The regulations for the Municipal Town of Kandy made under the Vehicles Ordinance, published in *Gazette* No. 7,477 of August 7, 1925, and therein called "by-laws", are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 1 thereof, by the omission of all the words from "To such licence" to "stamped across it.";

(2) in regulation 3 thereof—

(a) by the substitution, for the words "by producing his licence and photograph," of the words "by producing his licence,";

(b) by the substitution, for the words "for inspection his photograph and licence", of the words "for inspection his licence"; and

(3) by the addition, at the end of those regulations, of the following new regulation 4:—

"4. The following shall be the rates and fares for jinrickshas:—

Day Rates and Fares.

Not exceeding 5 minutes	..	10 cents
Exceeding 5 minutes but not exceeding 10 minutes	..	15 cents
Exceeding 10 minutes but not exceeding half an hour	..	35 cents
Exceeding half an hour but not exceeding one hour	..	50 cents
For each subsequent half hour	..	10 cents

Night Rates and Fares.

Between 7 P.M. and 6 A.M. an additional charge of 5 cents over and above the day rates and fares in any case where a jinricksha is engaged for any period exceeding half an hour."

4. No person shall disturb the public after 9 o'clock at night by shouting, singing songs, or making any other noise: Provided that nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to affect the existing rights of the people in the matter of religious ceremonies and other orderly gatherings.

Labour Dispute—Madampe Group, Kahawatta.

2. Arrack Rent Sales, Kegalla District, 1943-44.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the purchase of the exclusive privilege of selling arrack by retail at the taverns referred to below during the period October 1, 1943, to September 30, 1944, subject to—

- (i.) the Arrack Rent Sales Conditions appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 9,126 of May 28, 1943,
- (ii.) the General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licences appearing in Excise Notification No. 329 published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,368 of May 11, 1938, and
- (iii.) the Defence (Restriction of Arrack Supplies) Regulations as published in *Gazette* No. 9,032 of November 10, 1942, and *Gazette* No. 9,112 of April 21, 1943, and the Notification thereunder published in *Gazette* No. 9,037 of November 20, 1942. The Defence Regulations and the Notifications thereunder may be amended or added to. Such amendments or additions will be duly notified in the *Gazette*.

2. Every tender must be made on the prescribed form which may be obtained at the Kegalla Kachcheri, and must be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 500.

3. Every tender must be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked on the top left hand corner thus: "Tender for Arrack Taverns Group No. 1, Kegalla District, 1943-44" and must reach the Assistant Government Agent, Kegalla District, before 10 A.M. on July 19, 1943. be on the security of a deposit made by the renter for each tavern as shown in Schedule AA representing the values of empties proposed to be drawn. This deposit should be made at the same time as the payment for the first consignment of arrack. Two *separate* Kachcheri Receipts should be produced at the warehouse for the deposit to cover the value of empties and the first payment for arrack. The second and subsequent issues of bottled arrack will be conditional on the gallonage of the *empty* bottles brought by the renter to the warehouse. In broad terms, the gallonage that will be issued will be equivalent to the gallonage of empty bottles returned by the renter—for details see condition 11A (1) and (6). Renters will be expected to make every effort to collect the empties of the sealed bottles sold at their respective taverns.

11. The condition 20 will enable the Department to compel the renter to take his quota of sealed bottles of arrack, so that the renter may not exploit the situation by making bigger profits or unduly inflated sales of bulk arrack.

12. Attention is also drawn to Schedule A. The issue price of all the qualities of arrack at the warehouse has been decreased but there is no alteration in the gross profit to the renter. The gross profit of Rs. 3.80 on all qualities thus remains at present.

13. The proviso to condition 1 (c) of the new licence form should be noted.

14. Condition 1 (e) of the new licence form will help the renter to establish the habit of customers bringing back their empty arrack bottles to the tavern (for returning to the warehouse).

15. Attention is also drawn to amended condition 3 (b), new condition 3 (d), amended condition 7, and new condition 10 (a) of the new licence form.

16. Other minor amendments in the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions and in the said new arrack tavern licence form will also have to be complied with.

17. The security required from the grantee of each tavern may most usefully be deposited in the form of Government of Ceylon Loans:—Registered stocks, Promissory Notes and War Loans (with or without interest). The interest bearing stock, Promissory Notes and War Loan may possibly be found to be more paying than the fixed deposits in banks, &c. This is merely a suggestion to the prospective grantee and carries no further security from Government than the script itself.
