> THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940. 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Restriction of Arrack Supplies) Regulations published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,032 of November 10, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 1 (3) thereof-

(a) in sub-paragraph (a), by the substitution, for the words and figures "published in Gazette No. 8,932 of May 22, 1942; and", of the words "for the time being in force;";
(b) in sub-paragraph (b), by the substitution, for the words "sold by such grantees.", of the words "sold by such grantees;";

"sold by such grantees;";
(c) by the addition, immediately after sub-paragraph

(b), of the following new sub-paragraphs

- "(c) prescribe the date or dates on which arrack shall be sold by any grantee of the exclusive privilege and prohibit the sale of arrack on any other date or dates; and
 - (d) for the purpose of ensuring an adequate supply of arrack to such Foreign Liquor Licensees as may be duly authorised to sell arrack, direct any grantee to supply to any such Foreign Liquor Licensee arrack in such quantities (whether in bulk or in sealed bottles) as the Excise Commissioner may in each case specify.";
- (2) by the addition, immediately after regulation 1, of the following new regulation:-

"IA. (I) No grantee of the exclusive privilege shall sell arrack in bulk at any licensed premises: Provided that the preceding provisions of this

paragraph shall not apply or be deemed or construed to apply

(a) to the sale of arrack in bulk for consumption on such premises; and

(b) to the sale of arrack in bulk to any Foreign Liquor Licensee under the provisions of sub-paragraph (d) of regulation 1 (3).

- (2) No person other than a Foreign Liquor Licensee to whom arrack in bulk has been sold under the provisions of sub-paragraph (d) of regulation 1 (3) shall remove from any licensed premises any arrack sold to him in bulk at such premises .".
- (3) by the addition, immediately after regulation 2, of the following new regulation:

'2A. For the purposes of these regulations-

"grantee of the exclusive privilege" includes any

lessee, assignee, or agent of such grantee;
"Incensed premises" means any premises at which the grantee of the exclusive privilege is licensed under the provisions of the Excise Ordinance to sell arrack by retail; and "sale in bulk", with its grammatical variations, means sale otherwise than in sealed bottles.'.



THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE Order No. 52.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (a) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of Powers) Regulations, 1942, I, Don Stophon Sonanayako, Minister for Agriculture and Lands, do by this Order prohibit the transport or removal of paddy or other grain or any preparation made mainly or wholly from such grain from the areas specified in the first column of the Schedule horeto, except under the authority of a permit issued by the person mentioned in the corresponding entry in the second column of that Schedule.

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Order No. 53.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (d), of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of Powers) Regulations, 1942, I, Don Stephen Senanayake, Minister for Agriculture and Lands, do by this Order prohibit the removal from the Customs premises at any port or place mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, of any rice, paddy, wheat, wheat flour or kurakkan which is imported into Ceylon, except under a permit issued by the person mentioned in the corresponding entry in the second column of that Schedule, and except in accordance with such directions as he may

issue in regard to the time at which, the manner in which and the place to which such rice, paddy, wheat, wheat flour or kurakkan may be so removed.
