Panama Pattu village area situated in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Panama pattu in the Batticaloa District, and defined in Schedule B to the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,202 of February 14, 1936.

1. Pottuvil village area consisting of Pottuvil Division No. 1 and Pottuvil Division No. 2.

2. Panama village area consisting of Buckmitiyawa, Hulanuge, Kmama, Kitulana, Komari, Kumbukgolla, Kumama, Lahugala, Mangalamaha-vihare, Mirahala, Morana, Okanda, Panama, Pottuvil Division No. 3, Radella, Salawa and Yalpotta.

1. In this Schedule—

“Panama Pattu village area” means the Panama Pattu village area specified in column 1 of the preceding Schedule A;

“Pottuvil village area” means the Pottuvil village area specified in column 2 of the said Schedule A; and

“Panama village area” means the Panama village area specified in column 2 of the said Schedule A.

2. (1) Such of the immovable property vested in the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as is situated in the Pottuvil village area shall, on July 1, 1943, vest in the Village Committee of the Pottuvil village area.

(ii) Such of the immovable property vested in the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as is situated in the Panama village area shall, on July 1, 1943, vest in the Village Committee of the Panama village area.

3. (i) Such of the movable property vested in the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as is specified in column 1 of the succeeding Schedule C shall, on July 1, 1943, vest in the Village Committee of the Pottuvil village area.

(ii) Such of the movable property vested in the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as is specified in column 2 of the said Schedule C shall, on July 1, 1943, vest in the Village Committee of the Panama village area.

4. One-half of the total sum of money lying in the communal fund of the Panama Pattu village area on June 30, 1943, shall on July 1, 1943, be credited to the communal fund of the Pottuvil village area, and the other half of that total sum of money shall on the last mentioned date be credited to the communal fund of the Panama village area.

5. (i) Such of the rights, debts, liabilities, and obligations of the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as relate to the Pottuvil village area shall, on July 1, 1943, be transferred to the Village Committee of the Pottuvil village area.

(ii) Such of the rights, debts, liabilities, and obligations of the Village Committee of the Panama Pattu village area as relate to the Panama village area shall, on July 1, 1943, be transferred to the Village Committee of the Panama village area.

6. All by-laws in force in the Panama Pattu village area on June 30, 1943, shall, on and after July 1, 1943, be in force in the Pottuvil village area and the Panama village area as if those by-laws have been made by the Village Committee of the Pottuvil village area or the Village Committee of the Panama village area, as the case may be.

WHEREAS it is expedient for administrative and revenue purposes to alter the limits of the Divisional Revenue Officers' Divisions of Wellabada Pattu, Gangabada Pattu, and Bentota-Walallawiti Korale, in the Galle District of the Southern Province:

Now, therefore, Know Ye that I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by this Proclamation, declare that the limits of the Divisional Revenue Officers' Divisions aforesaid shall, with effect from July 1, 1943, be altered as follows:—

- (1) by the exclusion of the Village Headman's Divisions of Polgahawila, Ambana, and Pinikahana from the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellabada Pattu;
- (2) by the addition of the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila to the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Gangabada Pattu; and
- (3) by the addition of the Village Headman's Divisions of Ambana and Pinikahana to the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Bentota-Walallawiti Korale.

- (1) alter and redefine the limits of each of the village areas enumerated in column 1 of Schedule A hereto in the manner set out in the corresponding entry in column 2 of that Schedule;
- (2) provide in the manner set out in Schedule B hereto for the matters necessary to give effect to such alteration and definition; and
- (3) declare that this Proclamation shall come into effect on the first day of July, 1943.

Hikkaduwa village area (defined in the Schedule to the Proclamation published in <i>Gazette</i> No. 7,809 of October 10, 1930).	There shall be excluded from the Hikkaduwa village area the Village Headman's Divisions of Polgahawila, Ambana, and Pinikahana.
Baddegama village area (defined in the Proclamation published in <i>Gazette</i> No. 8,695 of December 13, 1940).	There shall be added to the Baddegama village area the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila.
Elpitiya village area (defined in Schedule A to the Proclamation published in <i>Gazette</i> No. 8,142 of August 30, 1935).	There shall be added to the Elpitiya village area the Village Headman's Divisions of Ambana and Pinikahana.

Schedule B.

1. A new ward of the Baddegama village area having been created by the addition to that village area of the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila, the Government Agent of the Southern Province shall take all steps necessary for the election of a member for that ward as if there were a casual vacancy in the Village Committee of that village area.

2. (1) All movable and immovable property vested in the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area and lying or situated in the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila shall vest in the Village Committee of the Baddegama village area.

(2) All movable and immovable property vested in the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area and lying or situated in the Village Headman's Division of Ambana or Pinikahana shall vest in the Village Committee of the Elpitiya village area.

3. The Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area shall be entitled to collect or recover, in respect of the year 1943, any tax or licence duty which has been imposed by that Committee before July 1, 1943, and which may be due from any person resident, or owning or possessing property, in the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila, or Ambana, or Pinikahana.

4. (1) Where any person resident, or owning or possessing property, in the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila has paid or pays, in respect of the year 1943, any tax or licence duty imposed before July 1 of that year by the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area, that person shall not be liable to pay, in respect of that year, any similar tax or licence duty imposed by the Village Committee of the Baddegama village area.

(2) Where any person resident, or owning or possessing property, in the Village Headman's Division of Ambana or

Pinikahana has paid or pays, in respect of the year 1943, any tax or licence duty imposed before July 1 of that year by the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area, that person shall not be liable to pay, in respect of that year, any similar tax or licence duty imposed by the Village Committee of the Elpitiya village area.

5. (1) The Gansabawala Officer at Polgahawila, who is in the service of the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area, shall be transferred to the service of, and shall be employed by, the Village Committee of the Baddegama village area on the remuneration and terms of employment on which that Officer is in the first mentioned service.

(2) The midwife at Pinikahana and the Gansabawala Officers at Ambana and Pinikahana, who are in the service of the Village Committee of the Hikkaduwa village area, shall be transferred to the service of, and shall be employed by, the Village Committee of the Elpitiya village area on the remuneration and terms of employment on which they are in the first mentioned service.

6. The Village Tribunal of Hikkaduwa shall have jurisdiction to proceed with every action pending before that Tribunal on June 30, 1943, in which the party defendant is resident or the cause of action has arisen, or which relates to an offence committed, within the Village Headman's Division of Polgahawila, or Ambana, or Pinikahana.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

"11A. No person shall, unless authorised in writing so to do by the Chairman, enter, use or remain within any building in any village market except for the purpose of selling, keeping or exposing for sale, inspecting, purchasing or removing articles authorised to be sold in the market.

*By-laws.***Capitation Tax.***Exemption.*

1. The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax:—

- (a) accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination;
- (b) members of the Ceylon Defence Force;
- (c) railway telegraph linesmen; and
- (d) persons over fifty-five years of age.

Preparation of lists.

2. The person or persons authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall, on or before December 1 in each year, prepare, in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.

3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever required by the Chairman or by any duly authorised person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purposes of the preparation of the list, or furnish all such information, written or oral, as may be required, relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the householder himself), and the name, age, race, and other particulars of each such person.

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office of the Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from December 1 to 31 of that year.

5. Any person whose name is included in the list may, by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before January 31 next succeeding, object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter, or that he has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the liability to pay the capitation tax. The Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider necessary, make such order as may seem to him just.

6. Any person not already exempted under by-law 1 may, on or before February 15, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such liability for that year, or for life, or for such other period as he may think fit, on the ground that such person is, by reason of bodily infirmity or disease, incapable of performing labour.

7. The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-law 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman, on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

Annual programme of work.

8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before March 15 in each year—

- (a) prepare a programme of all the items of work which have to be constructed or maintained during that year;
- (b) determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him;
- (c) determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

(2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1) shall be published by the Chairman, as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that area.

(3) In the case of any item of work not included in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1), any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period, but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

Commutation of tax.

10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money, at the rate determined by the Committee under by-law 8 (1), on or before March 31 or such later date in that year as the Committee may fix with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, information shall be given in the village area by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman, specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour, and the hours of work on each such day. The persons required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name, or as inhabitants of any specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

Performance of labour.

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited, or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

Performance or commutation of double labour.

14. Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13 shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be liable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days in respect of each day on which he is in default.

15. Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perform such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by-law 8 (1): Provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14 and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. Such notice shall not require any person to perform labour for any period exceeding in length the total number of days for which such person is liable to perform labour under by-law 14.

17. The by-laws published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 6,197 of July 26, 1907, as amended by the by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 7,589 of June 17, 1927, and therein called "Rules", are hereby further amended, in so far as they relate to the village area, by the rescission of by-laws 1 to 13 under the heading Chapter 1.

18. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;

"Committee" means the Village Committee;

"list" means the list of persons liable to pay the capitation tax in the village area.

The British Rubber Producers Research Association.

"Improvements in the preparation of purified latex and of rubber therefrom".

Abstract.—British Patent Specification No. 521,436 describes a method of purifying latex by heating the latex under normal pressure with lye at boiling temperature, followed by dialysis of the alkali-treated latex. The composition of this purified latex as regards nitrogen content, ash-content, &c., is remarkably constant in spite of varying conditions such as tapping system, climatological and soil conditions, season, type and age of trees, &c.

An improvement in this process consists in centrifuging the alkali treated latex while still hot in an atmosphere of nitrogen before dialysis. This removes the suspended inorganic as well as the nitrogen-containing and organic compounds.

The inventors claim that this process yields a product which even in abnormal seasonal variations yield a normal product; and that in normal seasons it yields an improved product characterized by a lower nitrogen and ash-content, and higher resistance to water-absorption in the crepe.

"Improved method and device for preventing rain water reaching the tapping cut and the collecting cup thereby saving loss of rubber latex".

Abstract.—At intervals of about 4 inches the tapper leaves a strip of bark $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick untapped. A hood made of metal or alternatively of oil cloth, rubber or canvas stretched on a wire frame is fixed on this bark in such a way as to protect the tapping cut from driving rain. Above the tapping panel, one or more shallow incisions are made in the trunk at an angle to the horizontal, whose function it is to divert the water trickling down the trunk from reaching the tapping panel. A special knife is used for making these incisions. Any water that flows between the hood and the strip of bark and is not conducted away by the strip of bark itself, drips into a trough which is fixed under the strip. A special spout holds the latex cup and cover in position.

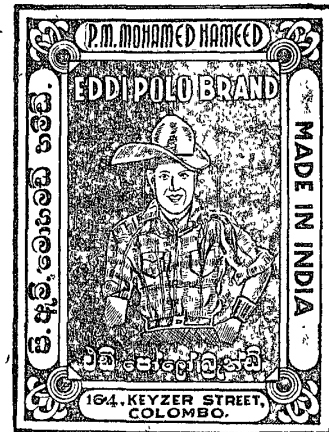
