THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Samuel Edward Scharenguivel is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of his residence in Singapore now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations:

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Samuel Edward Scharenguivel became an enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations the said Samuel Edward Scharenguivel duly appointed Christofer Adrian Scharenguivel his Attorney in Ceylon (hereinafter referred to as the "Attorney".):

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial; financial or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Samuel Edward Scharenguivel is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation I of the said Regulations to give authority to the Attorney and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner heremafter provided:

Now therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the Attorney to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Samuel Edward Scharenguivel and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Samuel Edward Scharenguivel through his Attorney in Ceylon.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL (CONSTITUTION)
ORDINANCE.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Colombo Municipal Council (Constitution) Ordinance (Chapter 194), as applied to the Galle Municipal Council by the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,370 of May 27, 1938, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) amend the new Schedule which, by virtue of the aforesaid Proclamation, replaced the First Schedule to that Ordinance, by substituting for the items specified in that new Schedule, the items specified in the First Schedule hereto;
- (2) revoke the Order relating to the limits of the wards of the Municipality of Galle published in Gazette No. 8,371 of June 3, 1938;
- (3) define, in the manner set out in the Second Schedule, the limits of the wards specified in the First Schedule hereto:
- (4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Order shall come into effect on the first day of January, 1944; and

(5) direct that for the purposes of the general election of the Councillors of the Municipal Council of Galle to be held next after the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazette, and for the purposes of the application of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, any of the provisions of paragraphs (1) to (3) of this Order shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the first day of January, 1944, on which it may be necessary that those provisions should be so operative.

Second Schedule

Limits of the Wards.

Ward No. 1-Fort

North: From the centre of the western extremity of the northern ramparts of the Fort eastwards along the centre line of the said ramparts to the southern limit of the Municipality.

East, South and West: From the last mentioned point southwards, westwards and north-westwards along the southern and south-western limits of the Municipality to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 2-China Garden.

North: From the centre of the bridge on Kandewatte road over the Parana-ela north-eastwards along the centre line of Kandewatte road and Cripps road to the centre of the junction with Dickson road.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Dickson road to the centre of the junction with Sea street, thence southwards in a straight line to the southern limit of the Municipality, thence south-westwards along the said limit to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 1.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Ward No. 1 to the south-western limit of the Municipality.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the south-western limit of the Municipality to the centre of the confluence of the Kepu-ela with the sea, thence northwards along the centre line of the Kepu-ela and Parana-ela to the , starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 3-Bazaar.

North: From the centre of the Railway Tunnel at the junction of Dickson road and Cripps road eastwards along the centre of the railway line to the centre of Hirimbure road, thence southwards along the centre line of Hirimbure road to the centre of the junction with Talapıtiya road, thence east wards along the centre line of Talapitiya road to the centre of the junction with Talapitiya Cross road, thence eastwards along the centre line of Talapitiya Cross road to a point 3 chains east of the last mentioned junction.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Talapitiya Cross road to the centre of the junction with Galle-Matara road, thence southwards across the said road and along the centre line of the drain to the southern limit of the Municipality.

South: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the southern limit of the Municipality till it meets the eastern limit of Ward No. 2.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 2 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 4-Talapitiya.

North: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 2 north-eastwards along the centre line of Cripps road and Circular road to the centre of the junction

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Circular road and Talapıtiya Cross road to the northern limit of Ward No. 3.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Ward No. 3 to the centre of the junction of Talapitiya road and Hirimbure road.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards and westwards along the northern limit of Ward No. 3 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 5-Magalla.

North: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 4 eastwards along the centre line of Kanampitiya road to the centre of the junction with Udugama road.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Udugama road to the centre of the junction with Circular road, thence southwards along the centre line of Circular road to the centre of the junction with the Galle-Matara road, thence westwards along the centre line of the Galle-Matara road to the centre of the junction with Closenberg road, thence southwards along the centre line of Closenberg road to the point where the said road meets the southern limit of the Municipality.

South: From the last mentioned point south-westwards, north-eastwards and north-westwards along the southern limit of the Municipality to the southern extremity of the

eastern limit of Ward No. 3.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards and westwards along the eastern and northern limits of Ward No. 3 to the south-eastern corner of Ward No. 4, thence northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 4 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 6-Katugoda.

North: From the centre of the junction of Circular road North: From the centre of the function of Circular road and Udugama road north-eastwards along the centre line of Udugama road to the eastern limit of the Municipality, thence southwards and eastwards along the said limit to the bend of the Lunuwila-ela north of Katugoda Cemetery.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the

eastern limit of the Municipality to its southern extremity.

South: From the last mentioned point north-westwards and south-westwards along the southern limit of the Muncipality to the western corner of the rock west of the southern

end of the Closenberg road.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the southern limit of the Municipality to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 5, thence northwards along the said limit to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 7-Ettrligoda.

North: From the centre of the bridge on Hirimbure Cross road over the Moragoda-ela south-eastwards along the centre line of the Moragoda -ela to the centre of the bridge on Morris road, thence north-eastwards along the centre line of Morris road to the eastern limit of the Municipality, thence eastwards along the eastern limit of the Municipality to the Dick-ela.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Municipality to the northern limit of

"Improvements in and relating to centrifugal or cyclone dust separating and similar devices".

Abstract.—The inventor states that in the usual dust separators of this kind air enters a circular head, so that after one turn it impinges on freshly arriving air. This causes undesirable eddies and pressure drop. According to his invention, the shape of the head is in the form of an involute, so that there is no interference between the two air streams. He further proposes that the dimensions of the various parts should bear certain relation to one another, and to the cubic capacity of the apparatus per minute. These relations are stated and claimed.

"Process for concentrating latices of rubber guttapercha, balata and the like vegetable resins."

Abstract.—The inventor states that the properties of concentre tool latex such as colour, viscosity, stability, &c., vary according to the different trees which have been tapped, this difference being due to the presence of non-rubber constituents in the latex; these constituents are the proteins, resins, quebrachitol and mineral substances. The invention aims at removing all of these except the proteins of the highest molecular weight, by hydrolysis and subsequent dialysis.

According to the invention, at least 100 milli-equivalents of caustic alkali are added to each kilogramme of latex, and the mixture allowed to stand for at least two days. This treatment hydrolyses the heat coagulable proteins without however hydrolysing the heat-insensitive proteins of higher molecular weight. Subsequently the latex is dialysed for the purpose of removing the deleterious substances above mentioned, and concentrated by evaporation. Prior to evaporation a suitable amount of caustic soda or ammonia and additional stabilisers such as soans, starches, &c., may be added.

such as soaps, starches, &c., may be added.

The inventor states that evaporation can be carried to such an extent as to furnish a highly concentrated, pasty or solid product. He further claims that the concentrates have a better colour, lower viscosity, higher stability and greater uniformity than concentrates obtained by other means. Moreover, that rubber made from such concentrates exhibits superior ageing qualities owing to the absence of manganese and comper.
