THE DEFENCE (COMPENSATION) TRIBUNAL RULES, 1943.

RULES made by the Tribunals constituted under Regulation 8 of the Defence (Compensation) Regulations with the concurrence of the Legal Secretary by virtue of the powers vested in them by Regulation 9 (f) of the Defence (Compensation) Regulations, 1941, are hereby published for general information.

The Defence (Compensation) Tribunal Rules, 1943.

1. *Title.*—These Rules may be cited as the Defence (Compensation) Tribunal Rules, 1943, and shall come into operation on May 21, 1943.

2. *Interpretation.*—In these rules unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively:—

“Regulations” mean the Defence (Compensation) Regulations, 1941, published in *Gazette* No. 8,814 of November 21, 1941, as amended by any subsequent Regulations.

“Tribunal” means the appropriate Tribunal constituted under the Regulations.

“President” means the President of the Tribunal.

“Registrar” means the Registrar of the Tribunal and includes an Assistant Registrar.

“Reference” means proceedings for the determination of a dispute or claim which has been referred to the Tribunal under these rules.

“Competent Authority” means the competent authority appointed under the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations who is concerned with the settlement of the dispute or claim which is the subject of the reference.

3. *Notification of Dispute as to Compensation.*—

(a) Where a dispute as to whether any compensation is payable under these Regulations or as to the amount of compensation so payable has arisen and has not been settled by agreement, the Competent Authority shall refer the said dispute to the Tribunal in manner provided by this Rule, and upon such reference the dispute shall be a dispute referred to the Tribunal for determination under the Regulations.

(b) The said reference of the dispute shall be made by transmitting to the Registrar a Notification of Dispute as to Compensation in Form A of the Schedule to these Rules signed by the Competent Authority.

(c) The said Notification of Dispute shall set out—

- (1) the material facts relating to the said requisition or acquisition and to the notice of claim preferred by the claimant,
- (2) the answer of the Competent Authority to the claim, and
- (3) any further matters or grounds affecting the claim on which the Competent Authority proposes to rely.

(d) There shall be filed with the Notification of Dispute a copy of—

- (1) the notice of requisition, if any,
- (2) The notice of acquisition, if any,
- (3) the notice of claim.

(e) Simultaneously with the transmission to the Registrar of the Notification of Dispute the Competent Authority shall send to the Claimant a copy thereof.

4. *Date and place of hearing.*—As soon as may be after the filing of the Notification of Dispute as to Compensation under Rule 3, the Registrar shall communicate to the parties to the reference the date and place fixed for the hearing.

5. *Statement and production of evidence at the hearing.*—The Claimant shall at the hearing begin by stating his case and then producing his evidence: the case stated must accord with his Notice of Claim. The Competent Authority shall then state his case and produce his evidence.

6. *Matter not admissible under the law of evidence.*—

- (a) The Tribunal may, if in any particular case it thinks it right so to do, take into consideration any matter which it considers relevant to the subject of the inquiry before it, notwithstanding that the matter is not admissible in evidence under the law relating to evidence.
- (b) If any party desires to adduce in evidence any document which but for this rule would not be admissible, such party shall not later than fourteen days before the date of the hearing give notice to the other party of his intention so to do specifying the document and shall supply the other party with a copy thereof. But the Tribunal may permit the document to be adduced in evidence notwithstanding failure to comply with this Rule if the Tribunal is of opinion that compliance was not reasonably practicable or that in all the circumstances it is just and reasonable so to do.

7. *Orders to attend and give evidence and to produce documents.*—

- (a) An order directing any person to attend and give evidence or to produce documents shall be in Form B of the Schedule to these rules with such variations as circumstances may require.
- (b) The party desiring such an order shall make application therefor by letter addressed to the Registrar and enclosing a draft of the order desired. Each draft shall contain the name of one witness only. The draft shall be dated and signed by the President of the Tribunal and returned by the Registrar to the party applying for the same.
- (c) The order shall be served or caused to be served by the said party on the witness personally a reasonable time before the hearing and a certificate of such service sent to the Registrar before the hearing.
- (d) There shall be paid or tendered to the witness by the said party at time of service a reasonable sum as batta together with a sum reasonably sufficient to cover his expenses in travelling to and from the place of hearing and the aggregate of the said sum shall be specified in such order.

8. *Right of Audience.*—In any proceedings before the Tribunal any of the following persons may appear and address the Tribunal, namely—

- (a) any party to the reference;
- (b) an Advocate or a Proctor;
- (c) the Commissioner, Compensation Claims, or his Deputy on behalf of the Competent Authority;
- (d) any other person allowed by leave of the Tribunal to appear instead of any party.

9. *Award.*—The decision of the Tribunal in the reference shall be in writing and signed by the President and the Members of the Tribunal before whom the hearing took place.

10. *Use of Post.*—Where by these rules any document, notice, or communication is required to be filed, served, or transmitted, the same may be done by post except in the case provided for by Rule 7 of these rules.

11. *List of Documents and Witnesses.*—Each party to the reference shall, at least 7 days before the date of hearing, file with the Registrar a list of his witnesses and of the documents which he proposes to read in evidence, serving at the same time a copy thereof on the other party to the reference and no witness shall be examined and no document shall be received in evidence without the special leave of the President of the Tribunal unless the name of such witness and the description of such document appears in such list.

12. *Matters not provided for.*—All matters of procedure not provided for in the foregoing rules shall be determined by the order of the President of the Tribunal.
