THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. Without the prior approval of the proper authority, no seaman shall be engaged, at any port or place in Ceylon, to serve on board any ship.

2. Without prior approval of the proper authority, no seaman who is not domiciled in Ceylon shall be discharged at any port or place in Ceylon.

3. (1) These regulations shall be read as one with the Merchant Shipping Ordinance.

(2) The provisions of these regulations shall be construed as supplementary to and not in derogation of the provisions of any other written law.

4. In these regulations, "proper authority", in relation to the Port of Colombo, means the Port Security Officer, and in relation to any other port or place in Ceylon, means the Superintendent of Police of the area in which that port or place is situate.

5. Where any seaman is engaged to serve on board any ship or is discharged therefrom in contravention of the provisions of these regulations, the master of that ship and the agents of the owners of that ship shall be severally guilty of an offence against these regulations.

6. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Engagement and Discharge of Seamen) Regulations.

Candidates are required to send in their applications to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments so as to reach the Education Office, Colombo, not later than September 30, 1942. Candidates should write their full

names legibly on the application and give full particulars of the examination for which they are entering and the subjects they are offering.

Officers in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking Sinhalese or Tamil. Civil Service candidates offering Sinhalese or Tamil at the Second Examination should state whether they are entering for the Lower Paper or the Higher Paper.

THE following amendment to the Public Service Regulations appearing in the Ceylon Government Manual of Procedure (Second Edition, 1940), is published for general information.

Public Service Regulation 60.

Delete Public Service Regulation 60 and substitute the following regulation therefor:—

60. Full particulars of all appointments (but not transfers within the department which do not involve any alterations in emoluments); acting and probationary appointments; confirmations, extensions and conclusions of probationary and acting appointment; promotions; secondments; grant, suspension, stoppage, reduction or deferment of increment; interdictions; suspensions; reductions in rank, salary or allowance; dismissals; resignations; retirements; reinstatements; and deaths must be reported by Heads of Departments to the Auditor-General. This return of "changes" should be furnished on Form General 228 as soon as the month in respect of which it is rendered is past. Similar returns should be sent to—

(a) the Deputy Chief Secretary in respect of members of the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service, General Clerical Service and Stenographers' (transferable) Service;

(b) the Directors of the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund and Scheme in respect of pensionable officers; *vide* rules (vi.) (3) and (vii.) (1) of Appendix C (Correction Slip No. 16).

Note.—"Nil" returns should not be sent, but the information that there was nothing to report for the months succeeding the date of the last return should be embodied in the next return.

(vi.) (3) All changes of the description set out in Public Service Regulation 60; half pay and no pay leave; commendations and censures should be entered in the history sheets direct from, and immediately after the issue of, the original orders of Heads of Departments.

Delete rule (vii.) (1) and substitute the following therefor:—

(vii.) (1) For the purpose of maintaining the history sheets mentioned in rule (iii.), Heads of Departments in which such offices are employed must report monthly to the Deputy Chief Secretary events of the description set out in rule (vi.), (3). Form General 228 should be used for reporting changes and Form General 96 for reporting leave. The return should be furnished as soon as the month in respect of which it is rendered is past. The return of commendations and censures should be only in respect of members of the General Clerical and Stenographers' (transferable) Services and should be attached to the return of changes. The return of commendations and censures should be prepared under the following heads:—

Number in seniority list : _____
Details of commendations : _____
Details of censures : _____

In this return Heads of Departments must enter particulars of any commendation or censure which they consider of sufficient

importance to be recorded against the name of any of their officers.

Note.—“Nil” returns on Forms General 228 and 96 should not be sent but the information that there was nothing to report for the months succeeding the date of the last return should be embodied in the next return.

1. The Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or occupier of any premises, require such owner or occupier to close any cesspit that may be situated on the premises, and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

2. The Chairman may give permission in writing to the occupier of any premises, on which a dry-earth closet has been built, to have the night soil from such premises buried or otherwise disposed of on the premises. Such permission may be withdrawn at any time by the Chairman.

3. Without the written permission of the Chairman, no occupier shall cause or permit the night soil from his premises to be buried or disposed of on his premises.

4. The occupier of any premises on which a dry-earth closet has been built, other than an occupier who has been granted the permission referred to in by-law 2, shall cause the night soil from his premises to be removed daily to a depot appointed for the purpose by the Chairman, and may employ an approved labourer for the removal of such night soil.

5. Every occupier of premises on which a dry-earth closet has been built, other than an occupier who has been granted the permission referred to in by-law 2, shall, if he does not employ an approved labourer for the removal of the night soil from his premises, permit the conservancy labourers of the Board or of any contractor approved by the Board to remove the night soil from his premises.

6. The Chairman may, in his discretion, refuse to register, or cancel the registration of, any person as an approved labourer.

7. In these by-laws—

" approved labourer " means a person who is approved by the Chairman and whose name is registered at the Office of the Chairman ;

" Board " means the Board of Health for the Province of Uva ;

" Chairman " means the Chairman of the Board ; and

" occupier " means the chief occupier of any premises and, in the case of a set of tenements served by one or more dry-earth closets, means the owner.

1. In these by-laws—

" Chairman " means the Chairman of the Committee ;
 " Committee " means the Dimbula Korale Village Committee ;

" owner " means the trustee, manager, proprietor, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground ;
 " public burial ground " means a burial ground established or maintained by the Committee ;
 " village area " means the Dimbula korale village area.

2. The Chairman shall keep and maintain in the office of the Committee a register, in such form as the Committee may determine, of all burial grounds which are registered under these by-laws.

3. (1) The owner of every burial ground existing within the village area at the date of publication of these by-laws in the *Gazette* shall, within one month from that date, apply for the registration of that burial ground.

(2) The owner of every burial ground established within the village area on any date after the publication of these by-laws in the *Gazette* shall, within fifteen days from that date, apply for the registration of that burial ground.

4. (1) Every application for the registration of a burial ground shall be in writing, addressed to the Chairman and signed by the owner.

(2) The owner shall submit with the application a plan of the burial ground certified by or on behalf of the Surveyor General or by a licensed surveyor.

5. (1) The owner of a burial ground may appoint any person to be the keeper of that burial ground.

(2) On making the appointment referred to in paragraph (1), the owner shall give the Chairman written notice of such appointment, signed by the owner and the keeper.

(3) On receiving written notice of the appointment referred to in paragraph (1), the Chairman shall enter the name of the keeper in the register of burial grounds.

(4) Where no person is registered as the keeper of a burial ground, or where any person so registered dies or ceases to act as such keeper, the owner of the burial ground shall be deemed to be the keeper thereof until some other person is registered as the keeper.

6. The owner of a burial ground shall fence it properly and shall maintain the fence in good repair.

7. The owner of a burial ground shall keep it clear of jungle and in a clean and sanitary condition.

8. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth or less than two feet distant from any other grave.

9. Except on the orders of an authority competent to order the disinterment of any corpse, no person shall reopen any grave—

(a) within nine months of the burial in that grave of a dead body without a coffin, or

(b) within two years of the burial in that grave of a dead body in a coffin.

10. No person shall, within a burial ground, behave in a disorderly manner, or do any act with intent to annoy any person or knowing or having reason to believe that it is likely to annoy any person or to cause a breach of the peace.

11. No person shall construct, or cause the construction of, any monument on a public burial ground except on a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

12. No person shall bury a dead body in, or cremate a dead body on, any place in a public burial ground other than a place approved by the Chairman or a person authorised in writing in that behalf by the Chairman.

13. Where the Committee has set apart any specified area of a public burial ground for the burial or cremation of the dead bodies of persons of any particular religious denomination, no person shall bury in or cremate on such area the dead body of any person other than a person of such religious denomination.

14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or a person authorised in writing in that behalf by the Chairman to inspect at any time any burial ground within the village area, and the owner or keeper of such burial ground shall permit and assist the Chairman of such authorised person to make such inspection.

1. The War Damage (Personal Movables) Insurance Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,907 of April 9, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) in regulation 5, by the substitution, in paragraph (1), for the words and figures "less than Rs. 10", of the words and figure "less than Rs. 5";

(b) in regulation 13, by the substitution for paragraph (2) of the following new paragraph:—

"(2) No payment under this regulation shall be made by the Commissioner to any person of such an amount that the aggregate of that payment and of all previous payments under this regulation made to him, where he is a householder would exceed Rs. 250 and where he is not a householder would exceed Rs. 50";

(c) in regulation 13, by the omission of paragraph (3); and
(d) in the Third Schedule, by the substitution for paragraph (3) under the heading "Limitations and Conditions" of the following new paragraph:—

"(3) No payment in respect of any goods being works of art, gold and silver-plate, jewellery, precious and semi-precious stones, furs, objects of historical or scientific interest and curiosities, stamp collections, small scale models, books and printed publications more than 50 years old and manuscripts shall be made to any person of such an amount that the aggregate of that payment and of all previous payments under section 14 made to him in respect of any such goods would exceed the sum of Rs. 100."

2. The War Damage (Business Movables) Insurance Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,907 of April 9, 1942, are hereby amended in regulation 15 by the substitution for paragraph (2), of the following new paragraph:—

"(2) In respect of any one business no payment under this regulation shall be made by the Commissioner of such an amount that the aggregate of that payment and of all previous payments under this regulation in respect of that business would exceed Rs. 250."

3. The War Damage (Business and Personal Movables) (General) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,907 of April 9, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the renumbering of regulation 10 as regulation 12; and

(b) by the insertion, immediately after regulation 9, of the following new regulations:—

"10. Any sum payable under either of the schemes to a person under the age of twenty-one years may, if the Commissioner thinks fit, be paid for the benefit of that person to a parent or guardian of that person.

11. In determining what payment in respect of war damage to make under either of the schemes in respect of the interest of any person, the Commissioner shall have regard to the extent to which that person has been, or will be, indemnified (otherwise than by virtue of that payment) in respect of the damage under any Ordinance, policy or scheme whatsoever, and if it appears that that person has been or will be so indemnified, shall reduce the amount of the payment he would otherwise have made to such extent as appears just."

LABOUR DISPUTE—CASKEBIEN DIVISION, BRUNSWICK GROUP, MASKELIYA.

AS required by section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lock-Outs) Order 1942, it is hereby notified that on a petition presented by the Acting General Secretary, The Ceylon Indian Workers' Federation, in connection with a trade dispute arising out of the notices to quit issued by the Superintendent, Brunswick Group, on Sinna Sadayan and his wife, Anjalay, and referred to the District Judge, Nuwara Eliya-Hatton, in terms of section 6 (2) of the aforesaid Order, an Award has been made by the District Judge, Nuwara Eliya-Hatton, dated August 18, 1942.

The findings of the District Judge were that—

- (1) the dispute in question was a trade dispute within the meaning of the aforesaid Order,
- (2) the complaints made by Sadayan and Anjalay of assault by the Superintendent, Mr. L. A. Wright, were false,
- (3) the Superintendent was justified in terminating the services of the two labourers,
- (4) there was no refusal by the Superintendent to stay further action pending inquiry by the Department of Labour; there was in fact no demand for stay of further action,
- (5) the refusal of the Superintendent to attend a Conference was a breach of the Seven Point Agreement, but this breach was not intentional as Mr. Wright's interpretation of the Seven Point Agreement seems to have been that if there was no possibility of a settlement, a conference need not be held,
- (6) it was not just or reasonable to expect that the labourers in question to be re-employed on the estate.

"Low Plasticity Rubber".

Abstract.—The inventor states that deproteinized rubber is desirable for certain uses owing to its low water-absorbing property, but that such rubber suffers from the drawback of having a low plasticity and a tendency to adhere to vessels, &c., in which it is being manipulated.

He further states that the addition of a small quantity of benzidine or one of its homologues reduces the plasticity to a great extent. Latex which has been deproteinized by known means (which is not part of the invention) is treated with a creaming agent and allowed to stand. The serum layer is drained off and benzidine of the required proportion is added in the form of hot water solution. Then coagulation follows as in the normal process.

The amount of benzidine added is 0.05–0.30 per cent. calculated on the dry rubber content. Instead of benzidine any of the 4,4' diamino biphenyl compounds may be used.

Comparative figures are given showing the plasticity measured on the Williams Plastometer of the deproteinized rubber, with and without benzidine.

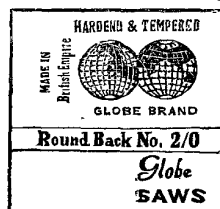

 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (7) direct that every trader who at any premises within the Urban Council limits of Trincomalee, or in the district of Trincomalee, exposes for sale sugar of the description and grades mentioned in the First Schedule shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade.

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) a loaf of bread shall weigh either 16 oz. or 8 oz.;

- (iii.) direct that every trader, who at any premises within the limits of the Jaffna District, exposes for sale bread of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of bread of that description and grade, and
- (iv.) direct that every trader, who sells bread of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that bread a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of the sale;
 - the quantity of bread (in weight);
 - the description and grade of bread sold;
 - the price paid for the quantity of bread sold.

Regulation.

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after regulation 32f, of the following new regulation:—

Control over visitors to ships. 32g. (1) The competent authority may give directions to the master of any vessel which is for the time being at a port in Ceylon requiring him to take such steps as may be specified in the directions for the purpose of securing that no unauthorised person goes on board the vessel while the vessel remains at the port or during such periods while she so remains as may be specified in the directions.

(2) If any unauthorised person goes on board a vessel in contravention of directions given under this regulation, the master of the vessel shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

(3) In this regulation "unauthorised person" means any person other than—

- an officer or member of the crew of the vessel;
- a police officer or servant of His Majesty acting in the course of his duty as such;
- a person authorised in writing by the competent authority, the Inspector General of Police, the Principal Collector of Customs, the Master Attendant or the Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, to go on board the vessel.

Regulation.

The Governor may, whenever he considers it necessary so to do for the purposes of the efficient prosecution of the war or the maintenance of supplies essential to the life of the community, by Order declare any building or premises situated in any place, other than a warehousing port appointed under section 69 of the Customs Ordinance, to be a warehouse or place of security

in which goods may be warehoused, kept and secured without payment of import duty upon the first entry thereof.

So long as an Order made in respect of any building or premises under the preceding paragraph of this regulation is in force, such building or premises shall be deemed for all purposes to be a warehouse or place of security approved and appointed under section 69 of the Customs Ordinance, and the provisions of that Ordinance shall apply accordingly, subject to the modification that the powers conferred by the aforesaid section 69 on the Collector of a port to issue directions shall be exercised by the Principal Collector of Customs in the case of such building or premises.
