## THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS the Society known as the Chulapuram Union, Malaya (hereinafter referred to as the “Union”), registered in Kuala Lumpur in the Federated Malay States and having its registered office and carrying on business at the aforesaid place, is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939:

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Union became an enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, the said Union duly appointed V. Ponnampalam their attorney in Ceylon (hereinafter referred to as the “Attorney”):

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with or for the benefit of, the said Union is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations, unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation-1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Attorney and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation I of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the Attorney to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Union and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Union through their Attorney in Ceylon.

- (e) "the wholesale dealer's maximum price" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor ;
- (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

*Order.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Noel Edward Ernst, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kurunegala Revenue District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 10, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 9,053 of December 18, 1942, relating to the maximum prices of sugar ;
- (2) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale and retail price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound, above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto as the maximum wholesale and retail price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound, respectively, above which sugar of the description and grade shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto ;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of sugar mentioned in the First Schedule hereto ;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
- (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (c) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from a retail dealer for any quantity of sugar which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
- (d) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for sugar of any description and grade which is sold wholesale by bag shall include the container in which such sugar is sold ;
- (e) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality ;
- (6) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, exposes for sale sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade ;
- (7) direct that every trader who, within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall give the purchaser of that sugar, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- (a) the date of the sale ;
- (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight) ;

- (c) the description and grade of sugar sold ;  
 (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold ; and  
 (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date,
  - (a) Order dated July 10, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,968 of July 17, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum price of Java white sugar and African refined sugar ;
  - (b) Order dated August 17, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,991 of August 21, 1942 ;
  - (c) Order dated October 19, 1942, by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,024 of October 23, 1942, in so far as it relates to Indian white refined sugar ;
  - (d) my Order dated December 18, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,055 of December 24, 1942 ; and
  - (e) my Order dated January 13, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,066 of January 15, 1943 ;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price per bag (wholesale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned therein shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (c) " sugar " shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (iv.) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality ;
- (v.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous

position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade,

(vi.) direct that every trader who; within the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells by wholesale any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto shall, and every trader who, within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells by retail any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
- (b) the quantity of the sugar sold (by weight);
- (c) the description and grade of sugar sold;
- (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
