The following amendment to the Constitution and the Fundamental Provisions and Regulations Non-Fundamental of the Diocesan Council of the Church of Ceylon published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,378 and dated July 1, 1938, were passed at the 57th session of the Diocesan Council of the Church of Ceylon held in Colombo on October 16, 1942.

Amendment of Rule 15 under section 29 of Chapter XIII (non-fundamental).

(a) by the re-numbering of Rule 15 as Rule 15 (1).
(b) by the addition to Rule 15 of the following new sub-section which shall have effect as sub-section (2) of that Rule.

In the case of a contributor being declared to be of unsound mind by a competent Court, it shall be lawful for the Bishop to declare that the contributor is incapable of duly discharging the duties of the office of a clergyman. On such declaration being made the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Section and/or the Augmentation Section of the said Register shall be utilised by the Incorporated Trustees for the purchase of an annuity for himself, if unmarried, or for himself and his wife jointly in any Life Office selected by the Trustees.

Notwithstanding anything in this rule to the contrary, the Incorporated Trustees may, if they think fit, with the consent of the Standing Committee pay such annuities at a rate not exceeding 25 per cent. more than can be secured from any Incorporated Life Office, from the Reserve Fund instead of purchasing an annuity. In such case the amount standing to the credit of such clergyman in the Deposit Section and/or the Augmentation Section shall be transferred to the Reserve Fund.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

 - (b) "milk food" shall mean Malted Milk and Infant Food;
 - (c) any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (d) any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that any trader who, at any premises, exposes for sale any preserved milk or milk food specified in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of such preserved milk or milk food;
- (v.) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any preserved milk or milk food shall, and every person who sells by retail any preserved milk or milk food shall, on demand, give the purchaser of such preserved milk or milk food a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold;
 - (c) the description and name of the brand of preserved milk or of milk food sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - (e) the price paid for the quantity sold.
