THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

- These regulations may be cited as the Defence (War Equipment) (Purchase by Civilians) Regulations.
- In these regulations, "His Majesty's forces" has the same meaning as in the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.
- No person shall purchase any article to which these regulations apply, or accept or take any such article by way of gift, loan or otherwise, from any member of His Majesty's forces:—
Provided that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to prohibit any person from purchasing any such article at a sale which is held by or under the authority of a commissioned officer of His Majesty's forces, and of which notice has been given in such manner as that officer may deem adequate.
- The articles to which these regulations apply are arms of every description, ammunition, articles of uniform, accoutrements and stores, which are the property of His Majesty or of the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions, and which are intended for the use of His Majesty's forces.

 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail ;
- direct that for the purposes of this order—
 - any sale of any quantity of Australian Wheat Flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - " Authorised Distributor " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people ;
 - " Wholesale Dealer " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to Authorised Distributors or depots ;
 - the " Wholesale Dealers' maximum prices " shall apply only to sales by a Wholesale Dealer to an Authorised Distributor ;
 - the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer from an Authorised Distributor for any quantity of Australian Wheat Flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
 - the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Australian Wheat Flour sold by a Wholesale Dealer shall include the price of the container in which such flour is sold.

 - (b) any sale of any quantity of the article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (9) direct that every trader who sells the article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold;
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale;
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by retail or by wholesale, as the case may be.

"Improvements in or relating to gravity separation of ores."

Abstract:—The invention is a process of concentrating ores having a specific gravity greater than 2.5.

According to the invention, the ore, crushed to a convenient size, is continuously delivered to a concentrating tank and there mixed with a "flotation medium" which consists of water with finely divided magnetic particles in suspension. The specific gravity of this medium is controlled at a predetermined point between 2.5 and 3.3. The overflow from this tank contains the "tailings" which consist of rock and sand, and a portion of the medium. This is passed over a screen in order to separate the medium which is returned back to the concentrating tank. The medium has, however, been deprived of some magnetic particles which adhere to the tailings, and which must be recovered and added to the medium in the concentrating tank. The tailings are therefore washed and screened and the wash water, which contains the magnetic particles and the tailing fines is treated as below. The discharge from the bottom of the tank undergoes a similar treatment. This contains the ore concentrate with the remaining portion of the medium. From this the concentrate is separated out.

The wash water from the tailings and concentrate is made to flow in a thin stream past a magnetic belt which picks out the magnetic particles only and delivers them to a settling tank. After settling, the particles are demagnetized and fed back into the concentrating tank.

The solid used in the flotation medium is ferro-silicon which is hard and rust proof, enabling it to be used over and over again without loss or deterioration. Alternatively, high carbon steel may be used.

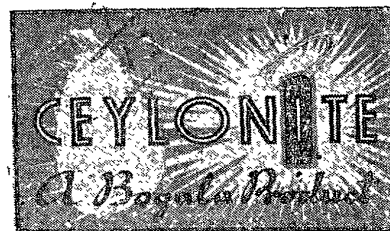

9. The attention of tenderers is drawn to new Condition 11A of the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions, which aims at ensuring the return of empty arrack bottles to the Bottling Warehouses and preventing their diversion to other uses. According to this condition the first issue of bottled arrack for the new rent period will be on the security of a deposit to be made by the renter of each tavern as shown in Schedule AA representing the value of empties proposed to be drawn. This deposit should be made at the same time as the payment for the first consignment of arrack. The second and subsequent issues of bottled arrack will be conditional on the gallonage of empty bottles brought by the renter to the Warehouse. The issue price at the Warehouse of the Extra Special Quality of arrack has been increased from Rs. 15 40 per gallon to Rs. 20 20 per gallon, but there is no alteration in the gross profit to the renter, as the selling price at the tavern has correspondingly been increased from Rs. 19 20 to Rs. 24 per gallon—vide condition 1 (b) of the Arrack Tavern licence form in Excise Notification No. 373. The gross profit of Rs. 3 80 on all these qualities thus remains as at present.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

(i.) revoke my Orders—

- (a) dated May 8, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,930 of May 8, 1942,
(b) dated May 22, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,932 of May 22, 1942,

in so far as they relate to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column I. of the Schedule hereto;

(ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;

(iii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—

- (a) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
(b) Any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
(c) An "Importer" shall mean any person who has cleared from the Customs in his name any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
(d) A "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling for resale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
(e) "Importer's Maximum Price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
(f) "Maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
(g) "Maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;

- (vi.) direct that every trader, who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of the sale;
 - the weight of the quantity sold;
 - the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and
 - the description and grade of the article sold.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- revoke my Order dated June 15, 1942, published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,949 of June 17, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which articles of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - an "Importer" shall mean any person who in his name has cleared from the Customs any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - a "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who has been in the habit of selling for resale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - "Importer's Maximum Price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
 - maximum wholesale price shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer; and
 - maximum retail price shall apply to all sales by retail;
- direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, exposes for sale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - the date of the sale;
 - the weight of the quantity sold;
 - the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail; and
 - the description and grade of the article sold.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- revoke, with effect from this date, my Price Order dated April 7, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,908 of April 10, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of preserved milk or milk food of the brands specified in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 hereto;
- fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of Schedules 1 and 2 hereto, to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per case, and the maximum retail price per tin, or bottle, above which the brand of the preserved milk or milk food specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of those Schedules and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of those Schedules, shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Ceylon;
- direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - "preserved milk" shall mean full cream milk imported into Ceylon which is preserved by some process and shall include powdered milk;
 - "milk food" shall mean Malted Milk and Infant Food;
 - any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (iv.) direct that any trader who, at any premises, exposes for sale any preserved milk or milk food specified in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of such preserved milk or milk food ;
- (v.) direct that every trader who sells any preserved milk or milk food specified in Schedules 1 and 2 hereto shall give the purchaser of such preserved milk or milk food a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of sale ;
 - the quantity sold ;
 - the description and name of the brand of preserved milk or of milk food sold ;
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ; and
 - the price paid for the quantity sold.
