THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE. BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 289), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that of the sum of fifty milhon rupees for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the Home Defence Loan Ordinance; No. 2 of 1942, the sum specified in the Schedule hereto shall be raised in Ceylon in the mode and upon the terms and conditions specified in that Schedule.

### Schedule.

- The sum of money to be raised shall be 10 million rupees, and if shall be raised by way of-

  - (a) a 3 year loan, (b) a 7 year loan,

(c) a 10 year loan, and (d) a 20-25 year loan.

2. Each of the four loans shall be raised by the creation

and issue of registered stock only:

Provided, however, that the holders of registered stock issued for the purpose of raising any of the four loans shall, on and after such date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published in the *Gazette* not later than six months after the conclusion of the present war, have the option of exchanging such stock for securities in the form of Government promissory notes.

- 3. The rate of interest payable shall—
- (a) in the case of the 3 year loan, be  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per centum per annum;
- (b) in the case of the 7 year loan, be 3 per centum per annum;
- (c) in the case of the 10 year loan, be  $3\frac{1}{4}$  per centum per annum; and
- (d) in the case of the 20–25 year loan, be  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per centum per annum.
- The dates in each year on which the half-yearly interest on each of the four loans shall be payable shall be the first day of June and the first day of December.
- 5. A half-yearly appropriation out of the general revenue and assets of Ceylon as a contribution to the sinking fund to be established for the purpose of redeeming each of the four loans shall---
  - (a) in the case of the 3 year loan, be made at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, and commence on the first day of June, 1945
  - (b) in the case of the 7 year loan, be made at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, and commence on the first day of June, 1946;
  - (c) in the case of the 10 year loan, be made at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, and commence on the first day of June, 1946;
  - (d) in the case of the 20-25 year loan, be made at the rate of 3 per centum per annum, and commence on the first day of June, 1946.
- 6. The date of redemption of the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising each of the four loans and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof shall-
  - (a) in the case of the 3 year loan, be the first day of June, 1946;
  - (b) in the case of the 7 year loan, be the first day of June,
  - (c) in the case of the 10 year loan, be the first day of June, 1953;
  - (d) in the case of the 20-25 year loan, be the first day of June, 1968:

Provided, however, that in the case of the 20-25 year loan, the Government shall, on such date subsequent to the first day of June, 1963, as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published, not less than six months prior to that date, in the Gazette and in two Ceylon newspapers, have the option of redeeming the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising that loan and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof.

The List will be opened on March 1, 1943, and will be closed on August 31, 1943, or earlier if the loan is fully subscribed.

# ISSUE OF Rs. 10,000,000. CEYLON GOVERNMENT HOME DEFENCE LOAN.

THIS LOAN WILL BE RAISED IN FOUR ISSUES AT THE OPTION OF THE APPLICANT :-

- (a) 2½ per cent. Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on June 1, 1946 ('A' Series).

- Treasury, Colombo, on June 1, 1946 (A. Series).

  (b) 3 per cent. Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on June 1, 1950.

  (c) 3\frac{1}{4} per cent. Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on June 1, 1953.

  (d) 3\frac{1}{2} per cent. Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on June 1, 1968, but the Government will have the option of redemption at part on or refer Lyric 1, 1963, on giving six calendar. par on or after June 1, 1963, on giving six calendar months' notice.

The allocation between the four issues will not be fixed, but the total amount issued will not exceed Rs. 10,000,000.

Authority.—The loan is raised on the authority of the Home Defence Loan Ordinance, No. 2 of 1942, and under the provisions of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance, 1937 (Chapter 289).

Purpose.—The entire proceeds of the loan will be used to finance any emergency expenditure which may become necessary as a result of the war.

Form of Issue.—The loan will be issued in the form of registered stock only. Holders of registered stock will, however, have the option of exchanging registered stock for promissory notes on and after a certain date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published in the Gazette not later than six months after the conclusion of the present war. (Leaflets containing the general conditions applicable to Registered Stock are available on application to the Public Debt Office.)

Issue Price.—The issue price is Rs. 100 per cent. payable in full at the time of application. The minimum holding is Rs. 100.

Applications.—Applications will be received by the Registrar, Public Debt Office, General Treasury, Colombo, from March 1, 1943, and until the list is closed. Applications must be on the proper form and must be accompanied by a remttance in full or by a receipt for the remittance from a Kacheheri or Bank-for mode of payment see under "Payment for Stock ".

When payment is made into a Kachcheri or a Bank, the application form may be forwarded through such Kacheheri or Bank.

A commission of 1/16 per cent. will be allowed to bankers, recognized stock-brokers, and brokers registered under the Coconut Products Ordinance in respect of applications bearing their stamp.

Payment for Stock .- Payments may be made personally or by post in cash or by cheque at the General Treasury, Colombo, or at any Kachcheri, or to the credit of Ceylon Government account in any of the following Banks in Colombo:

Bank of Ceylon. Chartered Bank of India, Australia and China. Eastern Bank, Limited. Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation. Imperial Bank of India. Mercantile Bank of India, Limited. National Bank of India, Limited.

Script.—Stock Certificates will be issued immediately after receipt and acceptance of the application.

Interest.—Interest on the four issues at the appropriate rate will be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of June and the 1st day of December in each year. The first payment of interest will be the amount of interest due for the period between the date on which the stock is purchased and the next half-yearly interest payment date, and a warrant for this amount payable on the next half-yearly interest payment date, will be attached to the script.

Taxation,-All documents used in the issue, exchange, transfer or redemption of the loan will be free from stamp duty. Interest to resident holders will be paid without deduction of Income Tax, but resident holders liable to Income Tax must include such interest in their income tax returns. Deduction of tax at source will be made from holdings by, non-residents, other than Empire Governments. (Current rate of income tax is 15 per cent. in the case of non-resident individuals and 18 per cent. in the case of non-resident companies). Persons who are exempt from Ceylon Income Tax will be entitled to repayment of the tax deducted. Holdings of Charities and Governments of Empire countries are exempt from Ceylon Income Tax.

Security.—The loan is secured on the general revenues and assets of the Ceylon Government. Four separate sinking funds will be formed for the redemption of the four issues of the loan under the management of the Deputy Chief Secretary and the Deputy Financial Secretary, who are the Trustees of the sinking funds. Half-yearly contributions at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum to the Sinking Fund of the 1946 loan will be commenced on 1st June, 1945, and to the 1950 and 1953 loans on 1st June, 1946, respectively. Contributions to the 1963-68 loan will be at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum and will commence on 1st June, 1946.

These contributions may be increased and will only be discontinued if and when the Trustees are satisfied that no further contributions will be required to ensure the repayment of the loans on the due dates.

Public Debt.—The public debt of Ceylon on September 30, 1941 (excluding war loans raised on behalf of the United Kingdom Government for which no sinking fund is formed as repayment will be made by the United Kingdom Government), amounted to Rs. 180,720,333. The approximate market value of the accumulated sinking fund amounted to Rs. 31,337,646. The net public debt is thus Rs. 149,382,687.

### THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

### Regulation.

(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall, during the continuance in force of this regulation, slaughter, or cause or permit any other person to slaughter, any cow, cow-calf, she-goat or female kid, in any place in Ceylon:

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit the slaughter of any cow or she-goat certified by a proper authority to be incapable of breeding or to be unfit to be used for purposes of breeding.

- (2) In this regulation, "proper authority" means a veterinary surgeon employed in the service of the Government or of a Municipal Council, and Urban Council, a Local Board, a Sanitary Board or a Village Committee, and, in relation to any place where there is no such veterinary surgeon, means a Medical Officer in charge of a Government Hospital, a Medical Officer of Health or a Field Medical Officer.
  - (3) This regulation may be cited as the Defence (Protection of Cows and She-goats) Regulation.
