the following limits:—

Length .. 3 in. to 4 in.
Width .. 5/16 in. to $\frac{1}{4}$ in.

The disc carries a metal canopy above the aperture, projecting some 3 in. from the disc. The leading and side edges of the canopy are in the same horizontal plane. The height, from the horizontal centre line, of (i.) the lower edge of the aperture, (ii.) the horizontal plane formed by the edges of the canopy, is governed by the size and shape of the reflector and the position of the filament of the bulb, so as to ensure that direct rays from the filament do not pass beyond the edges of the canopy.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke my Order dated August 3, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,987 of August 14, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and retail prices of paddy fixed in respect of the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price per bag and the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that wholesale dealers and authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices of paddy fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article;
- (5) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorised distributor who sells paddy shall give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of paddy shall contain 80 measures;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is more or less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (e) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (f) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., Head E, of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (g) the "maximum wholesale price" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor;
 - (h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for paddy sold by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor shall not include the price of the container in which such paddy is sold.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag and the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which paddy shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) direct that any wholesale dealer or authorised distributor who, at any premises within the limits of the area mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells paddy shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices of paddy fixed by this Order;
- (3) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article;
- (4) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells paddy shall, and every authorised distributor who sells paddy shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart. dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (c) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
 - (d) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (e) "the wholesale dealer's maximum price" shall apply only to sales by wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor;
 - (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- (6) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 29, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,059 of December 31, 1942, relating to the prices of paddy.

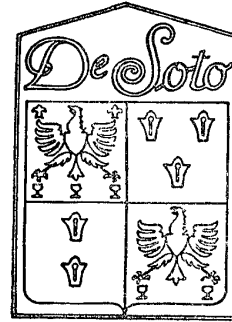

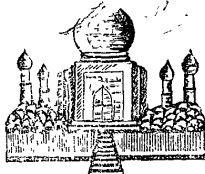

When not in use, the umbrella may be closed and slung in a horizontal position under the crossbar.

"An improved process for concentrating, purifying and separating colloidal dispersions or the like in the electric field".

Abstract.—The invention relates to the process of purifying, concentrating and/or separating the disperse phase of rubber and rubber-like material, by subjecting such dispersions to an electric field, in a cell provided with current permeable membranes. It is found that in certain cases, e.g., in electro-dialysing the synthetic rubber latex known as Buna-S-Latex, layering proceeds very slowly. The inventor states that the migration velocity of the colloidal ions can be accelerated by changing the charge on them.

According to the invention, polar substances in the solid, liquid or gaseous state are added to the dispersion in the middle cell; alternatively, they may be added to the electrode compartments from which they will diffuse into the middle cell through the diaphragms. Preferably the substances added are electrolytes, e.g., lyes, acids, buffer solutions.

"A method and device for protecting the tapping cuts on rubber trees from rain water thereby preventing the loss of latex during wet weather".

Abstract.—The Inventor describes a device for preventing rain water from flowing down the trunk of the tree into the cup. According to the invention, a strip of rubber in the shape of a half "V" or "U" is tied round the tree above the tapping cut so as to form a gutter with the trunk of the tree; the rain water is thus conducted away from the tapping cut. If necessary, the strip of rubber may be supported at intervals by suitably shaped pieces of wire. In conjunction with the above device, the applicant claims a cover of suitable shape and size, e.g., a coconut shell which is to be placed over the collecting cup so as to prevent rain water falling directly into it.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Aluwihare, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), North-Central Province, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order in respect of Ceylon Rice dated October 15, 1942, published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,023 of October 21, 1942;
- (2) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, to be, the maximum price per measure above which any variety of rice shall not be sold in the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that no person shall sell any rice which is adulterated with any other article or by-product of rice including bran and husk;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) the maximum price shall apply to the sale by any person of any rice of any description whatsoever to any person whomsoever;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
- (5) direct that any person who sells any rice of any description whatsoever shall give to the purchaser of the rice, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of the rice sold;
 - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale, and
 - (d) the price paid for the rice sold.
