THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)  
REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera are enemies within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of their residence in Kuala Lumpur, now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations:

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera became enemies within the meaning of the said Regulations, the said Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera duly appointed Mrs. Annie Helen Perera the attorney of each of them in Ceylon (hereinafter referred to as the "Attorney"):

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Attorney and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now therefore, I Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the Attorney to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Reginald A. M. Perera and Charles V. J. Perera through the aforesaid Attorney.

#### THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF TEXTILE) (No. 1) REGULATIONS, 1943.

IN terms of Regulation 42 (a) of the above regulations the following notice is published for general information.

#### Textiles Control Notice No. 1.

All textiles dealers all over the Island should note the following points:—

1. The Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 1) Regulations came into force immediately on their proclamation in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,102 of March 22, 1943. Every dealer in "Regulated" (i.e., Controlled) Textiles, including hawkers, should comply with para. 2 of my notice in the Colombo English newspapers of March 24, and certain Sinhalese and Tamil newspapers of March 25 or 26, 1943.
2. For the time being, only the Textiles mentioned in the First Schedule to the Regulations come under control.
3. Attention is drawn to the definitions of landed cost and purchase cost in Regulation 2. Unless the documents

referred to in those definitions are kept ready for production, when inspections are made, the regulated prices calculated cannot be accepted.

4. Regulation 4 shows how regulated prices should be calculated in respect of each class of business.

5. Regulation 6 requires that schedules of prices should be ready by April 13, 1943, at the latest, but it is requested that transactions should take place at regulated prices meanwhile—to earn the goodwill of the consumers, and the confidence of this Department.

6. According to Regulation 7, all calculations by which regulated prices are arrived at for existing stocks and stocks imported or purchased in future, and all documents from which such calculations should have been made should be kept methodically and produced for verification.

7. Attention is invited to Regulation 14 against starting new class of textile business.

8. Regulations 16 and 17 deal with licensing, which will be begun in due course. Dealers are referred to para. 8 of the press notice mentioned in para. 1 above. Those who were not *bona fide* in the textiles trade in the open market in the first week of January, 1943, are advised to sell out stocks as early as possible, and go out of the textiles trade.

9. Regulation 23 refers to the subject of cross buying and comes into operation at a later date. Nevertheless, dealers are requested to refrain from cross buying even now, both in their own interests and in those of the consumers. If they do not so refrain, they may find themselves in trouble after Regulation 23 becomes operative.

10. Regulation 27 deals with invoices, debit notes, purchase bills and other such documents, and must be carefully complied with at once. No transaction may now take place without supporting documents.

11. Regulation 28 requires a register of stocks to be kept in the prescribed form from April 1, 1943, by every class of dealer other than a hawker. Every dealer should therefore take stock of controlled textiles held by him, or by any other person on his behalf, or by him on any other person's behalf on April 1, 1943. A declaration of such stocks will be necessary when applications for licensing are called for by a press notice in due course.

12. Regulation 32 imposes on every dealer the obligation to sell from stocks held. Attention is particularly invited to para. (4) of this Regulation. Those dealers who have hitherto sold wholesale in bulk and wholesale to other dealers must continue to do so. A certain proportion of a wholesaler's stock must be sold in bulk as hitherto, and a similar proportion must be sold wholesale also to secure a fair distribution of stocks all over the Island. This can best be done with the genuine co-operation of every wholesaler, and it should be given in full measure.

13. Attention is drawn to Regulation 35 which makes the dealer responsible for the acts of his employees, to whom the provisions of the Control Scheme should be carefully explained.

14. Regulation 36 provides for penalties, which it is hoped every dealer will make every effort to avoid earning honest trading always pays.

15. Traders are warned not to exact any payment not shown in bills. Such a practice is an offence against Regulation 11.

APPLICATIONS from persons who desire to be selected as candidates for training as Inspectors in the Engineering Branch of the Post and Telegraph Department will be received by the Chief Telecommunication Engineer, Central Telegraph Office, Colombo, till 4 P.M. on April 30, 1943. Applications should be made on good paper and should be in the form prescribed below. Applications not made in the prescribed form will not be entertained.

2. Candidates must have passed the Cambridge Senior School Certificate or the Senior School Certificate (English) or London Matriculation or equivalent examination, or higher examination, and preference will be given to those who have passed in Mathematics, Physics, Mechanics, and (or) Chemistry.

Satisfactory proof must be furnished—

- That the applicant is a Ceylonese \*
- That he is not less than 17 nor more than 22 years old
- That he is of good moral character.

3. Candidates should be of sound constitution, possessed of good eye-sight and otherwise physically qualified for the appointment. They will be required to undergo a medical examination, the fee for which will be Rs. 5.

4. The applicant will be required to furnish with his application—

- A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 17 nor more than 22 years of age on April 30, 1943;
- A statement giving (i.) his name in full and address, (ii.) father's name, occupation and residence;
- A certificate of character from the head of the school at which the applicant was educated;
- A statement showing examinations passed, degrees taken, &c., and present occupation.

5. A candidate before being finally selected will be interviewed by the Chief Telecommunication Engineer.

6. Selected candidates will be given a three years' course of technical and practical training in the Training Schools and in the various sections of the Engineering Branch of the Department. They will be required to attend at their own expense Evening Classes at the Ceylon Technical College in subjects as specified by the Chief Telecommunication Engineer.

7. Within the periods specified below candidates should obtain the following certificates of the City and Guilds Institute, London :—

8. From the commencement of training up to the time of appointment as Inspectors, Class II., candidates will be classified as Inspectors-in-Training and paid at the following rates provided their progress and conduct are satisfactory :—

First year	Rs. 2.48 per diem.
Second year	Rs. 2.60 "
Third year	Rs. 2.72 "
Fourth year	Rs. 2.84 "

After completion of training and qualifying, and whilst awaiting appointment to vacancies in the Inspectorate Rs. 2.96 per diem with annual increments of 20 cents per diem, up to a maximum of Rs. 4.36 per diem.

Note.—The above rates are subject to alteration.

9. The hours of duty will be those in force in the section in which the Inspectors-in-Training are engaged at the time. They will conform to all the regulations in force regarding discipline, &c., and must be subject to the authority of the officer under whom they will be working. Travelling and subsistence will be in accordance with the regulations applicable to daily-paid employees drawing similar rates of pay.

10. Casual leave with pay, not exceeding a total of 7 days in any year, will be granted after two years training, provided service has been satisfactory. Sick leave will also be granted with pay up to a maximum of 14 days in a year under the same conditions provided the absence is covered by a certificate from a Government Medical Officer.

11. An Inspector-in-Training whose progress or conduct has been found unsatisfactory at any stage will be liable to be discontinued on the orders of the Postmaster-General, whose decision shall be final.

12. Candidates selected for training will be required to furnish an initial security of Rs. 50 and to make monthly contributions from their pay in accordance with the scales in force in the Department for daily-paid employees.

13. Any Inspector-in-Training who (a) is discontinued under Clause 11 above, or (b) leaves the service of the Department either during training or within five years of completion of the three years' course of training, without the express permission of the Postmaster-General, will forfeit the total security furnished by him.

14. Those Inspectors-in-Training who have satisfied the Chief Telecommunication Engineer as to fitness in every respect, and who have obtained the certificates mentioned above will be eligible, in order of merit, for appointment to the Inspectors' grade, Class II., alternately with qualified departmental Overseers, as vacancies occur. The appointment will be on two years probation. Inspectors-in-Training who receive appointments at the end of training and qualifying will be placed on a commencing salary with increments up to the scale approved for Inspectors, Class II. The present salary scale for Inspectors, Class II., is Rs. 816—6 of 72 and 11 of 108—2,436 with efficiency bars before Rs. 1,680 and 2,112. An Inspector-in-Training appointed to the grade of Inspector, Class II., on or after the date on which a new scale of salary and conditions of service are adopted as a result of the recommendations of the Select Committee on the reports of the Retrenchment Commission will be placed on the new salary scale and will have to accept the new conditions of service. No rent allowance is payable. Those who cannot be appointed to the Inspector's grade immediately owing to there being no vacancies will be found suitable temporary employment on daily pay at the discretion of the Chief Telecommunication Engineer. On subsequent appointment to the Inspectorate their salaries will be determined in accordance with the rules governing the transfer of employees on daily pay to monthly



pay at the time of appointment, but in no case will an officer be placed on a salary less than the 4th year's salary in the approved scale for Inspectors, Class II.

15. Those who do not satisfy the Chief Telecommunication Engineer that they have reached the standard required in every respect will have no claim for appointment to the Inspectors' grade. They may be employed as daily-paid Overseers in the Engineering Branch at the discretion of the Chief Telecommunication Engineer provided they are suitable.

16. On appointment to the permanent establishment of Inspectors (clause 14), an officer will be required to furnish a declaration of freedom from debt and also undergo a medical examination as regards physical suitability for such appointment. If the officer is found to be in debt or physically unsuitable the provisional appointment will be cancelled. Inspectors and Overseers are required to serve in any part of the Island and will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other standing regulations of the Government and the Post and Telegraph Department.
