THE CEYLON UNIVERSITY ORDINANCE, No. 20 OF 1942.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 73 of the Ceylon University Ordinance, No. 20 of 1942, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) transfer to the University of Ceylon the movable property specified in the Schedule hereto, and
- (2) appoint May 1, 1943, as the date with effect from which such movable property shall vest in and be the property of that University.

## THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Jeramias Wickremanayake is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of his residence at Kuala Lumpur in the Federated Malay States, now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations :

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Jeramias Wickremanayake became an enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, the said Jeramias Wickremanayake duly appointed Nikulas Gurusinghe his attorney in Ceylon (hereinafter referred to as the "Attorney") :

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Jeramias Wickremanayake is liable to be deemed to have, traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor :

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Attorney and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided :

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the Attorney to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Jeramias Wickremanayake and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Jeramias Wickremanayake through his Attorney in Ceylon.

## Regulation.

The Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 9,004 of September 11, 1942, as amended by any subsequent regulation, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after regulation 6B, of the following new regulation :—

"6c. Where any person is convicted of transporting country paddy, country rice or kurakkan in any vehicle or vessel in contravention of these regulations, the court which convicts such person may, in addition to any other punishment which it may impose for that contravention, and after notice to the owner of the vehicle or vessel, order that the vehicle or vessel shall be confiscated : Provided that no order for the confiscation of any vehicle or vessel shall be made under the preceding provisions of this regulation if the owner proves to the satisfaction of the Court that the contravention was committed without his knowledge or consent."

## Regulation.

The Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions) Regulations, published in *Gazette* No. 9,019 of October 8, 1942,

as amended by the Regulation published in *Gazette* No. 9,024 of October 23, 1942, are hereby further amended in the Schedule thereto, as follows :—

(1) in regulation 1 (2) set out in that Schedule, by the insertion, immediately before the definition of "Order", of the following new definition :—

"Controller" has the meaning for the time being assigned to it by section 7 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939 ; ;

(2) in regulation 15 (4) set out in that Schedule, by the substitution, for all the words from "think fit" to "general revenue", of the words "think fit"; and

(3) by the insertion, immediately after regulation 16 set out in that Schedule, of the following new regulation :—

16A. Upon the sale of any article by or under the authority of the Controller under regulation 15 or under regulation 16, the proceeds of such sale shall be paid by the Controller to the credit of a special account, and all payments required or authorised by either of those regulations and all payments in respect of the expenses of or incidental to the seizure and sale of any article thereunder shall be made by him out of that account.

## Regulation.

The Defence (Control of Tea Sales) Regulation, 1943, published in *Gazette* No. 9,095 of March 6, 1943, is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (3) thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

"(3) In this Regulation—

"made tea" means tea manufactured from the leaf of the tea plant, but does not include sweepings, red-leaf, fluff or other waste product ; and

"manufacturer" means any person who, being lawfully in possession of a tea factory (whether as owner, lessee, usufructuary mortgagee or otherwise) manufactures made tea at that factory, and includes any person who causes any tea leaf produced on any estate in his possession to be manufactured at a factory which is not in his possession and to be delivered to him and also includes the Superintendent of any estate and the tea-maker and any other person employed in a tea factory in or in connexion with the manufacture of tea."

## Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Royal Air Force Special Police) Regulations.

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Air Ministry to raise and maintain a force, to be called the Royal Air Force Special Police Force, for the policing of the air force establishments in the Island.

(2) The Force shall consist of such persons as may from time to time be appointed thereto by or on the authority of the Air Ministry.

(3) The organisation, classification, training, discipline, remuneration, clothing, accoutrements and equipment of the members of the Force shall

be such as may from time to time be determined, with the approval of the Air Ministry, by the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Ceylon, or an officer authorised by him in that behalf.

3. Subject to the general or special directions of the Air Ministry, the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Ceylon, shall be charged with the administration and control of the Force referred to in Regulation 2.

4. Every member of the Force shall, before entering on the duties of his office, take before a Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace, the oath of office prescribed in the Promissory Oaths Ordinance.

5. (1) Every member of the Force shall, within the limits of each air force establishment and in the immediate vicinity thereof, have all the powers, protection and immunities conferred on a member of the Ceylon Police Force of corresponding rank by any written law for the time being in operation.

Cap. 15.

(2) Every member of the Force shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of the Penal Code.

6. Every member of the Force who—

(a) neglects or refuses to obey any lawful order or direction given or issued to him in the course of his duties as a member of the Force; or

(b) commits any act of misconduct in the performance of his duties as a member of the Force; or

(c) deserts from the Force,

shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

7. Where any offence under these Regulations is committed by any member of the Force, the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Ceylon, or any officer or person authorised thereto by him, may, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary—

(a) order the offender to pay a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees and direct that the amount of such fine be deducted, either in its entirety or in instalments, from the pay of the offender; or

(b) order the offender to be confined within the limits of his Camp, barracks or station for a period not exceeding fourteen days; or

(c) assign to the offender extra guard or picquet duties; or

(d) institute proceedings against the offender in a Magistrate's Court.

8. Every member of the Force who is convicted of any offence under these Regulations by a Magistrate's Court shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty rupees, or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months, together with forfeiture of pay during such imprisonment.

9. In these Regulations—

“air force establishment” means—

(a) any protected place or protected area declared under Regulation 25 or Regulation 26 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, or

(b) any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 to 1939,

which is occupied or controlled by or on behalf of the Air Ministry, in Ceylon;

The Auxiliary Territorial Service (Ceylon) Rules, 1943, published in *Gazette* No. 9,092 of February 27, 1943, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in rule 5,—

(a) by the substitution, for paragraph (1), of the following new paragraph:—

“(1) During the continuance in operation of a Proclamation calling out the Force, any member thereof may be placed on compulsory leave by her Commanding Officer by notice given or published in such manner as the Commanding Officer may deem adequate.”; and

(b) by the substitution, in paragraph (3), for the words “Commanding Officer of the Force”, of the words “Commanding Officer”;

(2) in rule 6 by the substitution for paragraph (2), of the following new paragraph:—

“(2) Any member of the Reserve may be called to the active list at the discretion of the Commanding Officer”;

(3) in rule 7 by the substitution, for clause (b) of paragraph (1) of the following new clause:—

- (e) in sub-paragraph (b) thereof, by the substitution for all the words and figures from "with interest" to "and Rs. 5,000", of the words and figures "that may stand in the name of such Societies or Industrial

- Schools in the Postmaster-General's Books shall be extended to Rs. 10,000 in the case of any one such Society and Rs. 6,000";
- (2) in regulation 4, by the substitution, for the words " his mark ", of the words " his left thumb impression ";
  - (3) in regulation 5—
    - (a) by the substitution, for the expression " Rs. 750 ", wherever that expression occurs in that regulation, of the expression " Rs. 2,000 "; and

**7A. Security Deposit Accounts.**—(1) Subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General, Government servants and employees of local authorities who are required by their employers to deposit security, and contractors to Government or local authorities who are required to deposit security may open separate accounts for the security deposit only.

(2) Where a person undertakes more than one work or contract at the same time, and a separate security is required in respect of each such work or contract, he may open a separate account for the security deposit in respect of each such work or contract.

(3) The maximum limit for each separate account shall be Rs. 6,000 and the amount may be deposited in a single sum or in instalments. If the single deposit exceeds Rs. 2,000 it shall be made by cheque: Provided that at a Post Office to and from which the mail service is by runners the aggregate of the amounts accepted in any one day in respect of security deposits shall not exceed Rs. 1,000.

(4) A person may open a security deposit account on his own behalf or on behalf of another person. More than one account shall not, however, be opened as a security deposit for the same person in respect of the same work or contract.

(5) A security deposit account may be opened in the joint names of any two or more persons undertaking the same work or contract.

(6) At the time when a first deposit is made in accordance with the foregoing paragraphs, a declaration substantially in the following form shall be made by the person or persons making the deposit :—

(7) The depositor or depositors shall sign a letter (in a form prescribed by the Postmaster-General) addressed to the Postmaster-General undertaking not to make any claim on the Bank for the repayment of the amount pledged

or any part of it, except with the express written sanction of the person referred to in the letter to whom the security is pledged, not to object to the payment by the Bank of the whole or part of the amount pledged to such person on his claiming it, and not to make any claim for interest from the date on which interest has ceased to accrue owing to the payment of the amount pledged to such person or from the date on which such person has sanctioned the repayment of the amount pledged. This latter date shall be communicated by the pledgee to the Postmaster-General as soon as the deposit is made.

When the amount pledged is deposited in instalments the depositor shall give an undertaking not to make any claim on the Bank for the interest on the amount so deposited, while the amount at credit does not exceed the amount pledged. When the amount at credit equals the amount pledged, the depositor may withdraw any interest accruing thereafter.

(8) The person to whom the security is pledged may with the consent of the person pledging the security open an account for such security in his own name, e.g., " The Fiscal, W. P. on account of security of James ". He shall sign a declaration form as set out in paragraph (6). In such case the deposit will be accepted by the Bank from the person to whom the security is pledged, and the Bank Book will be issued to him.

(9) Interest on security deposits will accrue and be paid in the usual manner, subject to the provisions of paragraph (7). No interest however will be allowed on any sum in excess of Rs. 6,000.

(10) If after opening a security deposit account, the original amount of security deposit for the work or contract in respect of which the account was opened, is increased or decreased, the depositor shall sign a fresh declaration form and also produce a letter of authority from the pledgee in respect of the revised amount of deposit.

7B. (1) Where a depositor dies intestate and letters of administration to the estate of such depositor are not required according to the law for the time being in force, the payment of any sum of money lying to the credit of such deceased depositor shall be made by the Postmaster-General to the person or persons appearing to be legally entitled thereto subject to the following conditions :—

(a) The person claiming such money shall make application to the Postmaster-General in writing.

(b) Where the amount lying to the credit of a deceased depositor in the books of the Postmaster-General is less than Rs. 20 the claimant shall forward to the Postmaster-General the pass book of such depositor together with an application for withdrawal duly perfected and a letter from a person authorised to attest signatures of depositors (see regulation 14) certifying the death of the depositor and disclosing his legal heirs.

(c) Where the amount lying to the credit of a deceased depositor in the books of the Postmaster-General is Rs. 20 or more, the claimant shall swear an affidavit in a form which may be obtained on application to the Postmaster-General. The perfected form should then be returned to the Postmaster-General together with the following documents :—

(i.) A certified copy of the entry required to be made in any register by any provision of any written law for the time being in force, relating to the death of such depositor.

(ii.) The pass book of such depositor.

(iii.) An application for withdrawal, duly completed.

Where the claimant is the widow or widower of the depositor, proof of the marriage of such claimant with such depositor shall also be given.

(2) The claimant shall also comply with such other requirements as the Postmaster-General may deem necessary.

7C. (1) **Nominations.**—Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 18 nominations may be made subject to the following conditions :—

(a) A depositor of the age of 16 years or upwards may nominate any person to receive any sum due to such depositor on his death, but a nominator may not have more than one nomination in force at any time: Provided nevertheless that the Postmaster-General may in his absolute discretion refuse to accept or register any nomination.

(b) Every such nomination shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the nominator in the presence of a witness, and shall be sent by post or otherwise to the Controller, Post Office Savings Bank, during the lifetime of the nominator.

(c) Every such nomination shall be made in a prescribed form which may be obtained from the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank.

(d) Every such nomination shall be registered by the Postmaster-General and returned to the nominator.



(2) (a) Any such nomination shall be revoked by the death of the nominee in the lifetime of the nominator or by marriage of the nominator subsequent to the making of the nomination or by written notice of revocation signed by the nominator in the presence of a witness (who shall also sign the notice) and sent for registration in accordance with the provisions of this regulation or by any subsequent nomination made by the nominator.

(b) Any such written notice of revocation shall be sent by post or otherwise to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank during the lifetime of the nominator, and shall be registered by the Postmaster-General in like manner as in the case of a nomination.

(c) Any such nomination shall not be revoked by any will or by any events or means other than those specified in this paragraph.

(d) Where the Postmaster-General has paid money to a nominee in ignorance of the fact that the nominator has married subsequently to the making of the nomination, the receipt of the nominee shall be a valid discharge to the Postmaster-General.

(3) Except where otherwise stated, any such nomination shall (subject to the provisions of this regulation) be deemed to extend to all sums to which a nominator is entitled at the time of his death and which are standing to his credit in the Post Office Savings Bank, but a nominator may in a nomination expressly exclude any part of such sums from the operation of such nomination.

(4) A nomination may be in favour of one person or of several persons (who shall be clearly designated in the nomination), and in the latter case may direct that specific sums shall be paid to one or more of the persons named in the nomination, or that the persons named in such nomination may take the amounts nominated in specified shares, or may give directions to both effects.

(5) No person who witnesses the signatures of a nominator to a nomination shall take any benefit under such nomination.

(6) Where the Postmaster-General has no notice of the claim of any creditor of the nominator, the Postmaster-General shall pay the persons named in any such nomination made by such nominator, and in force at the time of his death, according to the directions of such nomination, notwithstanding the production of probate of the will of the deceased nominator or letters of administration to his estate, and the receipt of any person so named shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum so paid, notwithstanding that such person has not attained the age of 21 years if such person has attained the age of 16 years.

(7) Where, on the death of a nominator who has made a nomination, the Postmaster-General has notice of a claim of any creditor against the estate of such nominator, and such estate, apart from the amount nominated, appears to be insufficient to satisfy such claim, the Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, apply the amount nominated in or towards the satisfaction of such claim, but subject as aforesaid any payment made by the Postmaster-General to the nominee, shall be a valid payment, and the receipt of the nominee shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum so paid.

(8) Where any person nominated to receive any sum on the death of a depositor is a minor under the age of 16 years, and it is proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that funds are urgently needed for the maintenance, education or benefit of such minor, the Postmaster-General may, in his absolute discretion, pay the sum mentioned in the nomination or any part thereof, to any person who may satisfy the Postmaster-General that he will apply such money for the benefit of such minor, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the amount so paid.

(9) Where any nominee named in any nomination dies after the death of the nominator but before the Postmaster-General has paid such nominee, the provisions of this regulation shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (7) thereof, apply to such nominee and to the sum payable to him as nominee as if at the date of his death such deceased nominee were a depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank and the said sum were deposited in his name in a Post Office Savings Bank Account.

(10) (a) Every nominator shall, on making the nomination, furnish to the Postmaster-General in the prescribed form full particulars of his deposit account.

(b) Every nominator shall, if and whenever the deposit account to which a nomination applies is closed and a fresh deposit account is opened or a change occurs make such corrections in and additions to the particulars furnished on making the nomination as may be necessary, and shall forthwith forward to the Postmaster-General the amended particulars.

(c) Where, by reason of the failure of a nominator to comply with the foregoing requirements of this paragraph any money payable in respect of all or any of the deposits of the nominator at the date of his death is paid to some

person other than the nominee or some person claiming through him, that payment shall be as valid as if the nomination had not been made."

(6) in regulation 11, by the substitution, for the words "right thumb", of the words "left thumb";

(7) in regulation 17—

(a) in paragraph 1(a), (i) by the substitution, for the words "Provident Society", of the words "Provident Society, or any corporate or unincorporate Body"; and (ii) by the substitution, for the words "Treasurer of the Society", of the words "Treasurer of the Society or Body";

(b) in paragraph 1(c), (i) by the substitution, in the caption of the declaration form, for the words "Provident Society", of the words "Provident Society, or corporate or unincorporate Body"; and (ii) by the substitution in the declaration form, for the words "Society/Temple", of the words "Society/Body/Temple"; wherever those words occur collectively in that form;

(8) in regulation 19, by the substitution, for the words "Assistant Postmaster-General", of the words "Postmaster-General";

(9) by the substitution, for regulation 31, of the following new regulation:—

"31. The Balance Sheet of the Post Office Savings Bank for each year ending December 31, shall, after it has been audited and certified by the Auditor-General, be published in the *Gazette* by the Trustees, not later than the 31st day of the month of August in the ensuing year."

(10) in regulation 32, by the addition, immediately after paragraph (2), of the following new paragraph:—

"(3) Notwithstanding the provisions in the foregoing sub-paragraph (2) the Postmaster-General shall be entitled to forfeit the moneys deposited in all or any of their accounts inclusive of any interest accrued thereon, if he is satisfied that such moneys or any part thereof was deposited in wilful contravention of paragraph (1)";

(11) in regulation 33, by the substitution, for the words "deceased depositor", of the words "deceased depositor, or from any Security deposits";

(12) by the rescission of regulations 1, 22, 26, 29 and 30; and

(13) under the heading "Principal Rules of the Post Office Savings Bank"—

(i.) in regulation 1—

(a) by the substitution, for the expression "Rs. 750", of the expression "Rs. 2,000";

(b) by the substitution, for the figures and words "Rs. 3,000 exclusive of interest", of the figures and words "Rs. 6,000 exclusive of interest";

(c) by the substitution, for the words and figures "until the sum due to a depositor amounts to Rs. 3,000 when interest ceases to be due", of the words and figures "on every complete sum of Rs. 5 in deposit. No interest shall however be paid—

(i.) in respect of any sum in excess of Rs. 2,000 which may be deposited in any one year; or

(ii.) in respect of any sum in excess of Rs. 6,000 which stands to the credit of any depositor at any time.";

(ii.) in regulation 4—

(a) by the substitution, for the words "below such label", of the words "against the entry";

(b) by the substitution, for the expression "Rs. 750", of the expression "Rs. 2,000";

(c) by the substitution, for all the words "from within five days" to "Eastern Provinces", of the words "within ten days from the date of deposit"; and

(iii.) in regulation 6, by the substitution, for the words "right thumb", of the words "left thumb".

#### Textiles Control Notice No. 2.

#### Export to Ceylon of Textiles from the United Kingdom and India.

1. The attention of IMPORTERS OF TEXTILES all over the Island is drawn to paragraphs 1 and 2 of my Notice appearing in the English daily Newspapers published in Colombo in the issues of January 29, 1943. This as well as other such notices should be cut out and filed.

2. The EARLIER NOTICES regarding "Recommendations for Textiles Export Licences" published in the Press in the issues of September 26, 1942, and October 13, 1942, are hereby CANCELLED and the following requirements should be observed in future.

3. Subject to the information given in paragraph 4 below:—

- (a) Cotton Piece Goods and other Cotton Manufactures of Indian and U. K. manufacture, falling under items C 95 to C 99 in Leaflet No. 3 published by the Controller of Imports, may be imported at present from either country without an individual import licence issued by the Controller of Imports.
- (b) (i.) Woollen and Worsted Piece Goods and Manufactures (other than Carpets and Rugs),  
(ii.) Silk, Satin or Art Silk Piece Goods and Manufactures (other than Handkerchiefs, Mufflers, and Scarves), and  
(iii.) All Apparel of Silk, Satin, Art Silk, Wool, Cotton if all these textiles are of Indian manufacture, falling under items B 164, B 165, C 101, C 102, C 104, C 105 of Leaflet No. 3 referred to above, may also be imported from India without an individual import licence issued by the Controller of Imports.
- (c) Any article of the descriptions in (b) above of U. K. manufacture will require an individual import licence, and orders should not be placed, unless the importer holds such licence from the Controller of Imports.
- (d) The attention of importers is drawn to articles, like Carpets and Rugs, Mufflers, &c. of Silk, &c., Silk and Art Silk Handkerchiefs referred to in items A 31, A 33, A 34, A 35 of Leaflet No. 3 above referred to, the importation of which is prohibited in Ceylon.

4. The export regulations in the United Kingdom and India are as follows, so far as they are known to this Department:—

#### I.—THE UNITED KINGDOM

- (1) Cotton Piece Goods.  
No quota for 2nd quarter
- (2) Art Silk Piece Goods.  
A small quota for 2nd quarter, for which allocations have been made by the Controller of Imports
- (3) Silk Piece Goods.  
No quota for 2nd quarter, but very small quantities from available supplies may be imported on licences issued by the Controller of Imports on application.
- (4) Woollen Piece Goods.  
A small quota for February to May, 1943, for which allocations have been made by the Controller of Imports.

#### II—INDIA.

- (1) (a) Cotton Piece Goods, Mill-woven.  
Quota of 800 tons for 2nd quarter, of which a proportion must be in grey and the balance in bleached and dyed or printed. The proportion may be varied by the Government of India from time to time.  
Postal parcels from India, even for domestic use, must also be covered by export licences obtained from the Export Controller at the port of export.
- (b) Cotton Piece Goods, Hand-woven.  
No restriction on quantity, but export licences believed to be necessary.  
Postal parcels, same as above.
- (2) Art Silk Piece Goods.
- (3) Silk Piece Goods.
- (4) Woollen Piece Goods.

Export of the above three classes of textiles to all destinations is entirely prohibited for the present.

5. (a) Recommendations for Export Licences in the United Kingdom for any of the above classes of textiles will NOT be issued by this Department, except for Cotton Piece Goods, and then only if and when a quota is allowed. See paragraph 4-I (1) above. For the present, Buying Agents in the United Kingdom should be informed that neither the Controller of Textiles nor the Controller of Imports will issue letters of recommendation or essentiality certificates for export of Cotton Piece Goods from the U. K., as they can be imported on an Open General Licence. Buying Agents should accept indents, only if they can get export licences there, independently of any recommendation or essentiality certificate.

(b) In the case of Art Silk, Silk, Flannel and Woollen Piece Goods, see paragraph 4-I (2) to (4) above, where a quota is allowed by the U. K. authorities, importers who have been issued licences previously for the importation of those classes of textiles from the U. K. will in due course be informed by the Controller of Imports of their allocations, and indents in quadruplicate, not exceeding their allocations should be forwarded to him to be licensed. Allocations cannot be dispensed with, as they are required by the U. K. authorities.

6. When applying to the Controller of Textiles for Recommendations for Export Licences to be obtained in India, the following requirements should be observed:—

- (a) Details of imports in October, 1941, to September, 1942, for each month should be given separately for each of the following classes of textiles, in yards or dozens of articles, as the case may be:—
- (i.) Grey.  
(ii.) Bleached.  
(iii.) Dyed.  
(iv.) Printed.  
(v.) Total of Cotton Piece Goods (i.) to (iv.).  
(vi.) Art Silk Piece Goods  
(vii.) Silk Piece Goods.  
(viii.) Woollen Piece Goods.  
(ix.) Apparel: description of, and whether cotton, art silk, silk or woollen.

If these details have been previously sent to this Department, reference to date of letter with which they were sent should be made.

- (b) Recommendations will be given for two calendar months ahead for export from India. The quantities applied for must be strictly limited to such quantities as are in the hands of Buying Agents in India, or are reasonably anticipated to be purchasable and shipped within the above-mentioned period. Quantities should not be applied for merely speculatively.
- (c) Further applications for every subsequent period of two months may be made in due course.
- (d) The yardage or number of apparel (in dozens) applied for in pursuance of (b) or (c) above should always be separately classified in the same manner as in (a) above, and the yardage or number applied for should be further sub-divided into groups for (i.) Mill-woven and (ii.) Hand-woven for each of the classes in (a) above.
- (e) The full names and addresses of their Buying Agents should be given in every application as well as the port of export from which each Buying Agent will ship.
- (f) Invoices for the quantities applied for need not be sent.

7. The issue of a letter of Recommendation for Export Licence ("R.E.L." in short) will create no right to continue to import under the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 1) Regulations, 1943, and will be at the discretion of the undersigned.

The Customs Department has agreed that, in view of the provisions of the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 1) Regulations, 1943—

- (a) where textiles are DUTIABLE AT 15 per cent. *ad val.* and the LANDED COST under the above Regulations, exclusive of Customs duty, is Rs. 100, the true wholesale market value to be declared by the importer will be Rs. 111.67.

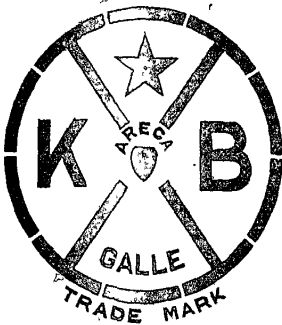
