THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) RECULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS the Society known as the Chulipuram Union, Malaya (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), registered m Kuala Lumpur m the Federated Malay States and having its registered office and carrying on business at the aforesaid place, is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Union became an enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, the said Union duly appointed V. Ponnampalam their attorney in Ceylon (hereinafter referred to as the "Attorney"):

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or declings with or for the benefit of, the said Union is hable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regula-tions, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations, unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Attorney and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided :

Now therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defonce (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the Attorney to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Union and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Union through their Attorney in Ceylon. 

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Centrol of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I. Mylvaganam Selvadurai, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Vavuniya District, do, by this Order-

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date,
 - (a) Order dated July 10, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in Government Gazette No. 8,968 of July 17, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum price of Java white sugar and
 - Gazette No. 8,908 of July 17, 1942, in so far as it reflates to the maximum price of Java while sugar and African refined sugar;
 (b) Order dated August 17, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in Government Gazette No. 8,901 of August 21, 1942;
 (c) Order dated October 19, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in Government Gazette No. 9,024 of October 23, 1942, in so far as it relates to Indian while refined sugar;
 (d) my Order dated December 18, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 9,055 of December 24, 1942; and
 (e) my Order dated January 13, 1943, published in Government Gazette No. 9,066 of January 13, 1943;
- (n.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price per bag (whole-sale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned therein shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be decoded to be a sale by wholesale;
 (c) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery;
- (c) sugar shall exclude an forme of preserving and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality:
 (v.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous

position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade,

(vi.) direct that every trader who; within the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule heroto, sells by wholesale any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule heroto shall, and overy trader who, within the areas mentioned in columns 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells by retail any sugar of the description and grade montioned in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, over the self of the second the second to be self of the schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out-
