THE VISITING FORCES (BRITISH COMMONWEALTH) ACT, 1933,
AND THE ALLIED FORCES ACT, 1940.

Order.

WHEREAS a request has been made by the United States Naval Liaison Officer, being the officer commanding American forces in Ceylon, for the issue of general orders in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 1 (5) of the Visiting Forces (British Commonwealth) Act, 1933, as applied with adaptations and modifications by the United States of America (Visiting Forces) Order, 1942, and the United States of America (Visiting Forces) (Colonies &c.) Order, 1942, for the purpose of enabling the service courts and service authorities of the United States of America to exercise more effectively within Ceylon their jurisdiction in relation to members of the American forces:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said section 1 (5) of the aforesaid Act, as applied by the Orders hereinbefore recited, do by this Order, authorise any member of the naval, military or air forces of His Majesty, raised in the United Kingdom, who is on patrol, picket or police duties, to arrest and to detain in custody any member of the American forces alleged to have been guilty of an offence punishable under the law of the United States of America, and to hand over any such member to the appropriate authorities of the American forces.

WHEREAS a request has been made by the Commander-in-Chief, Netherlands Forces in the East, for the issue of general orders in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 1 (5) of the Visiting Forces (British Commonwealth) Act, 1933, as applied with adaptations and modifications by the Allied Forces (Application of 23 Geo. 5. c. 6) (No. 1) Order, 1940, and the Allied Forces (Application of Acts to Colonies &c.) (No. 1) Order, 1941, for the purpose of enabling the service courts and service authorities of the Netherlands to exercise more effectively the powers conferred upon them by the Allied Forces Act, 1940:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said section 1 (5) of the aforesaid Act, as applied by the Orders hereinbefore recited, do by this Order direct the members of the naval, military or air forces of His Majesty, raised in

the United Kingdom, who are on patrol, picket or police duties, to arrest any member of the Netherlands forces alleged to have been guilty of any offence against the law of the Netherlands and to hand over any person so arrested to the appropriate authorities of the Netherlands forces.

Incorporation of the Trustees of the Paulu Silva Buddhist Educational Society, Limited, Katana.

Order under Section 114 of the Trusts Ordinance.

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Paulu Silva Buddhist Educational Society, Limited, Katana, namely—

The Hon'ble Sir Don Baron Jayatilleke,
Mrs. Nancy Perera Kumarasinghe, widow of the late Sembukuttiaratchige Paulu Silva Appuhamy,
Mr. Don Charles Wijewardene,
Mrs. Wimalawathie Wijewardene nee Silva, and
Mr. Tudor Ranesinghe, J.P., U.M.

have applied to the Governor for their incorporation under section 114 of the Trusts Ordinance (Chapter 72):

Now therefore by virtue of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid section, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order authorise the incorporation of the said Trustees and direct and declare, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule hereto—

- that the said Trustees and their successors for the time being duly appointed under the rules of the said Trust be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal under the name and style of "Paulu Silva Buddhist Educational Society Limited";
- that by that name and style they may receive, take and hold all descriptions of property both movable and immovable on behalf of the said Trust; and
- that they shall be able and competent in law to sue and be sued, to answer and be answered, in any court or elsewhere in all causes and actions, to which the said Trust is a party.

This Order may be revoked, or from time to time be varied, or amended as may appear to be necessary.

Schedule.

- The name of the Society shall be "Paulu Silva Buddhist Educational Society Limited". The registered office of the Society shall be at Katana along the Kochehikade-Halpa road.
- The object of the Society shall be, as directed by the late Sembukuttiaratchige Paulu Silva Appuhamy, by his last will No. 7484 dated 16th June, 1910, attested by W. B. de Fry, Notary Public, and proved in Testamentary Case No. 1637 of the District Court of Negombo—

- to open, establish, upkeep and develop Buddhist Vernacular Schools in the Island and have such schools under the control and management of the Board of Trustees appointed in the above last will and their successors acting as the Executive Committee of the Society,
- to take over the management and control of any existing Buddhist School or Schools in the Island and develop and maintain the same, and
- to take over the control and management of such share of the estate of the late Sembukuttiaratchige Paulu Silva Appuhamy as is now vested in the Trustees and described in the list of properties set out hereunder.

3. The members of the Society shall be the present Trustees namely—

- The Hon'ble Sir Don Baron Jayatilleke,
- Mrs. Nancy Perera Kumarasinghe, widow of the late Sembukuttiaratchige Paulu Silva Appuhamy,
- Mr. Don Charles Wijewardene,
- Mrs. Wimalawathie Wijewardene nee Silva, and
- Mr. Tudor Ranesinghe, J.P., U.M.,

who have been appointed in terms of the above last will, and in the event of the refusal to act or the death or resignation of any such Trustees, the successor or successors to be nominated and appointed as provided in the said will, by the remaining or surviving Trustees.

4. The funds of the Society shall be applied for the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the different properties belonging to the estate and for the carrying out of the objects for which the Society is formed and the Trust created. No

member or Trustee shall be entitled to any benefit or remuneration out of the funds of the trust estate or any other funds that the Society may become entitled to by way of donations, subscription or in any other manner.

5. The meetings of the Society shall be held at least once a year and at such other time as may be found necessary by the President, or at the written request of any two members of the Society. The annual general meeting of the Society shall be held during the month of March of every year, and not less than fifteen days' notice shall be given to all members of such meeting. Any member desiring to bring forward a resolution shall give at least ten days' notice in writing to the Secretary.

Three members shall form the quorum for a meeting of the Society. The voting at meetings, if so desired by a majority of those present, may be by secret ballot.

6. Notice of not less than one month shall be given to all members before an existing rule is amended or rescinded or a new rule is adopted.

7. (1) The management of the Society shall be carried on by the Trustees appointed in accordance with the terms of the last will above referred to acting as the Executive Committee. The office bearers of the Society shall be a President, Secretary, Treasurer and a Manager of Schools, and any of the above offices, except that of President may be combined and one person appointed to such of the combined offices, if it be found necessary, for the better and efficient carrying out of the objects of the Society. The Committee shall meet at such periods and on such dates as may from time to time be decided upon and three days' notice of such meeting shall be given to the members. No member of the Society shall cease to be a member except by death or resignation, but an office bearer whose conduct is found detrimental to the best interests of the Society may be removed from office.

(2) All officers of the Society shall be appointed and removed by the Executive Committee and the teachers to the schools shall be appointed and discontinued by the Manager of the Schools.

8. The funds of the Society shall be deposited in the Bank of Ceylon and the account shall be operated on by the Secretary and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall keep an account of all sums of money received and expended and other books of account connected therewith.

9. The accounts of the Society shall be audited once a year and shall be made up to 31st day of December of every year and shall be submitted to a general meeting of the Society with the auditor's report for consideration and adoption.

10. The members of the Society shall in no case be more than five.

11. Any member or person having an interest in the funds of the Society shall be entitled to inspect any of the books of the Society including all books of account at the office of the Society.

12. No fines or forfeitures shall be imposed on any member of the Society.

13. There shall be no branch societies of the Society.

14. All disputes between Society and any of its members or any person claiming through a member or under any of the rules of the Society shall be settled by the Society at a special or general meeting.

1939 AND 1940.

(27c)

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Service Motor Cars) Regulations, published in *Gazette* No. 9,009 of September 18, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for regulation 3, of the following new regulation:—

3. For the purposes of these regulations, "authorised officer"—

(a) in relation to any service motor car belonging to His Majesty or used by any of His Majesty's forces, means any of the following:—

- (i.) the Officer Commanding the Troops, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority;
- (ii.) the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority; or
- (iii.) the Captain Superintendent, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority;

(b) in relation to any service motor car belonging to the Government of the United States of America or used by any of the armed forces of that Government, means the United States Naval Liaison Officer;

(c) in relation to any service motor car belonging to the Government of the Netherlands or used by any of the armed forces of that Government, means the Commander-in-Chief, Netherlands Forces in the East, or any other officer acting under his authority; and

(d) in relation to any service motor car belonging to the Government of any other foreign allied power or used by any of the armed forces of any such power, means such officer as may be designated for the purpose by the Governor by notification published in the *Gazette*;

(2) in regulation 4—

(a) by the insertion, immediately before the definition of "His Majesty's forces", of the following:—

2. Salary scale Class II. Rs. 480—30—960; Class I. Rs. 1,008—48—Rs. 1,200; Special Class Rs. 1,200—60—Rs. 1,620. Promotion to the higher grades is selective. Confirmation in appointment after 2 years is dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and on the passing of an examination in (1) Sinhalese and Tamil (conversation and interpretation), (2) Rules, Regulations, and Procedure relating to Hospital Accounts and administration and (3) Typewriting. The required standard in typewriting is 25 words per minute with not more than 5 mistakes per 100 words.

3. Viva voce Test will precede the Examination and will be conducted by a Selection Board of 3 members appointed by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. The date, time and place of the *viva voce* as well as the date of written examination will be notified to the candidates. Candidates are required to produce at the *viva voce* test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the Hospital Clerical Service Examination as well as the originals of the character certificates attached to their applications and certified copies of birth certificates.

In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.
