By-law.

The by-laws of the Municipal Council of Kandy published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 6,165 of January 11, 1907, as amended by by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 7,745 of November 15, 1929, are hereby further amended under the heading "Eating-houses" by the addition, immediately before by-law 300, of the following new by-law:—

"299A. No person shall, in any place or premises other than an eating-house licensed in accordance with the conditions and regulations hereinafter set out, or a house or premises for which a licence has been obtained under the Excise Ordinance, sell or expose for sale any meals prepared or supplied for human consumption."

THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 of 1939.

Order under sections 21 and 30.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Matara Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Matara, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,278 of March 19, 1937;
- (2) order under section 30 that, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) the Matara Urban Council shall consist of ten members and the town of Matara shall be divided into ten electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto;
- (3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Matara Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative; and
- (4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Matara Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

Candidates should write their full names legibly on the application and give full particulars of the examination for which they are entering and the subjects they are offering.

Officers in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the First or Second examination, and whether they intend taking Sinhalese or Tamil. Civil Service candidates offering Sinhalese or Tamil at the Second Examination should state whether they are entering for the Lower Paper or the Higher Paper.

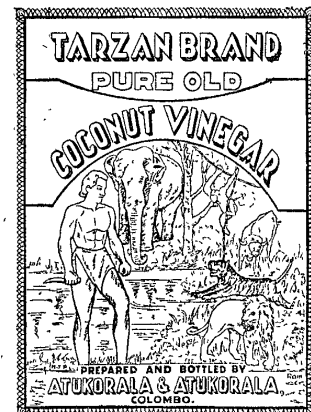
