THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

*Appointment of Competent Authority.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby appoint every Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, and Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) to be a competent authority for his Province, District or area, as the case may be, for the purpose of requisitioning under regulation 37 of those Regulations—

- (1) any agricultural or other implement of any description whatsoever used or capable of being used in connexion with the production of paddy, or the conversion of paddy into rice; and
- (2) buffaloes;

and accordingly, the Notification under the said regulation 3 published in *Gazette* No. 9,066 of January 15, 1943, shall be amended in Part I. of the Schedule thereto by the insertion, in column 3, immediately after paragraph (d) of item 4 set out therein, of the following:—

- “(e) Any agricultural or other implement of any description whatsoever used or capable of being used in connexion with the production of paddy, or the conversion of paddy into rice.  
(f) Buffaloes”.

## THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

*Regulations for St. Anne's Festival.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St. Anne's Festivals in March, 1943.

*Regulations.*

1. In these regulations the expression “camp area” means the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto, and “Assistant Government Agent” means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.
2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.
3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.
4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.
5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.  
(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.  
(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.
6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.
7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.
8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.
9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.
10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

*Order.*

1. This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Paper) (No. 3) Amendment Order.

2. The Controlled Articles (Paper) (No. 3) Order published in *Gazette* No. 9,067 of January 16, 1943, is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in paragraph 2, by the omission of clause (d);  
 (2) in paragraph 5, by the insertion, immediately after clause (k) of the following new clause:—

"(l) any card or ticket intended to be used for the purposes of a system of rationing any articles among the members of any club, hostel or other institution, or any sweep ticket, coupon or voucher exceeding 3½ inches by 2½ inches in size."

- (3) in paragraph 7—

(a) by the substitution, for sub-paragraph (1) of the following new sub-paragraph:—

"(1) No person shall, after the date on which this Order comes into force, print or order any form, bill-head, voucher, note paper for commercial purposes or other similar partly printed or ruled document intended to be written upon, unless the size of such form, bill-head, voucher, note paper or other such document is reduced as follows, that is to say, where the corresponding form, bill-head, voucher, note paper or other document printed or used by such person prior to the date on which this Order comes into force is of a size specified in column 1 hereunder, the size of the new form, bill-head, voucher, note paper or other document shall not exceed that specified in the corresponding entry in column 2:—

- (b) in sub-paragraph (2), by the substitution, for the words "at the foot of", of the word "on";  
 (c) by the insertion, immediately after sub-paragraph (4), of the following new sub-paragraph:—

"(5) The preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any sheets of paper printed or ordered for the purposes of any loose leaf book kept by any person at the date on which this Order comes into force."

- (4) in paragraph 8, by the substitution, for the words and figures "3½ inches by 5½ inches", wherever those words and figures occur collectively in that paragraph, of the words and figures "5½ inches by 4½ inches";  
 (5) by the numbering of paragraphs 12 and 13 as paragraphs 18 and 19, respectively;  
 (6) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 11, of the following new paragraphs:—

"12. (1) No person shall carry on business as a retail trader in paper unless he is for the time being registered under this Order as a retail trader.

(2) Every application for registration as a retail trader shall be made to the Controller and shall specify the premises at which the applicant carries on or proposes to carry on his business.

(3) The Controller may in his discretion determine whether or not any person is to be registered as a retail trader, and shall issue to every person who is registered by him as a retail trader a certificate to the effect that such person has been so registered.

(4) The Controller may cancel the registration of any person as a retail trader in paper if the Controller is satisfied, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary, that such person has contravened or failed to comply with any provisions of this Order.

13. Except under the authority of a permit in that behalf granted by the Controller, no retail trader in paper shall appropriate to his own use any quantity of paper kept by that trader for the purposes of trade or business.

14. No retail trader in paper shall sell or supply any quantity of paper to any person unless that person is the holder of a permit granted by the Controller authorising him to purchase that quantity of paper.

15. Except under the authority of a permit in that behalf granted by the Controller, no printer or retail trader in paper shall cut up any paper for the purpose of manufacturing stationery of any description.

16. The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit under paragraph 13 or paragraph 14 or paragraph 15 to any applicant therefor;  
 (b) determine and specify in any permit granted under paragraph 13 or paragraph 14 or paragraph 15, the quantity of paper which any such applicant may be authorised to appropriate or purchase or cut up, as the case may be.

17. Every retail trader in paper shall—

- (a) keep and maintain, in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose, such records, relating to stocks of paper held, purchased, acquired, sold, used or otherwise disposed of by such trader, as the Controller may from time to time require for the purposes of this Order;  
 (b) furnish to the Controller such returns and information, relating to such stocks and to the purchase, acquisition, use or disposal of such stocks, as the Controller may from time to time require for the purposes of this Order."

- (7) in the re-numbered paragraph 19, by the substitution, for the definition of "paper", of the following new definition:—

"paper" includes all descriptions (whether homogeneous or laminated) of paper, paperboard, pulpboard, wallboard, and fibreboard, which are produced wholly or mainly either from vegetable fibres or a pulp thereof or both from such fibres and such pulp, and which have not been converted; and the expression "convert" in relation to paper means the use of paper, after the production thereof has been completed, as a material in any manufacture.

## Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Navigation (Rivers) Order, 1943.

2. Where any floating bridge, intended for use wholly or mainly by members of any of His Majesty's forces or by vehicles belonging to or used for the purposes of any such forces, has been constructed or is under construction across any river—

(a) an authorised officer may take such measures, whether by means of booms or other devices or the affixing of notices or otherwise, as may be necessary for preventing or regulating the passage of vessels on the water area adjacent to such bridge;

(b) no vessel shall proceed or attempt to proceed on such water area, unless permitted so to do by directions or signals given in that behalf by a member of His Majesty's forces, or except along such route and at such time as may be indicated by any such directions or signals;

and

(c) the master of any vessel which is permitted to proceed on such water area shall, if directed so to do by an authorised officer, permit the vessel, while so proceeding, to be towed in such manner as that officer may direct.

3. In this Order, "authorised officer" means any senior officer of police or any person holding a commission in any of His Majesty's forces, and includes any other person appointed by the Governor to be an authorised officer for the purposes of this Order.

(1) Regulation 35 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,533, of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent regulation, is hereby further amended, in paragraph (3) of that Regulation, by the insertion immediately before the definition of "military purposes" of the following:—

"land" includes—

- (a) parts of houses and buildings;
- (b) land covered with water; and
- (c) any part of the territorial waters of Ceylon;

(2) Every Order under Regulation 35 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, made by the Governor prior to the date on which this Regulation comes into force, shall be, and shall be deemed to have been, for all purposes as valid and effectual as if the amendment effected in the said Regulation 35 by paragraph (1) of this Regulation had been in force at the time such Order was made.

THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 OF 1939.

Order under sections 21 and 30.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Ratnapura Urban Council published in *Gazette* No. 7,797 of August 8, 1930, and the Order relating to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Ratnapura published in that *Gazette*;
- (2) order under section 30 that, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Ratnapura Urban Council shall consist of nine members and the town of Ratnapura shall be divided into nine electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto;
- (3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Ratnapura Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative; and
- (4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Ratnapura Urban Council, who are in office at the date hereof, as extended by Order under section 2 of the Local Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Ordinance, No. 30 of 1942.

### Electoral Divisions of the Town of Ratnapura.

#### Electoral Division No. 1, Pulungupitiya.

*North*: From the southern end of the culvert over Kotambe-ela on the main road to Panadure where the said road crosses the western limit of the Urban Council area eastwards along the said limit as far as the landmark which is 4 chains north-east of the north-eastern corner of lot 12 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/3-2 East, thence south-eastwards in a line to the centre of the junction of Weralupe-Nambapana main roads, thence eastwards in a line to the centre of Katugas-ela, thence eastwards along the centre line of the said ela to the centre of the bridge on Weralupe old road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Weralupe old road, westwards along the centre line of main road, southwards and eastwards along the centre line of Helling's road, south-eastwards along the centre line of main road, south-westwards along the centre line of Wace road, westwards along the centre line of Hospital road, south-westwards along the centre line of Browning road to a point about 1½ chains south of the 1½ mile stone on the said road.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Browning road till it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area.

*West*: From the last mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

#### Electoral Division No. 2, Weralupe.

*North*: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area north-eastwards along the said limit as far as the north-western corner of lot 17½ (railway reservation) in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 19/59-2 East.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area as far as the centre of Katugas-ela, thence southwards along the centre line of the said ela as far as the centre of the bridge on the Inner Circular road, thence north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the Railway Approach road, thence south-westwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the main road, thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with Helling's road.

*South*: From the last mentioned point westwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 1 as far as a point due east of the north-eastern corner of lot 65 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/3-2 East.

*West*: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 1 to its northern extremity, thence westwards and north-westwards along the northern limit of Division No. 1 till it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area, thence north-westwards along the said limit to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 3, Pempakelle.*

*North*: From the centre of Katugas-ela where it crosses the northern limit of the Urban Council area north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area as far as the centre of the Mahawela estate road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the Mahawela estate road and southwards along the centre line of Malwala road to the centre of its junction with the main road.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the main road, northwards along the centre line of Inner Circular road and north-westwards along the centre line of the Goods Shed road and Inner Circular road to the centre of its junction with the Railway Approach road.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 2 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 4, Godiyomawa.*

*North*: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 3 eastwards, north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of Kalu-ganga.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Kalu-ganga to a point in prolongation of the south-western boundary of lot 47 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/4-2 East.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Kalu-ganga to a point in prolongation eastwards of the centre line of Warakatota road, thence westwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the main road.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-eastwards along the centre line of the main road till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 3, thence north-eastwards along the said limit and north-westwards along the eastern limit of the said Division to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 5, Angammaana.*

*North*: From the centre of the bridge on the main road over Kalu-ganga north-eastwards along the southern and eastern limits of Division No. 4 till it meets the northern limit of the Urban Council area, thence south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the rock landmark about 2 chains and 80 links south-east of the northernmost corner of lot 1 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/5-1 East.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-eastwards and south-westwards along the northern and eastern limits of the Urban Council area as far as the centre of the bridge on Batugedara main road over Ketan-dola.

*South*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of Batugedara main road to the centre of its junction with Batugedara old road.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of Batugedara main road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 6, Batugedara.*

*North*: From the centre of the confluence of Kalu-ganga and Ethoya-ela eastwards along the centre line of Kalu-ganga till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 4, thence north-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the western limit of Division No. 5.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-eastwards along the western and southern limits of Division No. 5 till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

*South*: From the last mentioned point westwards along the eastern and southern limits of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of Ethoya-ela.

*West*: From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Ethoya-ela to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 7, Bazaar.*

*North*: From the centre of the junction of the main road and the Railway Approach road north-eastwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 2, till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 3, thence south-eastwards along the said limit to the centre of the junction of the Goods Shed road and Inner Circular road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point southwards along the southern limit of Division No. 3 till it meets the western limit of Division No. 4.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the western limit of Division No. 4 to the centre of the junction of the main road and Warakatota road, thence north-westwards along the centre line of the main road to the centre of its junction with Wace road.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of the main road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 8, Fort.*

*North*: From the centre of the junction of Wace road and Riverside road north-eastwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 1 till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 7, thence south-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 4, thence eastwards along the said limit as far as the centre of the junction of Warakatota road and Riverside road.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Riverside road to a point in prolongation of the north-eastern boundary of lot 16 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/4-3 East.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Riverside road to a point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains north-west of the north-western corner of lot 32 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/4-3 East.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of Riverside road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

*Electoral Division No. 9, Mudduwa.*

*North*: From a point on the eastern limit of Division No. 1 in prolongation of the north-western boundary of lot 4 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/3-4 East north-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the western limit of Division No. 8, thence south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the western and southern limits of Division No. 8, till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 4, thence eastwards along the said limit till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 6.

*East*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the northern and western limits of Division No. 6 till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area, thence south-westwards along the said limit as far as the landmark at the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of lot 45 in Ratnapura Town Survey sheet L 24/11-2 East.

*South*: From the last mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the southern and western limits of the Urban Council area as far as the landmark at the western extremity of the southern boundary of lot 45 in Ratnapura Town Survey Sheet L 24/11-2 East.

*West*: From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the southern limit of Division No. 1, thence north-eastwards along the southern and eastern limits of Division No. 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.
