#### Rule.

The Colombo Port Rules, 1936, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,251 of October 16, 1936, as amended by the rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,812 of November 14, 1941, are hereby further amended, by the substitution, for rule 104A thereof, of the following new rule:—

"104A. (1) Every lighter used for the conveyance of cargo, and exceeding twenty tons gross tonnage but not exceeding 50 tons gross tonnage, shall be fitted with one bilge pump.

(2) Every lighter used for the conveyance of cargo, and exceeding fifty tons gross tonnage, shall be fitted with two bilge pumps.

(3) The plunger area of every such bilge pump shall be not less than twenty square inches."

## THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1943.

*Regulations.*

1. In these regulations, "camp area" includes—
  - (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at Kataragama; and
  - (b) the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1943, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to seventeen days from July 2 to July 18, inclusive.
  - (b) No pilgrim shall arrive before July 2 or stay after July 18 in the camp area.
3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power, on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—
  - (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking, and for natural offices;
  - (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
  - (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
  - (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
  - (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.
- (2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).
5. No person shall enter himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.
8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorised by him to issue such permits.
9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.
10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.
11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.
  - (2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
  - (3) It shall be lawful for any police officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer, or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
12. (1) All eating houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
  - (2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.
  - (3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the Sanitary authorities.
  - (4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,  
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

*Regulation.*

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after regulation 32c, of the following new regulation:—

Power to require performance of services in ships.

32H. (1) Subject to such general or special instructions as may be issued by the Governor, the competent authority may direct any British subject or British protected person in Ceylon to perform such services in any British ship, not being a Dominion ship, as may be specified or described in the direction, being services which that person is, in the opinion of the competent authority, capable of performing.

(2) Any such direction shall, except so far as the contrary intention appears therefrom, continue in force until the direction is varied by a subsequent direction or withdrawn by the competent authority.

(3) Any services required by a direction given under this regulation to be performed shall be performed on such terms as to remuneration and conditions of service as the competent authority may, in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, direct:

Provided that in determining the terms upon which any such services are to be performed regard shall be had to any rates of salary, fees or wages for the performance of those services which appear to be usual, and in particular to the remuneration and conditions of service of persons employed in the capacity in which the person to whom the direction relates is to serve.

(4) Section 240 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and section 92 of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance shall have effect as if there were included among the matters to be entered in the official log-book the following matters, so far as they are known to the master of the ship:—

(a) the name of every person to whom a direction has been given under this regulation to perform services as a member of the crew of that ship;

(b) the date on which and the place at which he joined the ship, or, if he failed to join the ship, the circumstances of his failure;

(c) if he fails in any other respect to comply with the direction, particulars of his failure.

(5) No British subject or British protected person resident in Ceylon who has been the master or a member of the crew of any ship at any time during the twelve months immediately preceding the date on which this regulation is published in the *Gazette* shall, unless he has first obtained the consent of the competent authority, accept any employment (not being an employment under a contract in operation at the aforesaid date) except as the master or a member of the crew of a British ship.

(c) to any vehicle used by any person for the time being authorised in that behalf by name, office or designation for the purposes of paragraph 3 (1) of the Lighting Restriction (Motor Cars) Order, 1942."

## CLAIMS TO COMPENSATION IN RESPECT OF PROPERTY REQUISITIONED AND ACQUIRED IN THE EXERCISE OF EMERGENCY POWERS.

UNDER Regulation 11 of the Defence (Compensation) Regulations 1941, published in *Gazette* No. 8,814 of November 21, 1941, claims for compensation in respect of property requisitioned or acquired in the exercise of Emergency Powers are barred unless notice of claim is given, in the prescribed form and manner to the prescribed authority, within a period of 6 months from the date on which the compensation accrues due or May 1, 1942, whichever is the later.

The Regulation makes it permissible for the Governor to extend the time for preferring claims either generally or in relation to any particular claim or class of claims. No general extension of time has been made.

2. The prescribed authority to whom notice of claim should be given is the competent authority by whom the requisition or acquisition was effected, or the person to whom the competent authority directs the notice to be sent.

3. The failure of claimants to prefer claims diligently and in the form and manner prescribed by the Defence (Claims for Compensation) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,883 of March 13, 1942, entails delay in the settlement of claim for compensation.

4. Extensions of time for preferring notices of claims to compensation will only be granted where the reasons urged or such extensions are exceptionally strong.

5. Claimants are advised in their own interests to see that forms of Notice of Claims are carefully completed and transmitted to the prescribed authority as expeditiously as possible.

## THE INDIAN IMMIGRANT LABOUR ORDINANCE.

## Notification No. 336.

IT is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers vested in him by regulation 14 of Chapter 1 of the regulations made under section 14 of the Indian Immigrant Labour Ordinance (Chapter 111), and published in *Gazette* No. 7,339 of July 13, 1923, as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 7,358 of October 26, 1923, the Governor has been pleased to direct that the quarterly instalments of acreage fees payable to the Controller of Labour by employers of Indian immigrant labourers on estates of the description named in Schedule A attached to the said regulations shall, in respect of the quarter ending on June 30, 1943, and of all subsequent quarters in respect of which this Notification remains in force, be determined in accordance with the following scale:—

(1) Tea .. .. .	..	48 cents per
(2) Tea interplanted with rubber .. .. .	..	acre
(3) Tea interplanted with cacao .. .. .	..	..
(4) Tea interplanted with cardamoms .. .. .	..	..
(5) Rubber .. .. .	..	..
(6) Cacao .. .. .	..	16 cents per

TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE CEYLON MOTOR &  
ENGINEERING CO., LTD., WORKERS' UNION AND THE  
CEYLON MOTOR & ENGINEERING CO., LTD.

THE Ceylon Motor & Engineering Co., Ltd., Workers' Union forwarded to me, under para. 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes & Lockouts) Order, 1942, a petition praying for the settlement of the above dispute by the District Judge of Colombo. The petition was duly referred to the District Judge, Colombo. As required by paragraph 8 (4) of the Order referred to above, it is notified for the information of all concerned that the findings of the District Judge on the petition are as given below:—

A number of demands were set forth in the petition and at a certain stage a settlement was effected on certain matters.

On the question of a war bonus it was stated that the respondents were paying their workmen a 25 per cent. war bonus at the present time. There was therefore no further need to pursue that point. On the question of wages being paid to a workman who came for work but was not given work, it was agreed that half a day's pay should be paid to such a workman. It was also agreed that a workman should be told the previous day that he need not attend work if there was no work for him. In such a case he would not get half a day's pay on that day.

Along with this was also considered the question of finding workmen who did not turn up for work and it was agreed by both sides that absence without leave or without a satisfactory excuse should be considered as depriving a workman of his wages for that day and also that he would be liable to be fined half a day's pay if he absented himself without leave or without giving a satisfactory explanation for his absence.

The issue as to the distribution of work was not pressed and the issue as to dismissal of workmen for shortage of work was also not pressed inasmuch as there was no shortage of work and there was really a shortage of labour. The question of gratuities was also not pressed as it was realised that the workmen had no right to demand gratuities. The right to have a member of the union present at all inquiries was also not pressed; but after any inquiry into the conduct of a workman, if an adverse ruling is made by the company, it was open to the union to make representations and be present at any further inquiry.

It was agreed that there should be an eight-hour day with eight-hour wages and the respondents agreed to restore the original accommodation that had been provided for the workmen to take their meals. As regards A. R. P. shelters, this was also not pressed as there was evidence that the A. R. P. authorities had approved of the provision which had already been made by the company for their workmen. It was conceded that the union had been recognised by the company and therefore there was no necessity to give any finding on that point.

There was no evidence at all led to show that workmen were prevented from attending meetings of the union by being asked to work overtime, and therefore no decision need be made on this point.

The only points, therefore, that require a definite finding are—

- (1) what wages should be paid to the workmen at the present time; and
- (2) what wages should be paid to those workmen who went on strike from the date of the strike up to December.

In considering the question of wages the greatest difficulty arises from the fact that there is no test which can be applied to subdivide workmen into various classes. During the inquiry attempts were made to subdivide workmen into skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled, but there was no rule or test by which it could be definitely said that any workman came within any particular class. It seemed, however, that most firms considered that a workman might be said to be skilled if he was capable of working without supervision, but there was no rule or test, except the test of experience and individual ability, to divide the semi-skilled from the unskilled. It is therefore not by any means easy to lay down a scale of wages for persons working in the motor trade.

Various firms working in Colombo have given details of the wages they pay to their workmen. From a close study of the information afforded by these firms it would appear that a skilled workman was paid a daily wage of anything between Re. 1.35 to Rs. 4.00, the workman's wage depending upon his individual skill, ability and experience.

A suggestion was made that skilled workmen might be subdivided into three classes, and that it should be laid down what percentage of workmen should be in each of these classes. I do not think that that would be either practical, reasonable, or just. The only reasonable and practical solution would be to fix a minimum wage for the skilled workmen. From an examination of the figures as well as the evidence led, it appears to me to be reasonable that any skilled workman, whether he be a mechanic or fitter, blacksmith or welder, should be paid a minimum wage of Re. 1.60 per day—that is, at the rate of 20 cents per hour—exclusive of war allowance.

Thus, according to P 68 (specification of wages) the fitters shown as skilled workmen appear as having been paid wages

ranging from Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2.45—with one foreman baas being paid Rs. 5.56. I would therefore fix the minimum wage at Re. 1.60 for this group. Thus a workman who is paid Re. 1.50 would be paid Re. 1.60 and the wages of the others will be increased in proportion—that is to say, the relative differences will be maintained in units of 8 cents as these wages are based on an eight-hour day. Greasers, blacksmiths, tinkers, welders, painters, carpenters, lathemen, battery men and drivers (shown on the reverse of P 68) should be paid in the same way as I have shown how the fitters should be dealt with.

So also in the case of semi-skilled workmen (assistants and learners) shown on P 68: to those paid less than Re. 1.50 the same rule would apply—that is, the relative differences will be maintained in units of eight cents.

I was specially invited to deal with the wages which would be due to the strikers as from the date on which they resumed work. I think it would be reasonable to adopt the suggestion made by their counsel that the 33 strikers whose names appear on P 38 should be paid from the date they resumed work in March to December—a wage which is less by 20 per cent. than the wages which would be paid to them as calculated above. That is to say, a workman whose salary is now fixed at Re. 1.60, if he was a striker, would be paid a salary of Re. 1.60 minus 32 cents, namely, Re. 1.28 per diem from the date he resumed work in March to December when the salaries were increased all round. He would retain whatever war allowance he has been paid, in addition.

*Overtime:* On the question of overtime the rate which the respondent company pays, namely, one and a half times the hourly wage is even more than what some of the other firms pay. Therefore the overtime rate will remain the same.

*Batta:* Workmen who are sent outside the Municipal limits of Colombo and who do not return should be paid a subsistence allowance: for any period exceeding six hours and less than twelve hours Re. 1 should be paid. If, however, they remain for a period of less than six hours but are out of Colombo during any meal time, the workmen should be paid 50 cents. If a workman has to remain out at night for any period exceeding 12 hours subsistence allowance should be paid at the following rates:—

Re. 1.50 per diem for men whose wages are Rs. 2 and less, and

Rs. 2 per diem for men paid over Rs. 2 a day.

The award will be entered in accordance with the above findings.

As the petitioners were compelled to file this petition they would be entitled to costs. But as the petitioners themselves were mainly responsible for the protracted inquiry, I fix the costs at Rs. 250.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

BY-LAWS.

1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

“crossing” means a crossing place for foot passengers demarcated on any street by means of coloured lines or surfaces and indicated as such by a traffic sign bearing the words “CROSS HERE”;

“driver” in the case of a bicycle or tricycle, whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, means the rider thereof; in the case of a hand-cart or push-cart, the person drawing or pushing the cart; and in the case of a jinricksha, the person drawing the jinricksha;

“vehicle” means any artificial contrivance, whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on land.

2. The driver of every vehicle approaching a crossing shall proceed at such speed as to be able, if necessary, to stop before reaching such crossing.

3. The driver of every vehicle at or approaching a crossing where traffic is not for the time being controlled by a police constable or by light signals, shall allow free and uninterrupted passage to any foot passenger who is on the carriageway at such crossing and every such foot passenger shall have precedence over all vehicular traffic at such crossing.

4. No driver of any vehicle shall cause such vehicle or any part thereof to stop upon any crossing unless either—

(a) he is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or

(b) it is necessary for him to stop, in order to avoid an accident.

5. No foot passenger shall remain upon any crossing longer than is necessary for the purpose of passing from one side of the street to the other with reasonable despatch.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

*Regulations.*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Rubber Commissioner) (Emergency Powers) Regulations, 1943.

2. (1) The Rubber Commissioner may at any time direct the registered proprietor of any estate or small holding or any dealer—

(a) to furnish before a date specified by the Commissioner in any month or in each month in any series of months a return setting out—

(i) such particulars as the Commissioner may require in respect of the production, sale, delivery, purchase or export of rubber or the stocks of rubber held by such proprietor or dealer; or

(ii) such information as may be necessary to enable the Commissioner to prepare statistics as to any matter connected with the production of rubber;

(b) to furnish before a specified date such information or explanation as the Commissioner may require in respect of any return furnished by any such proprietor or dealer under these Regulations;

(c) to produce or cause to be produced before a specified date such documentary or other evidence as the Commissioner may consider necessary for the purpose of verifying any facts or particulars set out in any return furnished by such proprietor or dealer under these Regulations.

(2) Every return furnished under these Regulations and any explanation or information required by the Commissioner to be furnished thereunder shall be verified by a declaration that the statements contained therein are true and accurate.

3. It shall be lawful for the Commissioner or any person authorised by him in that behalf at any time—

- (a) to enter any estate or small holding for the purpose of inspection, or for the purpose of verifying stocks or any particulars contained in any return made or any information or explanation supplied to the Commissioner under these Regulations, or for the purpose of making any survey plan of, or taking any measurements of or on, that estate or small holding;
- (b) to enter any factory, office or other building on any estate or small holding for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (a) of this regulation or for the purpose of ascertaining whether the methods and means adopted for the production of rubber on that estate or small holding are such as to secure the production of the maximum quantity of rubber thereon, and, where the Commissioner or any person so authorised is of opinion that such methods or means should be improved or altered in order to secure the production of such maximum quantity, to make recommendations for the improvement or alteration of such methods or means;
- (c) to enter any licensed premises for the purpose of the inspection or verification of stocks of rubber therein and to examine any or all of the books or records maintained in connexion with the business transacted in the premises.

4. The Commissioner and all persons authorised by him for the purposes of these Regulations shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of the Penal Code.

Cap. 15. 5. Every person who fails to comply with any direction issued by the Commissioner under Regulation 2, and every person who furnishes any return, explanation or information which is false and which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true in any material particular, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. In these Regulations—

“Commissioner” means the Rubber Commissioner;

“dealer”, “estate”, “licensed premises”, “proprietor”, “registered”, “rubber”, “small holding” and “stock” have, respectively, the same meaning as in the Rubber Control Ordinance, No. 63 of 1938.
