THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942.

2. No person shall, in any self-supporting area, sell more than five bushels of country paddy at any one time to any person other than an authorised officer.

3. No person shall, in any self-supporting area, sell more than two and a half bushels of country rice at any one time to any person other than an authorised officer, except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to such permit:

Provided, however, that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may, by notice published in such manner as he may deem adequate, declare that the requirements of the preceding provisions of this Regulation as to a permit shall not apply to sales of country rice in such part of a self-supporting area within his province or district as may be specified in the notice, and the aforesaid requirements shall not apply in that part of that area so long as the notice remains in force.

4. Subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall transport any quantity of country paddy or country rice, from any place in Ceylon to any other place in Ceylon, except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of the province or district within which the first-mentioned place is situated or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to such permit:

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this Regulation shall apply—

(a) to the transport of any country paddy by or on behalf of the producer of that paddy from the field where the paddy has been grown to the threshing-floor or from the threshing-floor to a barn or other place situated in the same revenue district as that field and ordinarily used by such producer for the purposes of the storage of paddy; or

(b) to the transport of any quantity of country paddy or country rice not exceeding one "head load" by or on behalf of any person for the use of that person, a "head load" being deemed for this purpose to be such quantity as can ordinarily be carried by any one person at any one time; or

(c) to the transport of country paddy or country rice by any person for or on behalf of the Government of Ceylon.

5. (1) No person shall at any time purchase or in any other manner acquire any articles of food to which this Regulation applies whether under the Food Control Ordinance or otherwise, in any quantity which would, when aggregated with the stocks of those articles of food in his possession at that time, exceed such quantities of those articles as are necessary to maintain an adequate supply for a period of two months for

himself and the members of his household and other persons for whom he is required by any law or agreement or custom to provide such articles of food in his capacity as an employer or otherwise.

(2) The articles of food to which this Regulation applies are—

(a) every article of food for the allocation and rationing of supplies of which an Order under section 4 (1) (g) of the Food Control Ordinance has been or may hereafter be made; and

(b) kurakkan, and every other species of grain.

(3) In this Regulation, "adequate supply" for any person means—

(a) in relation to any article of food for the allocation and rationing of supplies of which an Order under section 4 (1) (g) of the Food Control Ordinance is in force, a quantity computed on the basis of the weekly ration for the time being determined under that Ordinance by the Food Controller for a person of the class to which that person belongs;

(b) in relation to any other article of food, a quantity computed on the basis of the normal requirements of a person of the class to which that person belongs.

6. (1) Where the Food Controller or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent or a peace officer has reason to suspect that any country paddy or country rice is being transported in any vehicle or vessel in contravention of these Regulations, he may—

(a) give such orders, directions or signals, or use such devices or take such other measures as may be necessary to stop the vehicle or vessel or to cause it to be halted; and

(b) inspect and search the vehicle or vessel.

(2) Where the Food Controller or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent or a peace officer has reason to suspect that any country paddy or country rice has been transported or removed to any place or premises in contravention of these Regulations, he may enter, inspect and search such place or premises.

7. The Food Controller shall have power to require any person to furnish a return or any information relating to the stocks of paddy, rice, kurakkan or other grain in the possession of that person.

8. Any power, duty or function conferred or imposed upon or assigned to the Government Agent of a province or the Food Controller by the preceding provisions of these Regulations may be exercised, performed or discharged by the Civil Defence Commissioner.

9. In these Regulations—

"authorised officer" means the Civil Defence Commissioner or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent and

includes any person appointed by the Civil Defence Commissioner or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent as his agent for the purposes of regulations 2 and 3;

"Civil Defence Commissioner" includes a Deputy Civil Defence Commissioner;

"country paddy" means paddy grown in Ceylon;

"country rice" means rice milled or produced from country paddy;

"Food Controller" includes a Deputy Controller;

"Government Agent" includes an Additional Government Agent; and "Assistant Government Agent" includes an Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) and an Additional Assistant Government Agent;

Cap. 16. "peace officer" has the same meaning as in the Criminal Procedure Code;

"producer", in relation to paddy, means the proprietor of the field on which such paddy is grown, and includes the lessee, usufructuary mortgagee or other person in possession and taking the produce of that field;

"self-supporting area" means an area to which Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, is not applicable.

"An improved and adjustable weather guard or rain shield for latex."

Abstract.—The inventor describes a shield to protect the tapped portion of a rubber tree from wind and rain. The shield is made of waterproof canvas in the shape of the frustum of a cone. The narrow end of the cone is tied securely round the tree with suitable packing material that prevents rain from flowing down the tree. The wider end is provided with a stiff circular rim which is held away from the tree by a metallic link. The cone can be inverted by means of this link, if so desired, so that tapping can be done without hindrance.

"Improvements in and relating to time recording apparatus."

Abstract.—The inventor describes an apparatus in which a time piece enclosed in a box serves the dual purpose of indicating the time and recording the hours of attendance of watchmen. The clock is enclosed in a case and retains the usual hour and minute hands. Provision is made for fixing a paper dial at the back of the clock on a spindle which revolves at the same speed and direction as the hour hand, *i.e.*, in an *anti-clockwise* direction as viewed from the rear. The watchman by depressing a button on the front of the box punctures the disc at the point which indicates the hour of his arrival or departure. A suitable locking device is described for the box.

The applicant states that he is aware of specification similar to Ceylon Patent 3151 wherein the hour and minute hands are removed from the clock, and a paper disc fixed to the mechanism to record the times of attendance. In his invention the hour and minute hands are retained, so that the clock functions as an ordinary clock for time indicating purposes.

 - (b) the quantity of article sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of article sold;
 - (d) the date of the sale, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail, as the case may be;

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke my Order fixing the maximum wholesale price of Australian wheat flour within the Revenue District of Kegalla, dated June 28, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,965 of July 10, 1942;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag above which Australian wheat flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices for Australian wheat flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell Australian wheat flour which is adulterated with any other article;
- (5) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells Australian wheat flour shall give to the purchaser of that flour, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of Australian wheat flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold; and
 - (c) the date of sale.
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Australian wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;
 - (c) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer for any quantity of Australian wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (e) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Australian wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such flour is sold.

 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold ; and
 - (c) the date of sale ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Australian wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag and the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) direct that wholesale dealers or authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position in their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for paddy fixed by this Order;
- (3) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any article;
- (4) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorised distributor who sells paddy shall give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold;
 - (c) the date of sale;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (c) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under the Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (d) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 - (e) "the wholesale dealer's maximum price" shall apply only to sales by wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor;
 - (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;

(6) revoke my Order dated August 1, 1942, relating to the prices of paddy in Matale District.

 - (c) "Wholesale Dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to Authorised Distributors or depots;

- (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer for any quantity of Whole Wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
- (e) the maximum price fixed by this Order for Whole Wheat sold by a Wholesale dealer shall not include the price of the container in which such Whole Wheat is sold.

- (2) in paragraph 2 thereof, by the omission of the words "where the application relates to a meeting,"; and
- (3) by the insertion immediately after paragraph 3 thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

"4. Nothing in the preceding provisions of this Order shall apply in the case of—

- (a) Food Production meetings presided over by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent or convened by the Chairman of a Local Assistance Committee;
- (b) Air Raid Precautions meetings convened or authorised by the Civil Defence Commissioner, an Air Raid Precautions Controller or a Chief Air Raid Warden;
- (c) religious services in places of worship;
- (d) public meetings held under the auspices of any local authority;
- (e) public meetings convened and presided over by a Member of the State Council;
- (f) such other classes of public meetings as the Minister for Home Affairs, having satisfied himself that the object of such classes of meetings will not be prejudicial to the defence of the Island, the public safety, the maintenance of public order or the efficient prosecution of the war, and that the organisers thereof are responsible persons, may from time to time exclude from the operation of this Order by notification published in the *Gazette*.

Amendments of the terms, conditions and requirements relating to the foreign parcel post and published as the Foreign Parcel Post Rules, 1934, in *Gazette* No. 8,071 of August 3, 1934.

1. In rule 11 of the aforesaid rules—

(a) there shall be substituted, for paragraph (1) of that rule, the following new paragraph :—

“(1) Parcels received from any place beyond the limits of Ceylon shall be held at the disposal of the addressee for 15 days following the date of receipt, the first 7 days free of warehousing charges and the subsequent 8 days subject to a charge of 20 cents per parcel per diem.”; and

(b) there shall be substituted, for paragraph (3) of that rule, the following new paragraph :—

“(3) Parcels addressed Poste Restante shall be held at the disposal of the addressee free of warehousing charges for a period of 7 days following the date of receipt, and for any subsequent detention a warehousing charge shall be levied of 20 cents per parcel per diem but not exceeding in any case a sum of Rs. 4.60 per parcel for the total period of such detention.”.

2. There shall be substituted, for rule 12 of the aforesaid rules, the following new rule :—

“12. Where a parcel sent by any person to a place beyond the limits of Ceylon is returned to Ceylon as undeliverable, all warehousing charges for the parcel incurred at such place shall be recoverable from that person as if such charges were postage due on the parcel.”
