THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES  
ORDINANCE.

Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7481 of August 28, 1925, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification revoke the Notification of March 10, 1943, published in *Gazette* No. 9,096 of March 12, 1943, confirming the declaration of a "diseased locality" made by the Government Agent, North-Western Province.

THE EXCESS PROFITS DUTY ORDINANCE.

Order.

The following shall be the circumstances in which and the terms and conditions subject to which, relief may be granted in respect of the intensive production of rubber in any place outside Ceylon in cases where excess profits duty is payable, under the Excess Profits Duty Ordinance, No. 39 of 1942, on the profits arising from the production of such rubber:—

- (1) In each case the Commissioner of Income Tax must be satisfied that the rubber industry in the place where such rubber was produced was subject at the time of the production of that rubber to a law which is substantially the same as the Rubber Control Ordinance, No. 63 of 1938.
- (2) The amount to be deducted in each case by way of relief in determining the profits arising from the production of such rubber shall be ascertained, as far as possible, in the manner provided by section 4A of the Excess Profits Duty Ordinance; and in the application of that section to any such case the expressions "estate", "year of control" and "standard production" shall have such meanings as

the Commissioner of Income Tax may determine having due regard to such law, corresponding to the Rubber Control Ordinance aforesaid, as may have been in force at that place at the time of the production of such rubber.

#### Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1942.

THE vital statistics for Ceylon for the year 1942, present the following important features :—

- (a) The marriage rate, 15.1 per thousand of the population is the highest recorded since 1902.
- (b) The birth rate, 36.7 per thousand of the population, is the highest since 1937.
- (c) The death rate, 18.6 per thousand of the population, is the lowest recorded during the present century.
- (d) The infant mortality rate, 120 per thousand births, is the lowest ever recorded.

*Population.*

The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1942, was 6,083,000, as against 6,061,000 on December 31, 1941. The births registered during the year exceeded the deaths by 109,020 and the number of emigrants exceeded the number of immigrants by 86,866.

*Marriages.*

The number of marriages registered under the Marriage Registration Ordinance and the Kanyan Marriage Ordinance during 1942 was 42,509 (General 33,164; Kandyan 9,345). On this basis the marriage rate of the non-Muslim population was 15.1 per 1,000 as against 11.4 in 1941. There were 6,012 Muslim marriages, with a resulting rate of 29.7 per 1,000 of the Muslim population as against 22.4 in the previous year.

*Births.*

221,064 births, 112,346 of males and 108,718 of females, were registered in the Island during the year. The birth-rate was 36.7 per 1,000 of the total population, as against 36.5 per thousand in 1941. The sex-ratio at birth was 1,033 males to 1,000 females. In the city of Colombo the birth-rate was 28.5 per thousand as against 45.3 per thousand in the previous year. There were 33,063 births on estates, as against 36,182 in 1941.

*Deaths.*

The number of deaths registered during the year was 112,044, 58,745 of males and 53,299 of females, with a resulting death-rate of 18.6 per 1,000 of the population. The death-rate in the previous year was 18.8 per thousand. In the city of Colombo the death-rate was 15.9 per thousand, as against 24.2 per thousand in the previous year. 11,535 deaths were registered on estates in 1942, as against 12,054 in 1941.

*Infant Mortality.*

The number of infant deaths registered during the year was 26,636, with a resulting infant mortality rate of 120 per 1,000 births, as against 129 per 1,000 births in 1941. The city of Colombo had an infant mortality rate of 116 per thousand births as against one of 136 per thousand births in the previous year. The infant mortality rate on estates, remained the same as in 1941—123 per thousand births.

(All figures in this report are subject to revision. Statistics of deaths registered as due to war operations have been excluded).

His invention relates to a cup holder made of cane or "wal" in the shape of a figure of eight, one loop of which is adapted to support the cup, whilst the other is tied tightly round the tree. The advantage claimed for this type of holder is that the material for it is obtainable in large quantities in Ceylon, and that due to its elastic properties it expands with the growth of the tree.

"An improved and simplified method of packing of crude rubber for shipment and transit by land and sea in any climate."

*Abstract.*—The inventor describes a method of baling crude rubber in which the rubber sheets are packed in a rectangular box made by pasting rubber sheets together, and covered with another box of similar design. The outside of the box is treated with a "wash" consisting of talcum powder suspended in a solution of preserved rubber in soap and water, the object of which is to prevent sticking. The box is filled with sheets and is clamped down under pressure. When the rubber has set the clamp is removed. The rectangular package so formed has no sharp corners, and saves shipping space, due to the employment of rubber alone for packing.

The inventor states that the case can be used for manufacture in just the same way as its contents; if necessary, the wash can be scrubbed off.
