GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS the North China Insurance Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") functioning in Ceylon through its duly appointed Agents Messrs. Whittall & Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Agents") is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939:

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any com-mercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations:

And whereas by paragraph (1) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that any person who trades with the enemy within the meaning of those Regulations shall be guilty of an offence:

And whereas by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that a person shall not be deemed to have traded with the enemy by reason only that he has done anything under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas prior to the date on which the Company became an enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations, the Company, through the Agents, carried on the business of marine insurance in Ceylon and did other business arising out of or in connexion with such marine insurance business with persons resident in Ceylon:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Agents and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, do hereby authorise the Agents to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the Company and do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company through the Agents in Ceylon. THE following amendment to the Public Service Regulations appearing in the Ceylon Government Manual of Procedure (2nd Edition, 1940) is published for general information:-

Public Service Regulation 122.

Delete Public Service Regulation 122 as amended by Combined Correction Slip No. 2 and substitute the following regulation therefor :-

Where proceedings for the dismissal or other punishment of an officer in-

(a) the General Clerical Service, or

(b) the Stenographers' (transferable) Service, or

(c) the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service

are taken by the Head of the Department in which such officer is employed and where it is proposed to inflict on such officer punishment more severe than any of the punishments referred to in Public Service Regulation 102, the Head of Department shall forward his recommendation and the relevant documents to the Chief Secretary for his orders. The same procedure shall be observed in the case of Accountants (other than Accountants in the Auditor-General's Department) and of Shroffs employed in any Department, except that the recommendation and relevant documents shall be forwarded to the Financial Secretary

A Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent in charge of a Kachcheri is a Head of Department for the purpose of this regulation. An Assistant Government Agent will, however, forward papers through the Government Agent of the Province when reference to the Chief Secretary or Financial Secretary becomes necessary.

This Council resolves under section 10 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185), that, with effect from the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the Government Gazette, the Table of Pro-hibitions and Restrictions Outwards set out in Schedule B to the Customs Ordinance, shall be amended by the addition thereto of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto.

(1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt, by the person to

whom the schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordin-

ance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law I shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee within one month from the date on which the schedule referred to in by law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles, as may be assigned to the Village area by the Commissioner of Local Government and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The

Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by such owner of fifty cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6

on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

THE Registers of Voters of the Colombo North, Central, and South Electorates for the year 1942 are being revised, and attention is invited to the relevant provisions of the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, and in particular those provisions which relate to the qualification of voters.

(d) has not been adjudged by a competent court to be of

unsound mind; and

- has not been convicted of a corrupt or illegal practice in connexion with the election of a member of the State Council.
- Any person who is not disqualified under Article 6 is qualified to have his name entered in the register of voters if he has:

(a) a domicile of origin in Ceylon (Article 7); or (b) a domicile of choice in Ceylon (Article 7); or

- (c) the special literacy and property qualification (Article 8)
- (d) a certificate of permanent settlement (Article 9).
- 4. The procedure that will be followed in respect of the classes of persons mentioned in the preceding paragraph and whose names do not appear in the 1941 registers will be as follows :-
 - (a) Persons possessing domicile of origin in Ceylon should give their names to the enumerators who will be calling at their residences between August 14 and September 7, 1942.
 - (b) Persons claiming domicile of choice in Ceylon will similarly give their names to enumerators who will be calling at their residences between August 14 and September 7, 1942, These persons must also furnish proof to the enumerators that they have-

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(i.) resided in Ceylon for a total period of or exceeding 5 years; and

(ii.) have determined to make Ceylon their sole and permanent home.

Their names will be entered in the registers only if the Registering Officer is satisfied that they are qualified. It will be convenient if they produce the necessary evidence before the enumerators; documentary evidence such as letters from employers, &c., will be inspected by the enumerators and returned to the persons producing them.

Note.—If any person possessing a domicile of origin or a domicile of choice cannot meet an enumerator, he should communicate with this office immediately after September 7, 1942.

Dearness Allowance Payable on Estates.

IT is hereby notified for General information that as the index number for the month of August, 1942, was 171, the dearness allowance payable to labourers on estates for each working day in August, 1942, is 29 cents for a male labourer, 29 cents for a female labourer, and 18 cents for a child.

2. For August the dearness allowance has been calculated on the basis that all rice will be sold to labourers at the con-

trolled price and estates are authorized to charge accordingly.

3. Out of the sum of 29 cents payable to a male labourer, 17½ cents represents the amount the estate would have incurred. as loss on rice if it continued to supply it as agreed at Rs. 4.80 per bushel, which was the condition on which the wages were fixed.
